## ROLL CALL

### PURCHASE AND CHANGE ORDER RECOMMENDATIONS

Based on continued growth of the Outreach Reference Laboratory Services program, the amount of \$834,133 was exhausted in May 2007 and \$81, 575 is required to pay invoices for June 2007.
