APPOINT INTERIM VICE PRESIDENT FOR HEALTH AFFAIRS

Action: Appoint Interim Vice President for Health Affairs

Funding: State Appropriated Funds

I recommend the appointment of Joe G. N. Garcia, presently Vice Chancellor for Research, Chicago; Earl M. Bane Professor of Medicine and Professor of Pharmacology, College of Medicine at Chicago; and Professor of Bioengineering, College of Engineering, Chicago, to serve as Interim Vice President for Health Affairs, University Administration, non-tenured, on a twelve-month service basis, on 55 percent time, at an annual salary of \$290,700, and an administrative increment of \$50,000, beginning March 28, 2011.

Dr. Garcia will continue to hold the rank of Earl M. Bane Professor of Medicine, College of Medicine at Chicago, on indefinite tenure, on a twelve-month service basis, on 40 percent time, at an annual salary of \$204,000, effective February 16, 2011; and Vice Chancellor for Research, Chicago, non-tenured, on a twelve-month service basis, on 5 percent time, at an annual salary of \$15,300, effective February 16, 2011, for a total annual salary of \$560,000.

He was appointed to serve as Interim Vice President for Health Affairs, Designate, under the same conditions and salary arrangement beginning February 16, 2011.

The Board action recommended in this item complies in all material respects with applicable State and federal laws, University of Illinois *Statutes, The General Rules Concerning University Organization and Procedure*, and Board of Trustees policies and directives.
