Offices of Technology Management

University of Illinois at Chicago

- Deloitte & Touche completed screening 261 pre-commercial technologies as part of the creation of common system for screening and assessment. These were organized into 180 related clusters with 63 identified as having high potential and 73 as medium high potential for licensing.
- OTM collaborated with the Office of Research Services and the Institute of Tuberculosis Research in the College of Pharmacy to secure a \$1.33M sponsored research grant from the Global Alliance for Tuberculosis. A non-exclusive license to background IP was a requirement of the grant.
- A professional compliance audit of a selected number of important licenses was complete and follow-up with licensees was initiated.
- Disclosures and licenses steady to increasing in FY04.
- Licenses signed with 5 start-ups in FY04 (1 in FY03).

University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign

- Mike Fritz and John Banta presented the University's commercialization opportunities to over 90 venture capitalists and executives at the May meeting of the UI Foundation's Silicon Valley Roundtable.
- Developed a "disclosure mining" technique while identifying, writing disclosures, and screening 21 new technologies from the Center for Simulation of Advanced Rockets
- UIUC OTM is gaining recognition from peer organizations including:
 - Visits from Caterpillar, Rensselaer, Purdue, and Colorado State.
 - A June 2004 article on our tech transfer model in LES NOUVELLES by a D&T consultant and co-authored by two UIUC tech managers.
- The OTM website averages 150 external visitors per day.
- FY04 disclosures were greater than 62% over FY01 and 15% greater than FY03.
- Licenses signed with 11 start-ups in FY04 (6 in FY03).
