APPOINT INTERIM DEAN, COLLEGE OF URBAN PLANNING AND PUBLIC
AFFAIRS, CHICAGO

Action: Appoint Interim Dean, College of Urban Planning and Public Affairs,
Chicago

Funding: State Appropriated Funds

The Chancellor at Chicago has recommended the appointment of Michael Anthony Pagano, currently Director and Professor, Department of Public Administration, College of Urban Planning and Public Affairs, as Interim Dean of the College of Urban Planning and Public Affairs, non-tenured, on a twelve-month service basis, on 100 percent time, at an annual salary of \$164,221 (equivalent to an annual nine-month base salary of \$134,363 plus two-ninths annualization of \$29,858) and an administrative increment of \$12,500, for a total salary of \$176,721, beginning September 1, 2007.

Dr. Pagano will continue to hold the rank of Professor of Public Administration, on indefinite tenure, on an academic year service basis, on zero percent time, non-salaried. Dr. Pagano succeeds Robin Hambleton, who is resigning to accept a faculty position with the University of the West of England, Bristol, United Kingdom, on September 1, 2007.

The Board action recommended in this item complies in all material respects with applicable State and federal laws, University of Illinois *Statutes*, *The*

General Rules Concerning the University Organization and Procedure, and Board of Trustees policies and directives.

This recommendation is made with the advice of the faculty and the Executive Committee of the College.

The Vice President for Academic Affairs concurs.
