- David Gulley was named Interim Director of OTM, April 2007.
- Conducted 24 meetings with mid-size pharmaceutical companies at BIO2007 in May and also met informally with 75 additional companies.
- Discussions initiated with several companies for licensing UI technology in the area of cancer diagnostics and inflammation.
- Business Plan competition students, Kelly Liebl, Kristin Ware, and Jay Vijayan of Optimal Vision Corporation won first place (and \$10,000) at the Licensing Executives Society's North American Business Plan Competition. Karen Tovey and Santhosh Anand of Flow Diagnostics won 2nd place (and \$1,000) at the competition. These business plans were based upon UIC technology. This was the first time that two teams from one university made it to the finals, a significant accomplishment for UIC.
- OTM accompanied and assisted a faculty member who presented at the Life Sciences Initiative, "Catalyzing Collaboration between Industry and Academia in the Life Sciences". The Life Sciences Initiative is a forum between several Midwest Universities and local companies.

Highlights
