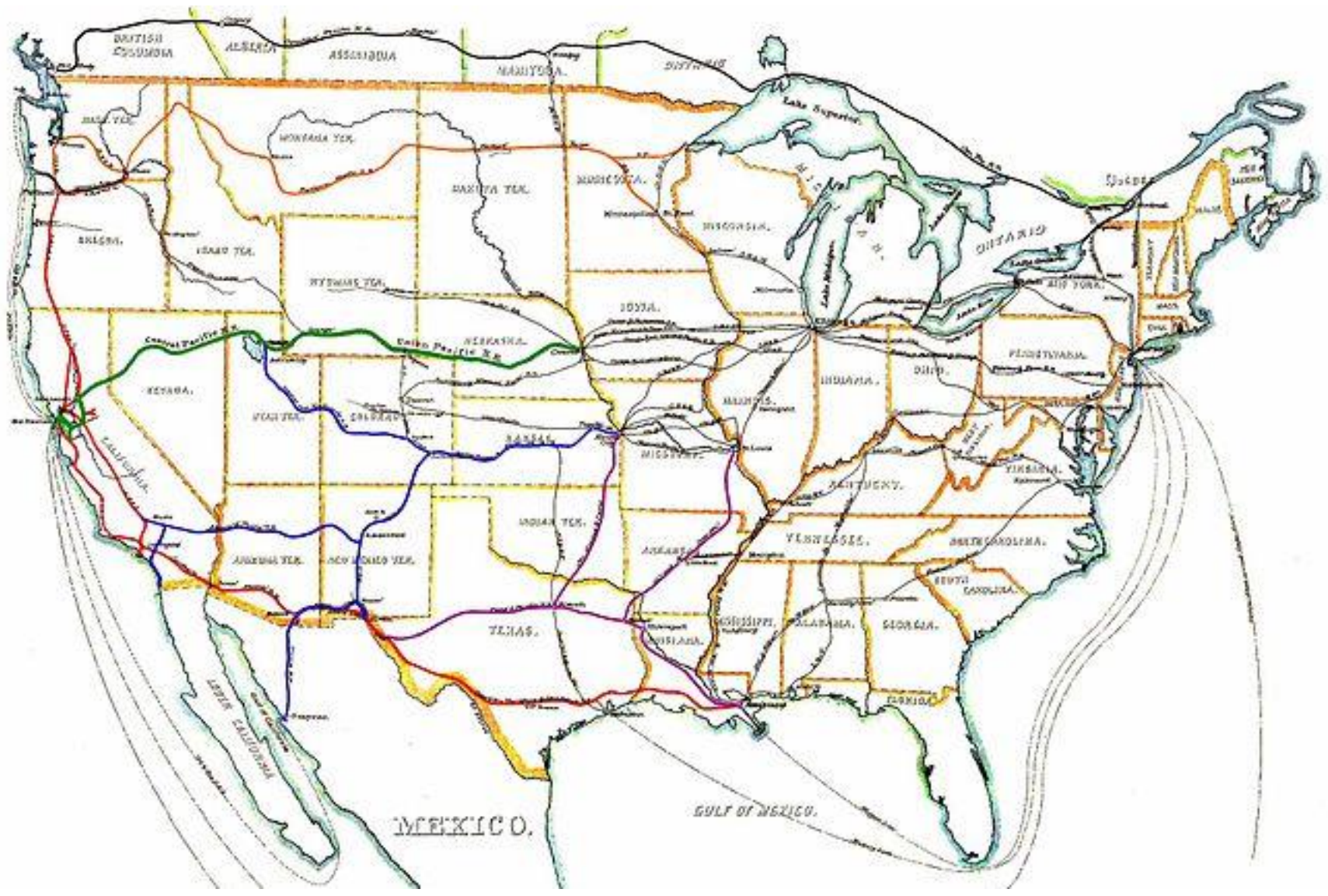


Windy City flag

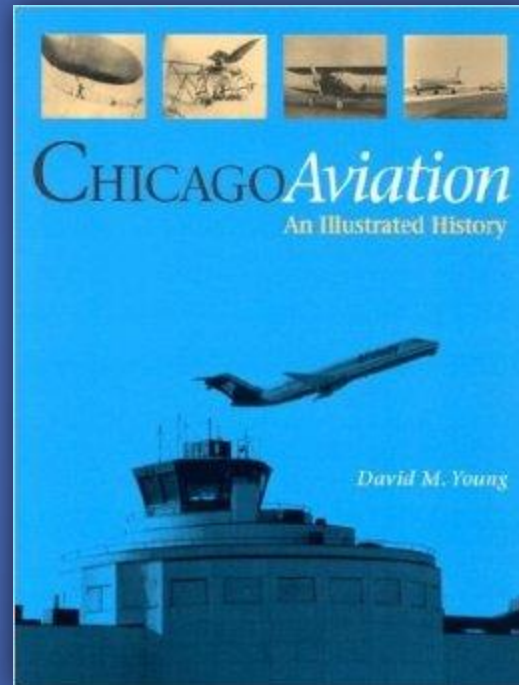
Lake Michigan and
