APPOINT VICE CHANCELLOR FOR ACADEMIC AFFAIRS AND PROVOST,
SPRINGFIELD

Action: Appoint Vice Chancellor for Academic Affairs and Provost

Funding: State Appropriated Funds

Following an eight-month national search, the Vice President, University of Illinois, and Chancellor, University of Illinois at Springfield has recommended the appointment of Patricia L. Pardie, currently Interim Vice Chancellor for Academic Affairs and Provost, Associate Vice Chancellor for Graduate Education and Research, and Professor of Psychology, College of Liberal Arts and Sciences, as Vice Chancellor for Academic Affairs and Provost, non-tenured, on a twelve-month service basis, on 100 percent time, at an annual salary of \$104,000 and an administrative increment of \$74,000, for a total annual salary of \$178,000, beginning July 1, 2012.

Dr. Pardie will continue to hold the rank of Professor of Psychology, College of Liberal Arts and Sciences, on indefinite tenure, on an academic service basis, on zero percent time, non-salaried, effective August 16, 2011.

Dr. Pardie will succeed Provost and Vice Chancellor for Academic Affairs Harry J. Berman, who assumed the position of Interim Chancellor of the University of

Illinois at Springfield on November 1, 2010, and retired from the University of Illinois at Springfield effective June 30, 2011.

This recommendation is made with the advice of a search committee.¹
