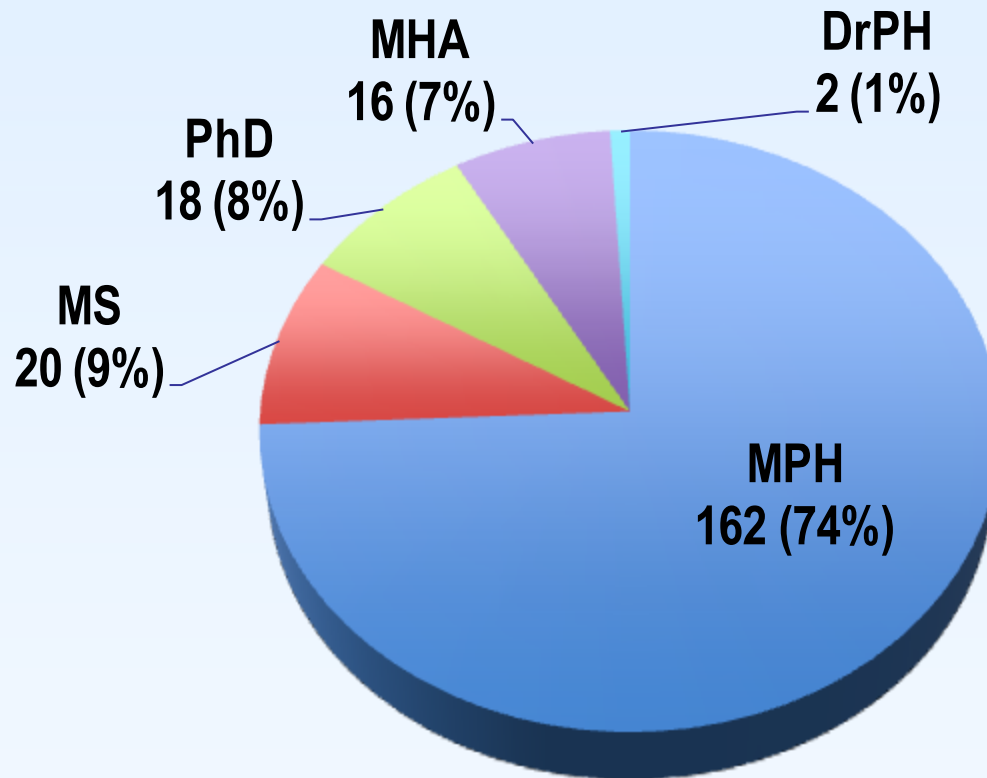

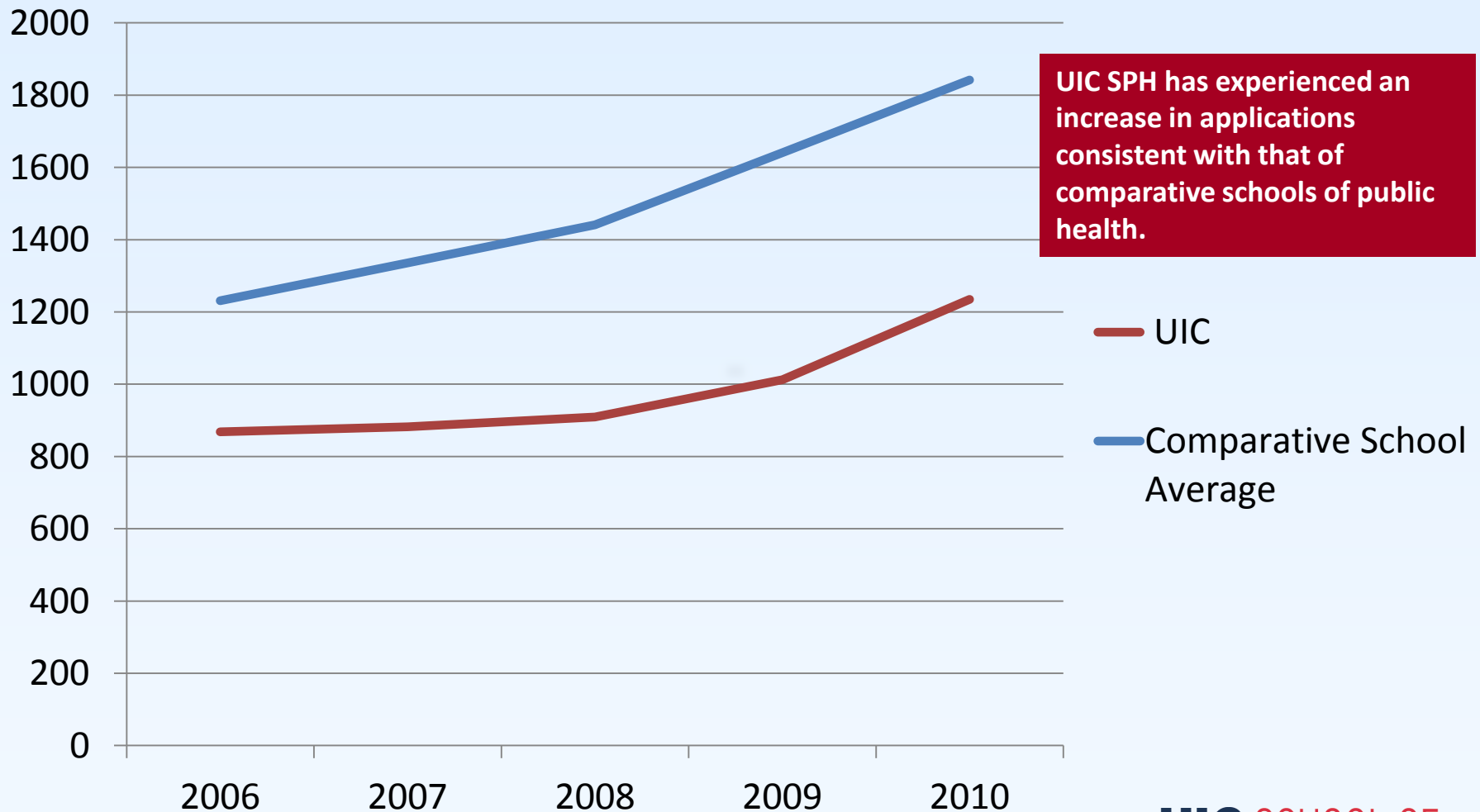

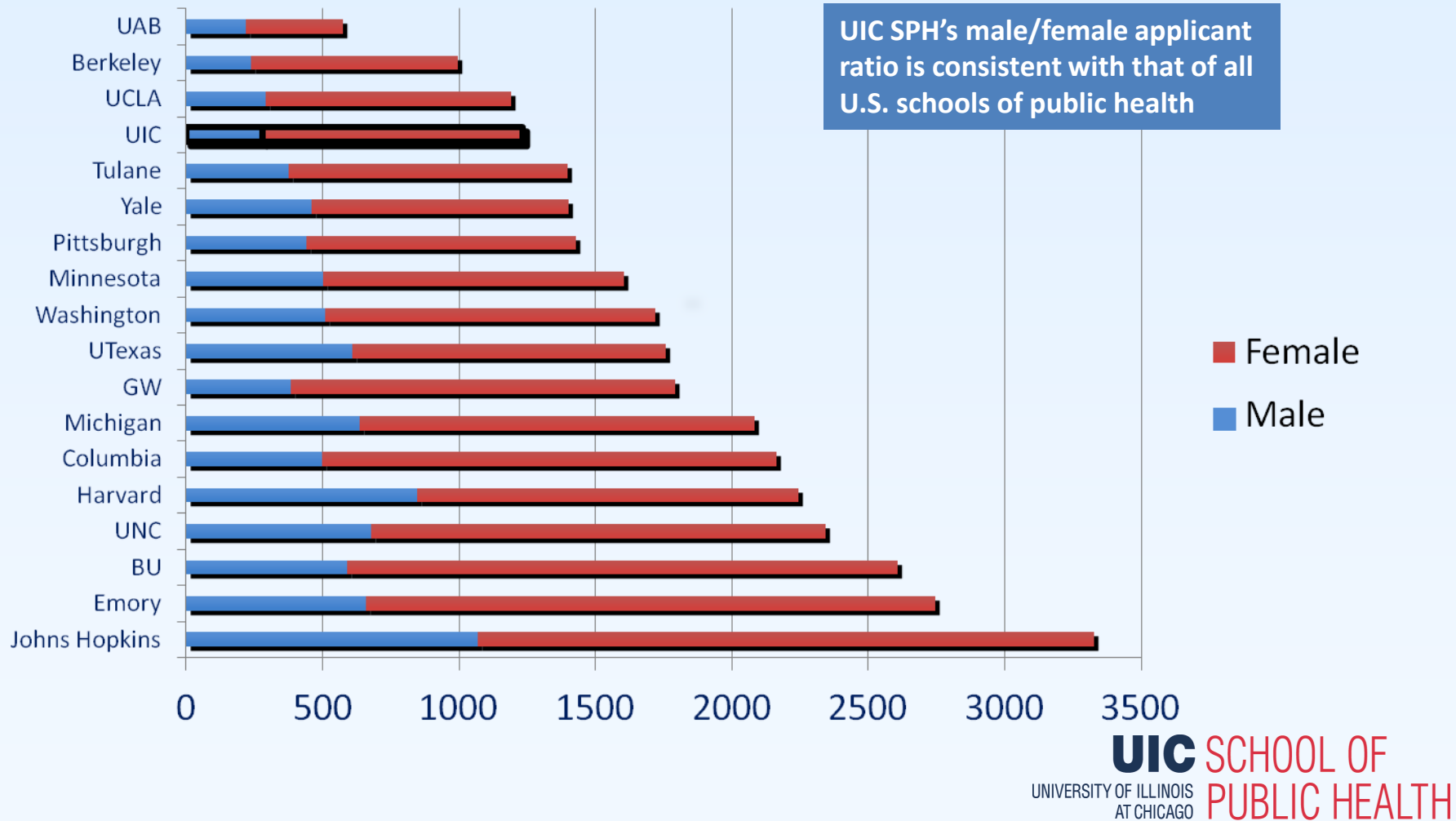

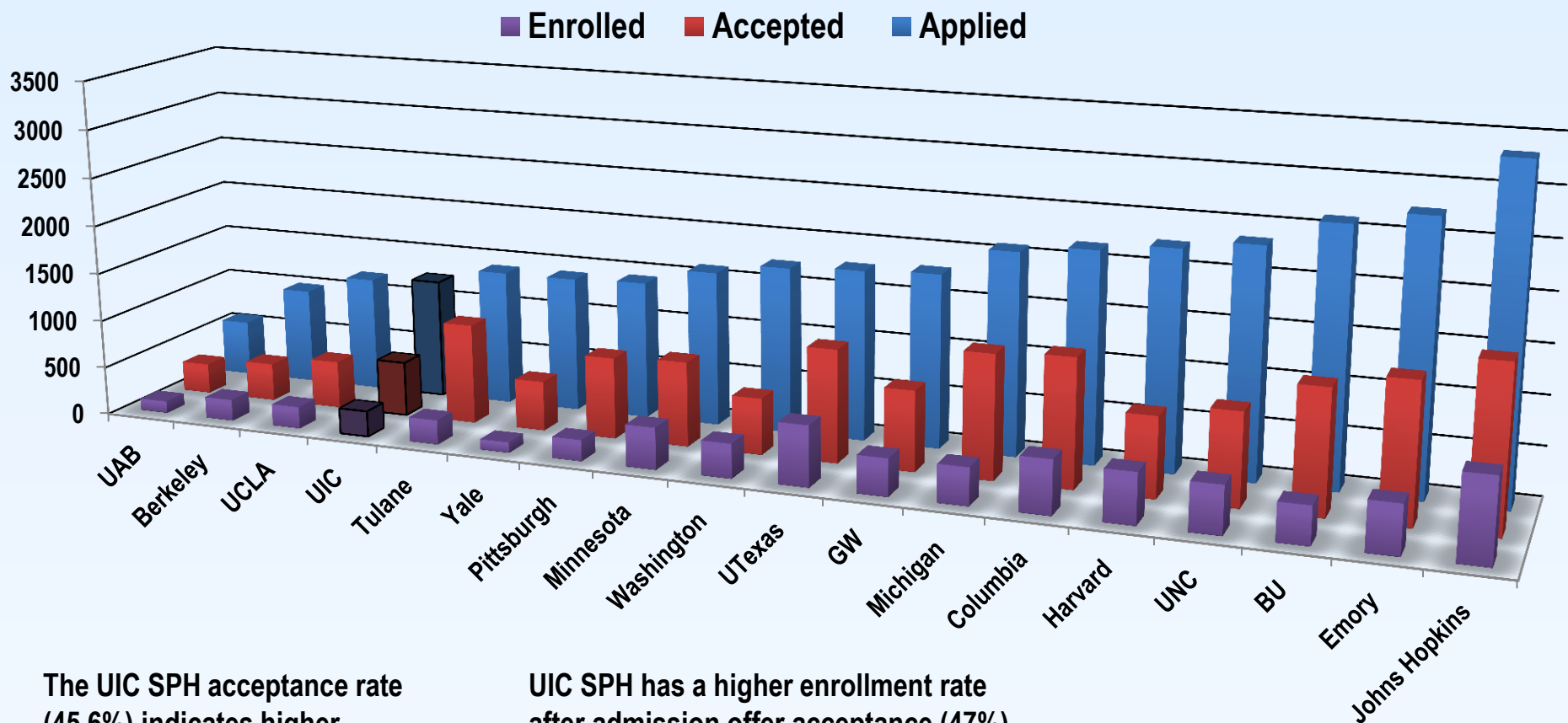
Applicant Trends 2006-2010



MPH Applicants 2010



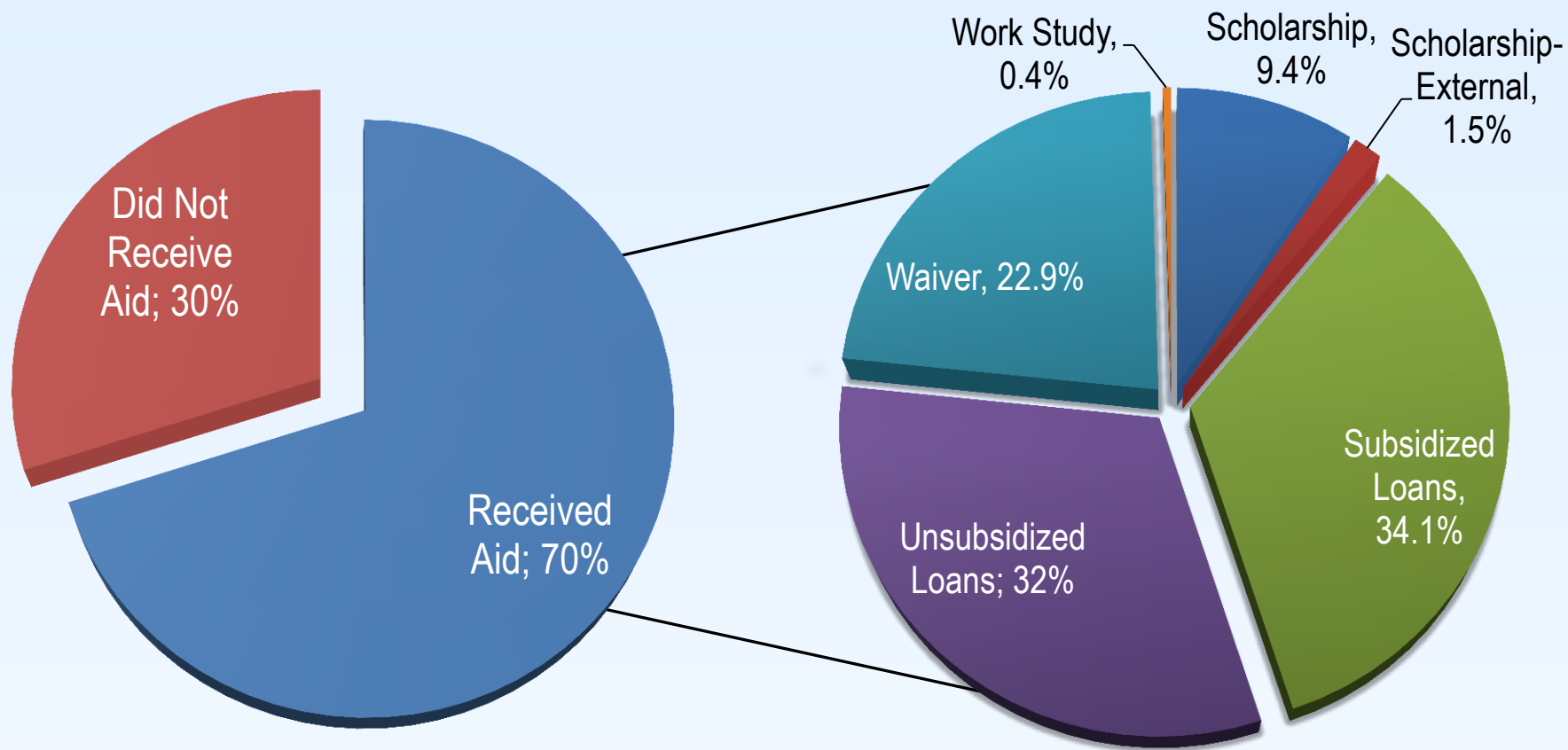
Students Applied, Accepted, Enrolled 2010



The UIC SPH acceptance rate (45.6%) indicates higher selectivity among comparative schools (average, 50%)

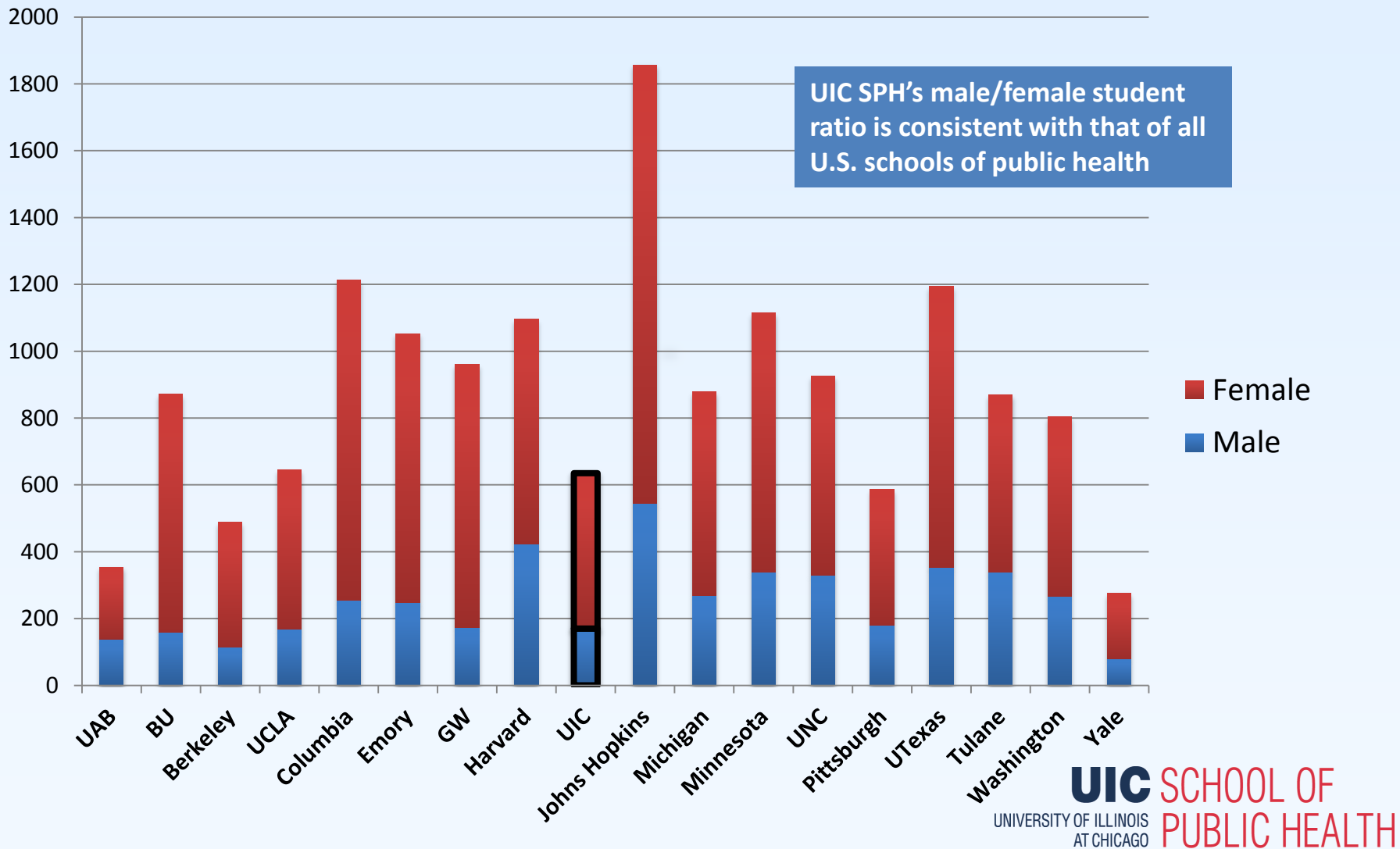
UIC SPH has a higher enrollment rate after admission offer acceptance (47%) than most comparative schools (average, 43%)

MPH Student Access to Financial Aid AY10

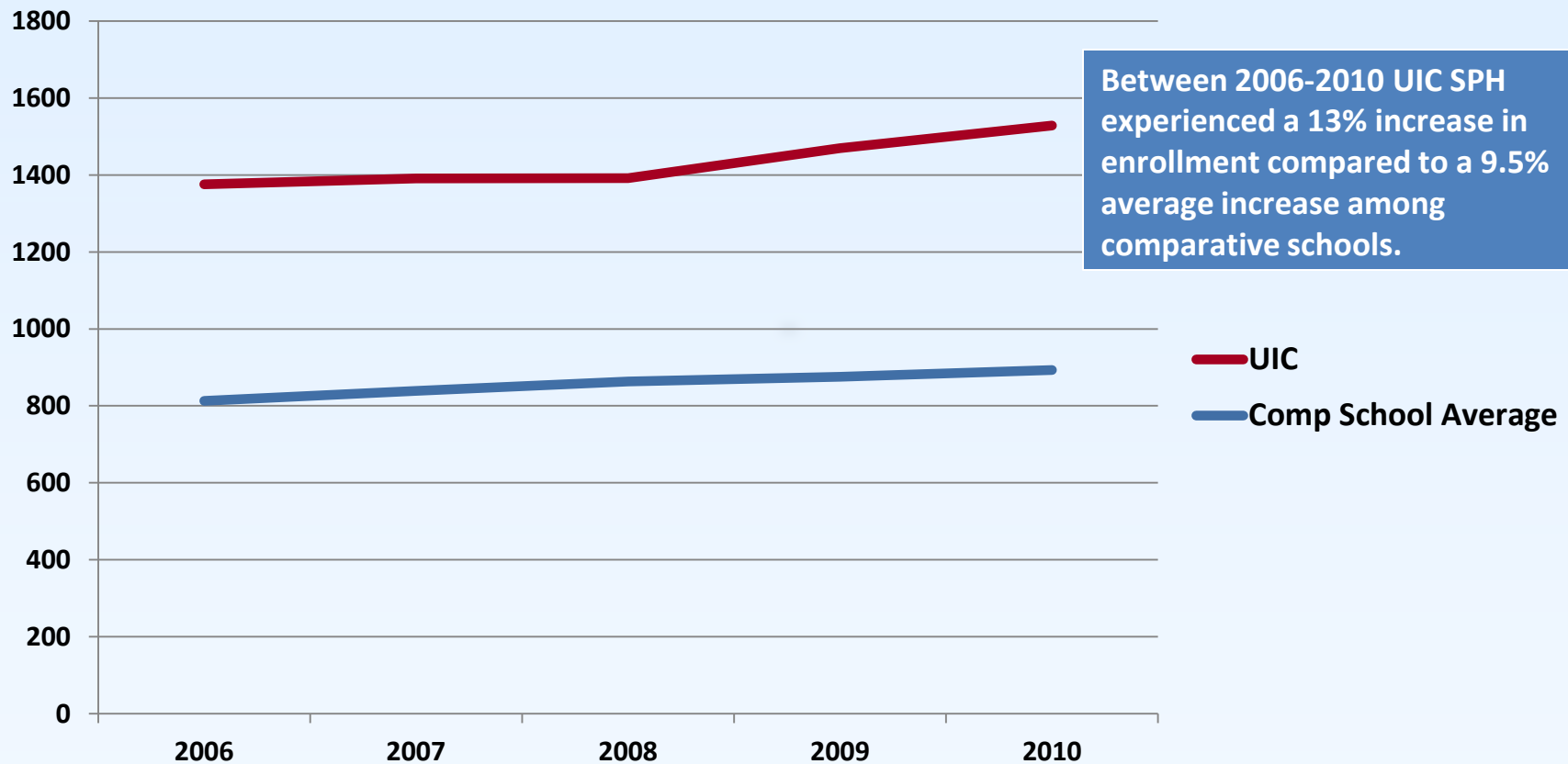


Average Loan Indebtedness: \$23,097

Student Total Enrollment 2010

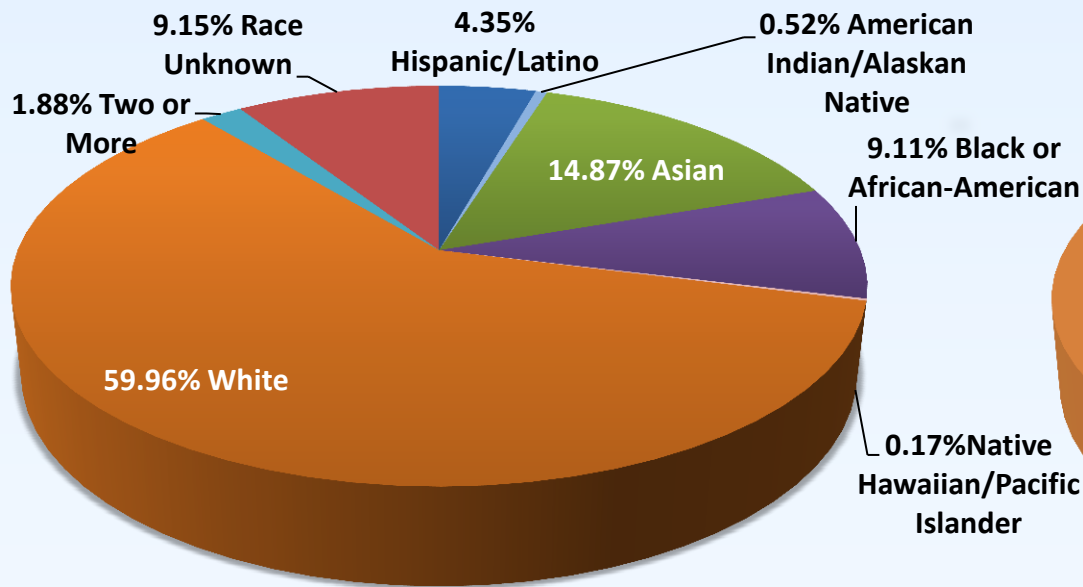


Enrollment Trends 2006-2010

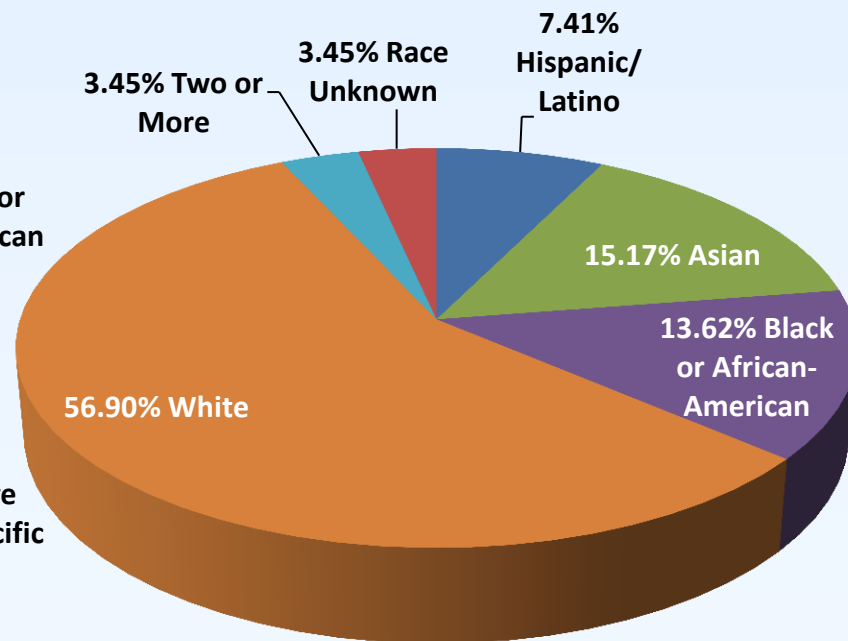


Total Student Enrollment by Ethnicity 2010

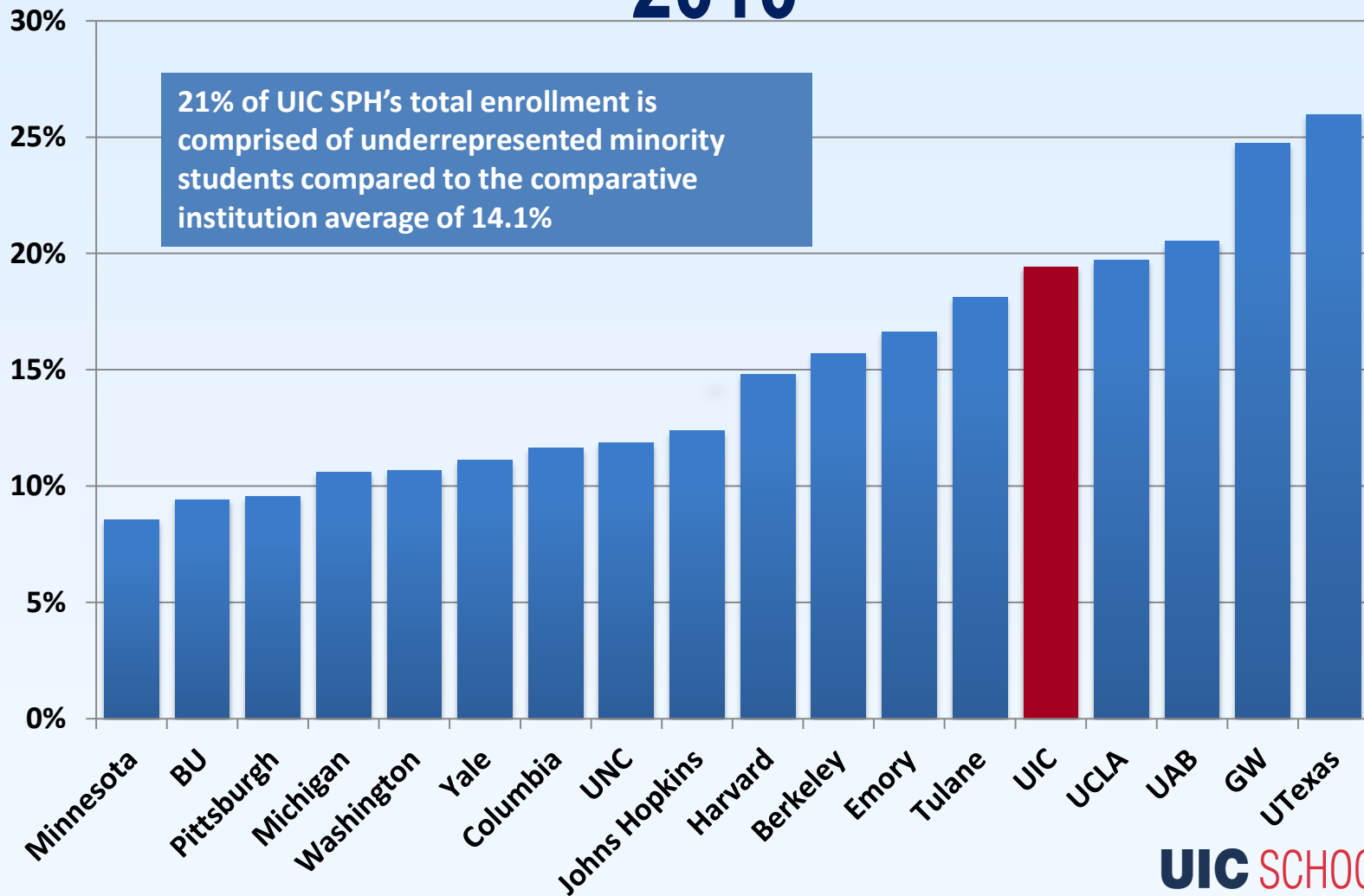

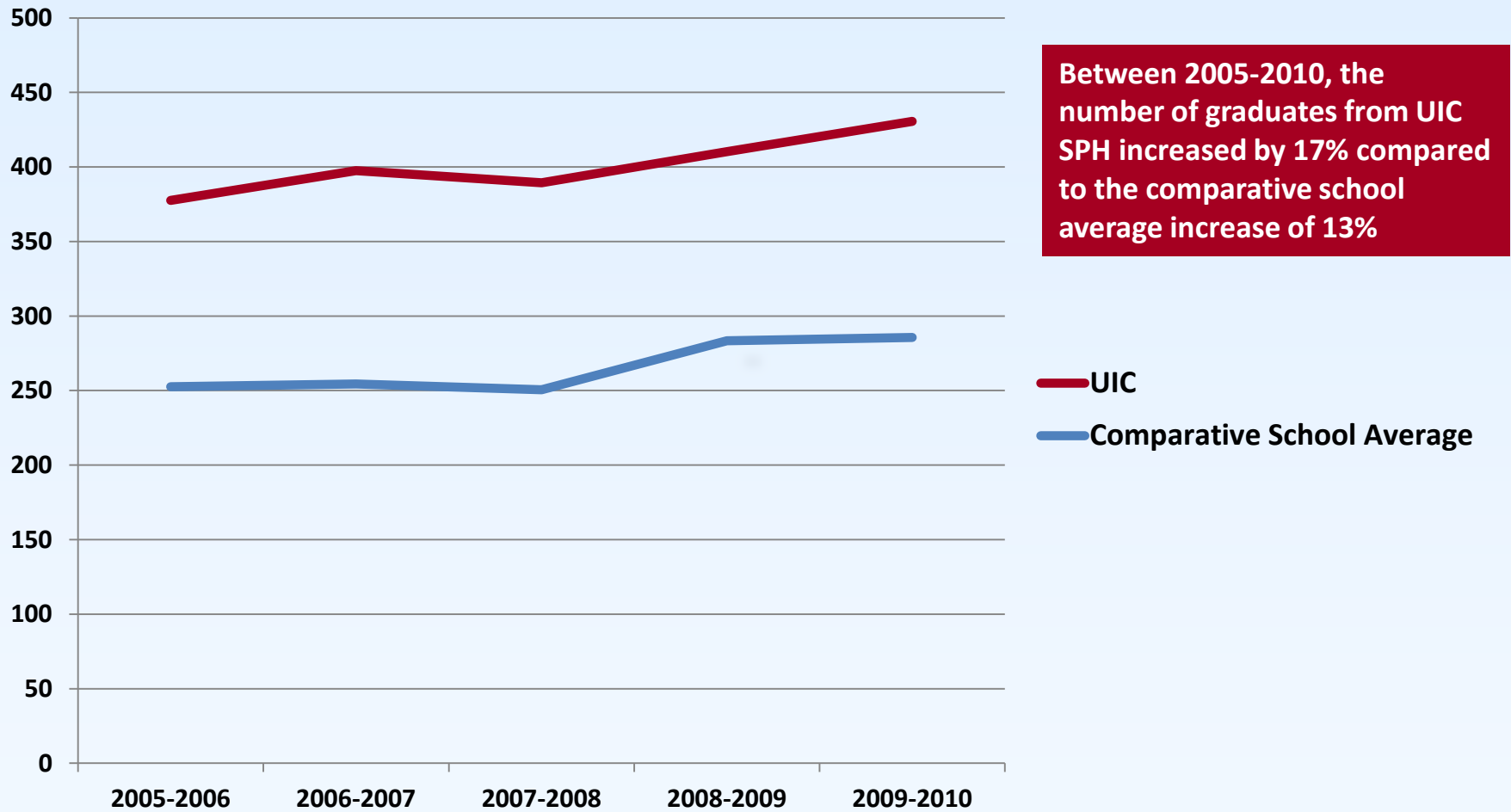

Masters Program Graduate Trends AY05-AY10



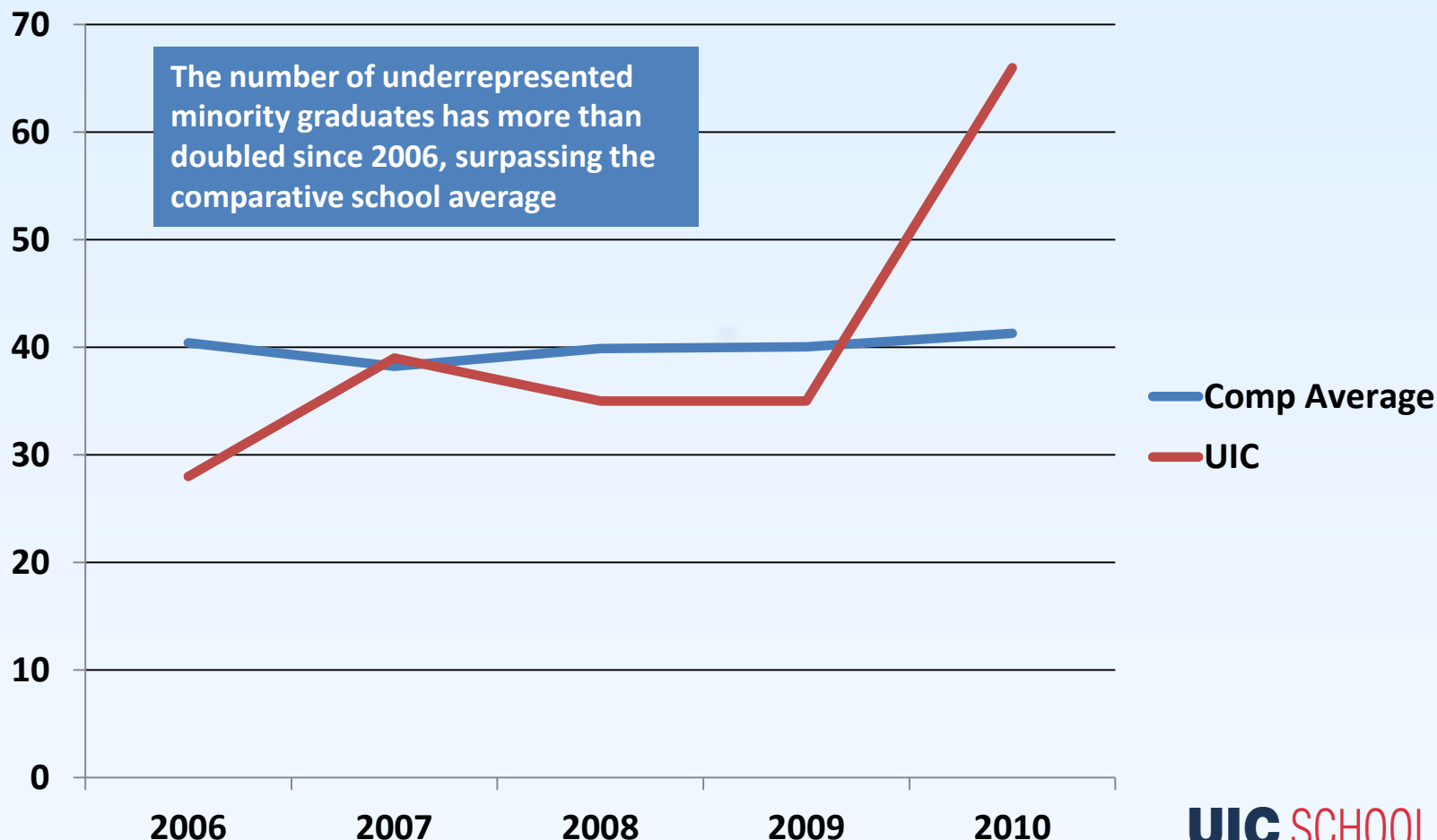
Urban Health & Diversity Programs

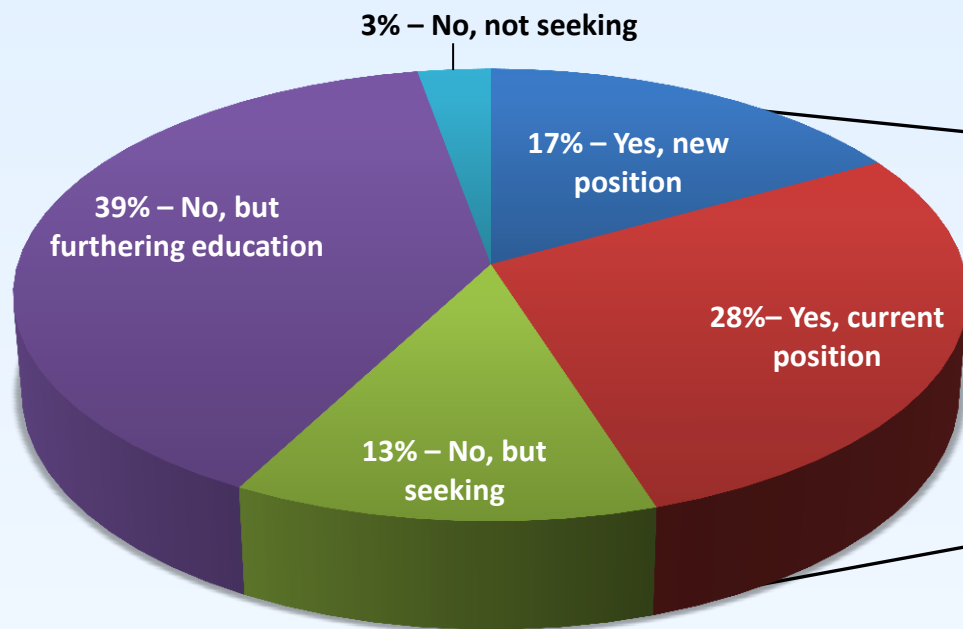

Underrepresented Minority Graduation Rates 2006-2010



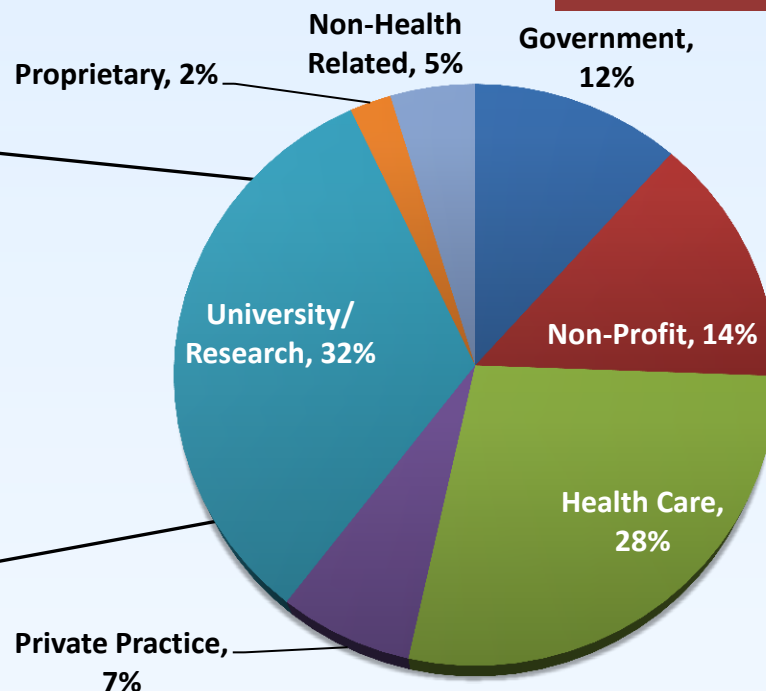

How many MPH grads are working?

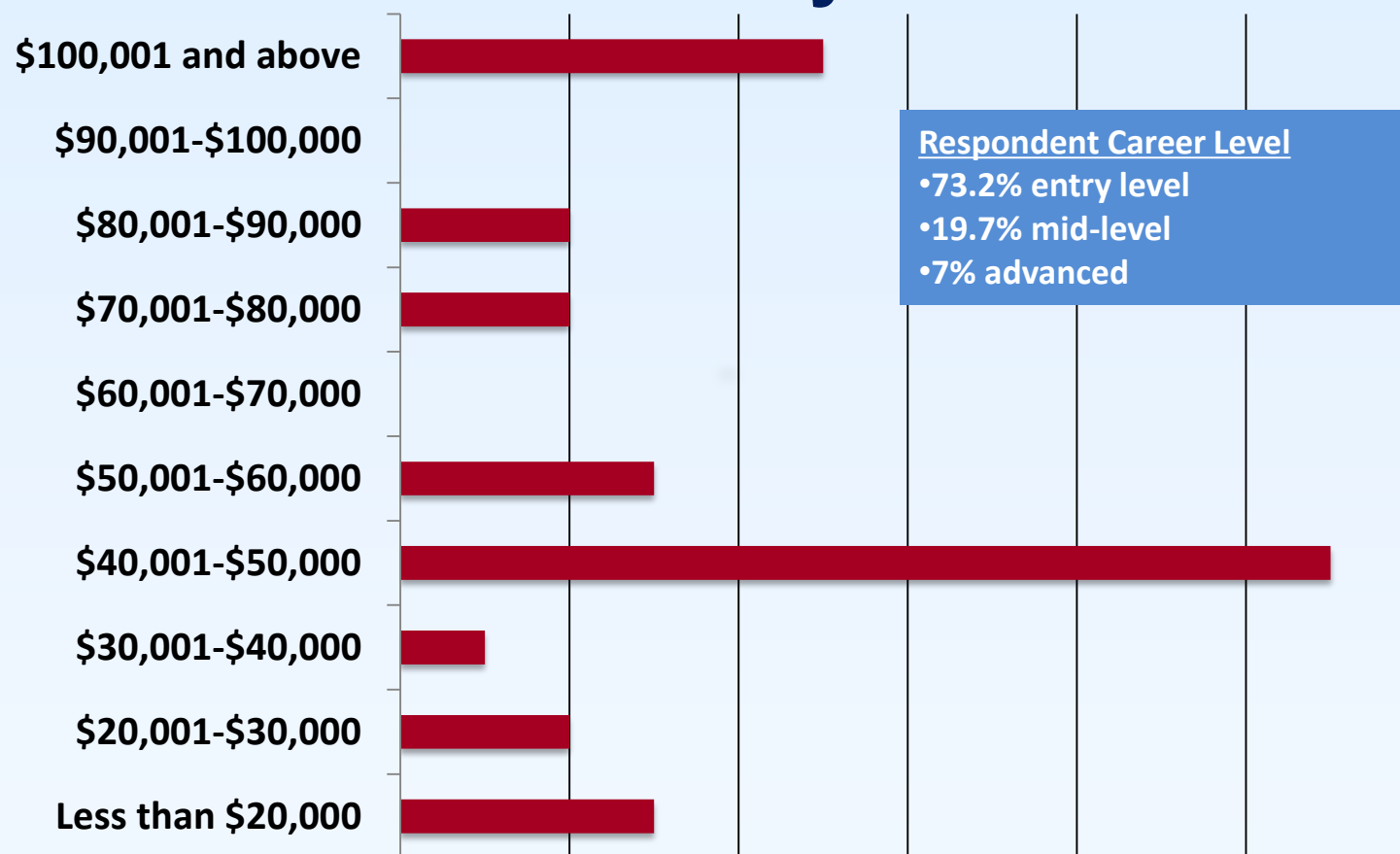


45.1% of MPH graduates are employed upon graduation in various sectors (shown). 71% of those who are not employed seek to further their education.

2011 MPH Graduate Starting Annual Salary

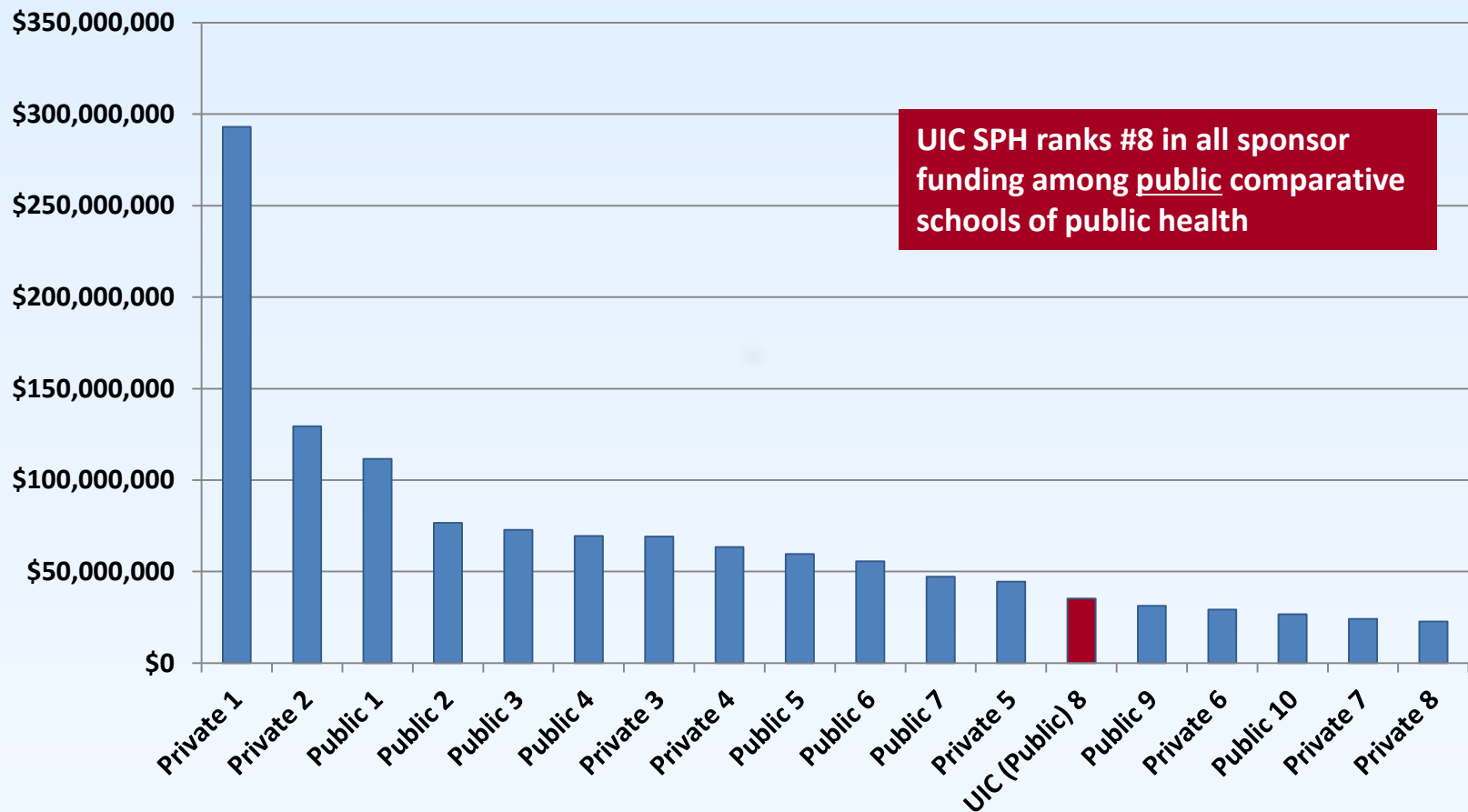

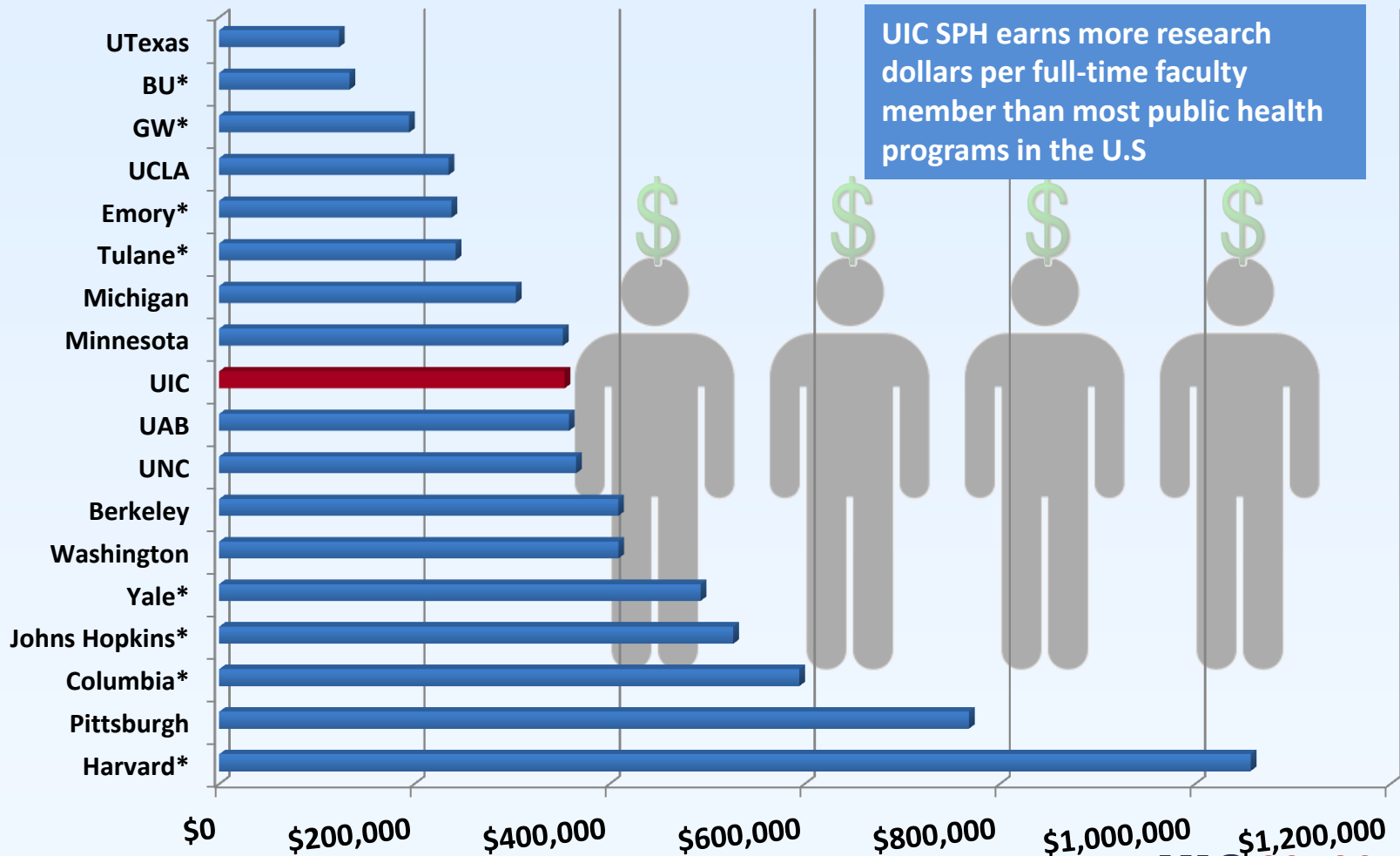

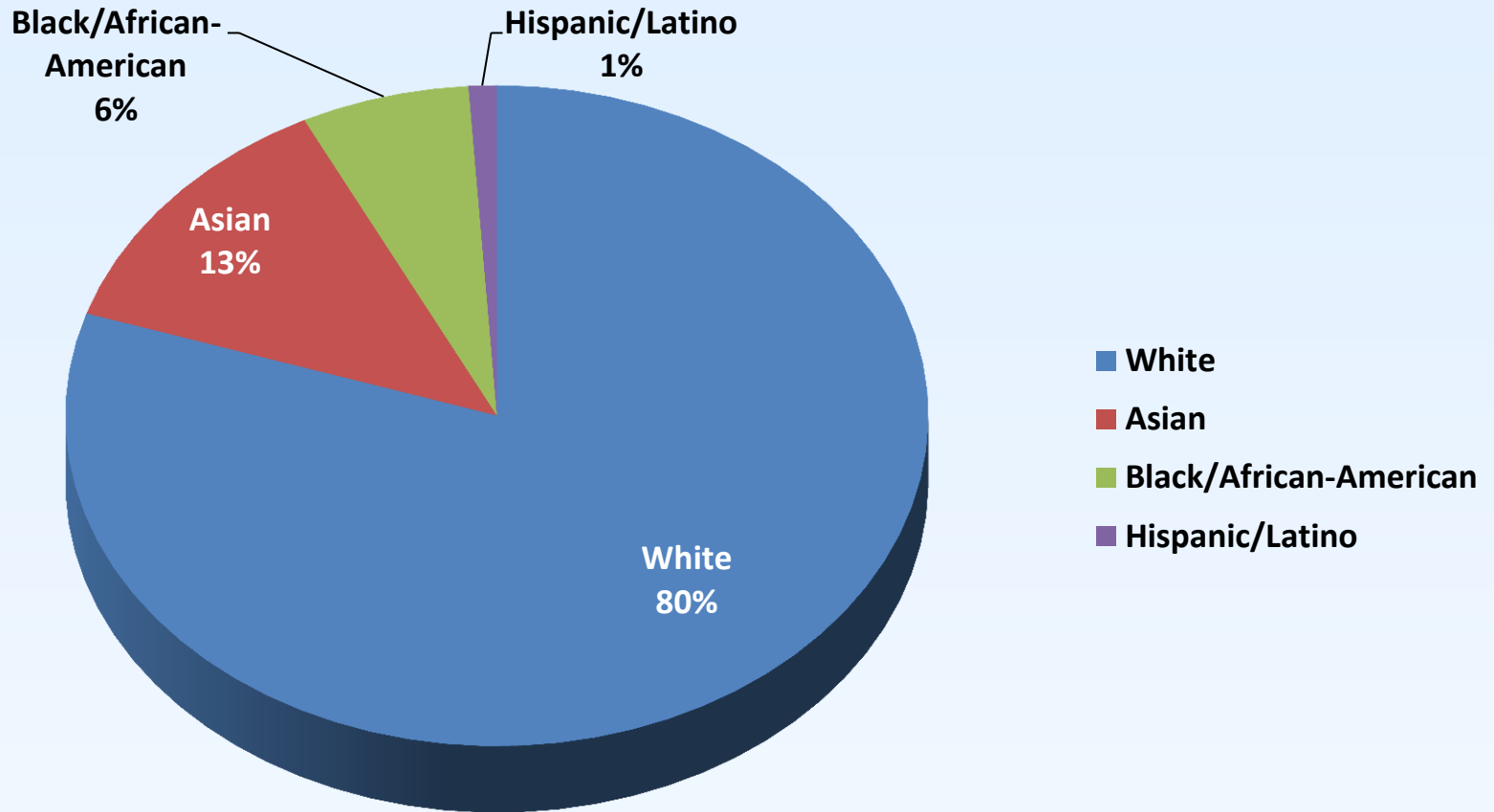
Ranking by All Sponsor Funding Received FY11



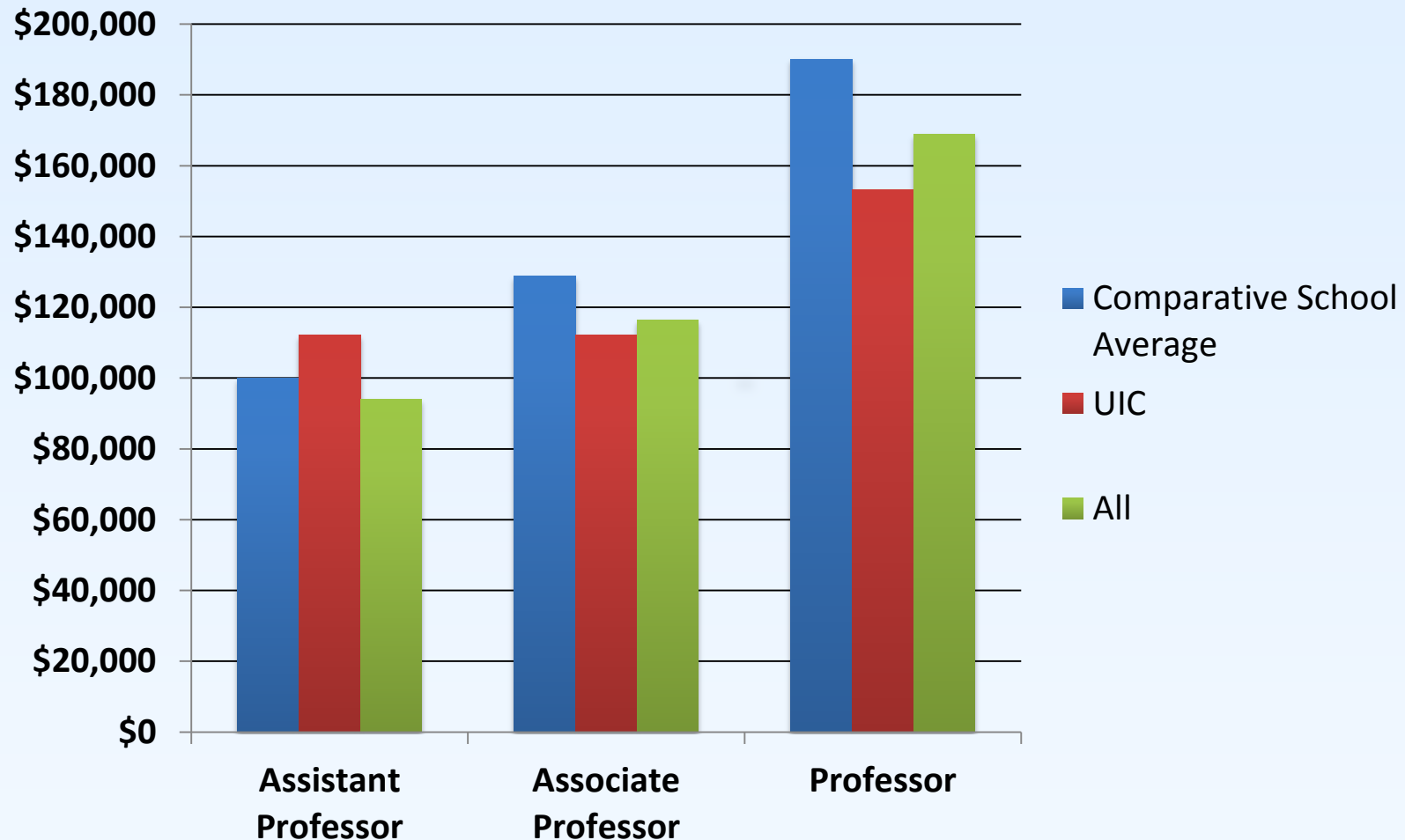
Research Dollars Earned per Capita



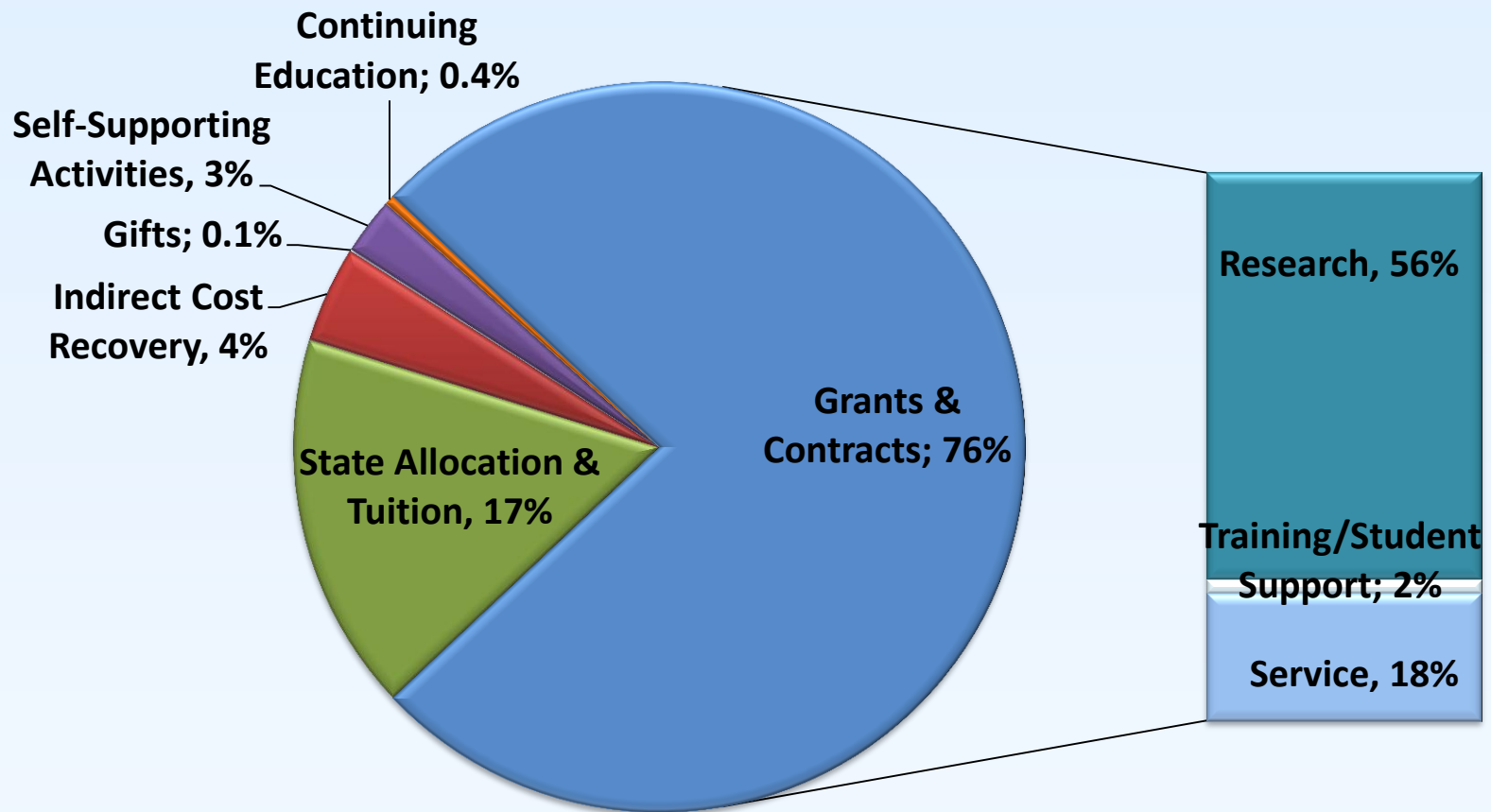
Faculty Ethnicity Breakdown
