- Rising Institutional Costs of Student Financial Aid
 - Efforts are in place to monitor and strategically distribute financial aid funds

Strategies to Improve Freshman to Sophomore Retention Rates

• Actions:

- Strategic Student Recruitment Plan should increase the pool of outstanding applicants so that we can become more selective.
- UIC Student Success Plan will increase first-year retention rates through initiatives such as:
 - Undergraduate Success Center
 - Summer College
 - Early Alerts
 - Peer Mentoring
 - Targeted Curriculum and Learning Environment
- Enhanced Career Advising for Freshman

Strategies to Improve Underrepresented Minority Freshman Retention and Graduation Rates

• Actions:

- Building on the groundwork of the UIC Student Success Plan initiatives, a comprehensive effort to close the achievement gap includes strategies focused on:
 - Education Advisory Board predictive advising tool to help advisors and students make more informed decisions about academic majors
 - First-Year Dialogues Seminar to increase quality interaction among diverse groups on the UIC campus
 - Undergraduate Research Experience to match students with faculty mentors
- Evaluation and re-engineering as necessary of Academic Support Programs (such as AAAN and LARES), the Centers for Cultural Understanding and Social Change, and college-based programs

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Strategies to Ensure a Sustainable Financial Aid Budget

• Actions:

- Reduce administrative costs and become more efficient
- Reinvented the Financial Aid Advisory Committee (FAAC) to review campus financial aid policy and ensure the program's sustainability
- Monitor the impact on access and degree completion and explore financial aid optimization strategies
- Increase private giving for scholarships to supplement institutional sources of aid
- Create more paid internships with public and private partnerships
