





WHO ARE NON-TENURE TRACK FACULTY?

- Variation across campuses (titles, expectations, appt. length, etc.)
 - NTT at UIC/UIS; Specialized Faculty at UIUC
- NTT profiles
 1. Professionals with limited appointments
 2. Adjunct faculty paid on a per class basis
 3. Visiting faculty: short-term appointment to meet unexpected need
 4. Full-time, benefits-eligible employees
 - Engaged in teaching, research, service, & clinical activities
 - Expectations depend on title/role; most with primary focus on teaching
 - Promotion path with norms and expectations determined at college or unit level
 - Appointment lengths vary (1-5 years)

LAURIE QUINN, CLINICAL PROFESSOR, DEPARTMENT OF BIOBEHAVIORAL NURSING SCIENCE, UIC

- At UIC for 30 years
- \$30 million in awards, 150 articles, 31 book chapters
- Most recent award: \$515,545 (NIH) – artificial pancreas algorithm and diabetes
- Graduated 21 PhD students (UIC Graduate Mentoring Award)
- Children with Type 1 diabetes summer camp – 36 years as part of healthcare team
- VP for NTT (UICUF)



MIRANDA ANDREWS, CLINICAL ASST. PROF., SCHOOL OF INTEGRATED SCIENCES, SUSTAINABILITY, AND PUBLIC HEALTH, UIS



- At UIS since 2021
- Intermediate-level Organic Chemistry, including coordinating all labs
- Co-authored proposal resulting in \$400,000+ in new science instrumentation
- UIS' Chemical Hygiene Officer
- Service: School Exec Cmte, program assessment, recruiting open houses, summer orientation (for parents), faculty & admin search committees


SANTIAGO GUTIERREZ-NIBEYRO, CLINICAL PROF., DEPT. OF VETERINARY CLINICAL MEDICINE, UIUC

- At UIUC since 2009
- Research: External (9) and internal (1) grants, including 3-yr. \$475,000 USDA grant
- Teaching: Core courses (120-140 students each) and advanced electives (10-30 student)
- Clinical supervision: 8-10 students, 4 interns, and 2 equine surgery residents per rotation
- Clinical Activities: 70% appt. equine surgery & diagnostic imaging
- Committees: P&T, College Exec & Strategic Plan




SIGNIFICANT IN NUMBER, MISSION CRITICAL IN IMPACT


UIC: FY 2024*

UIC NTT:

- 43% of faculty
- 60% undergrad hours
- 80% of 100-level

UIS NTT:

- 50% of faculty
- 33% of faculty FTE
- 48% undergrad hours
- 61% of 100-level

UIUC Specialized:

- 37% of faculty
- 49% undergrad hours
- 80% of 100-level

CRITICAL IMPACT WITH EMPLOYMENT VULNERABILITIES

- *Statutes*: NTT not defined as faculty
 - “other academic staff”
 - Voting privileges must be granted by college/unit faculty
- Non-reappointment: no reason needed
 - Fear of saying “no”
- Short reappointment notification window
- Changes in work/teaching load
- Variable path to promotion
