ELIMINATE THE BACHELOR OF ARTS IN THE TEACHING OF LATIN, COLLEGE OF LIBERAL ARTS AND SCIENCES, URBANA

Action: Eliminate the Bachelor of Arts in the Teaching of Latin, College of Liberal

Arts and Sciences

Funding: No New Funding Required

The Chancellor, University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign, and Vice President, University of Illinois with the advice of the Urbana-Champaign Senate recommends approval of a proposal from the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences to eliminate the Bachelor of Arts in the Teaching of Latin.

The Department of Classics, College of Liberal Arts and Sciences, proposes to eliminate the Bachelor of Arts in the Teaching of Latin (B.A.T. in Latin). Students interested in teaching could instead pursue the Bachelor of Arts in Liberal Arts and Sciences in Classics or in Latin with the Illinois State Educator's License. The addition of this Illinois State Educator's License option renders the B.A.T. unnecessary; it does not currently meet ISBE standards as it stands, so the department is taking this opportunity to replace it with an option that better serves students.

There are currently no students enrolled in the B.A.T. in Latin and thus no need for phasedown, teach—out, or staff reallocation.

The Board action recommended in this item complies in all material respects with applicable State and federal laws, University of Illinois *Statutes*, *The*

General Rules Concerning University Organization and Procedure, and Board of Trustees policies and directives.

The Executive Vice President and Vice President for Academic Affairs concurs with this recommendation. The University Senates Conference has indicated that no further Senate jurisdiction is involved.

The President of the University recommends approval. This action is subject to further review and approval by the Illinois Board of Higher Education.
