
# Since January BOT Meeting

- Governor's budget address February 18<sup>th</sup>
- Executive Orders 08 and 09 issued by Governor
- Information requests from the legislature
- ISAC cuts off Monetary assistance Award applications February 22<sup>nd</sup>
- Illinois Supreme Court pension litigation hearing on March 11<sup>th</sup>
- Sale of \$117.3 million Auxiliary System Revenue Refunding Bonds achieving a 9.9% present value savings
- Senate Subcommittee on Public Higher Education Executive Compensation Hearing
- Senate and House appropriation hearings scheduled March 19<sup>th</sup>

# Governor's Proposed FY 16 Budget

- \$6 billion in bills outstanding in January 2015 (excludes Medicaid in process)
- General Revenue Funds (GRF/EAF) appropriation reduced \$208.6M to \$453.5M – a 31.5% reduction
- GRF appropriation to hospital (for transfer to Medicaid Trust Fund) remains at \$45M
- State Medicaid transfers to hospital's Medicaid Trust Fund reduced \$25M to \$20M
- Prairie Research Institute appropriation remains at \$16.8M
- Other State Funds appropriations decreased \$207.5k (\$500.0k pharmacy reduction, \$292.5k Fire Service Institute increase)


#### University of Illinois Direct State General Tax Support (dollars in millions)


### University of Illinois Fringe Benefits (POB) FY 2005 – FY 2015

#### University of Illinois Retirement (SURS - POB) FY 2005 - FY 2015





### **State Appropriation Revenue** Billings and Collections through March 9, 2015



### **Hospital Revenue/Expense/Net Income** Fiscal Year 2014 vs. Fiscal Year 2015 through January 31st




#### Big Ten University and Foundation Endowments FY 2014 (Dollars in Billions)


### **Big Ten University and Foundation Endowments** Percentage Growth from 2013 – 2014

## **University of Illinois** Foundation Distributions to the University





(Dollars in Millions)




#### Big Ten Universities Total Systems Institutional Support as a % of Total Expenditures FY 2014
