Meeting of June 5, 1906.

A special meeting of the Board of Trustees of the University of Illinois was held at the Palmer House in Chicago, June 5, 1906, upon the call of the President; the purpose of the meeting being to authorize conferring degrees upon those to be graduated from the College of Medicine on that day, and to transact such other business as might be presented.

The members present were Messrs. Abbott, Bullard, Davison, Kerrick, McLean, and Mrs. Alexander, Mrs. Evans, and Mrs. Busey; absent, Governor Deneen and Messrs. Barber, Bayliss, and Lehman. President James and Mr. Haugan, Treasurer, were present.

MATTERS PRESENTED BY THE PRESIDENT.

1. Dr. Evarts B. Greene, Professor of History in the University, has received a most flattering call to the Professorship of History in one of the oldest and largest of our eastern institutions, offering him an immediate salary of \$3,500 to be advanced within a comparatively short time to \$4,000 with a possibility of its going higher than that in case the general average of salaries is raised. It contains also the extra inducement which a well defined and well established system of retiring allowances already adopted in that institution, provides, with the opportunity to share in the grant from the pension fund for American college professors recently established by Andrew Carnegie.

This call is certainly a very just recognition of a worthy man. I think it would be a great misfortune to the University of Illinois to lose Professor Greene's services. I think the Board should improve his situation here as far as in their judgment would be feasible, considering our resources and the claims of other departments and other men.

Voted:

I. That Dr. Greene's salary as Professor of History and head of the Department of History be fixed at \$3,000 per annum, beginning September I, 1906.

2. That he receive in addition to this for his work as dean of the College of Literature and Arts the sum of \$500 a year, beginning at the same date.

3. That in addition to the present force in the department of history, another professorship of history be established with a salary of not to exceed \$2,500, and that the President of the University be authorized to recommend an incumbent for this position at his earliest convenience.

4. That the sum of \$1,000 be appropriated from the general funds to be placed at Professor Greene's disposal for the purchase of additional books in the department of history for the University Library.

2. The Faculty of the Engineering College have made a recommendation approved by the Dean of the College that Edward C. Schmidt be appointed Associate Professor of Railway Engineering at a salary of \$2,500, to date from July 1, 1906.

Professor Schmidt is a graduate of Stevens Institute of Technology, 1895, in the course of Mechanical Engineering. After three years of practice work, he served for five years as instructor and assistant professor in the College of Engineering in this University. Since 1903 he has been engaged in practical work. His work done at the University of Illinois seems to have been of an unusually high character, according to the testimony of those who stood nearest to him. He seems to be a man of good training, initiative, enterprise, and professional ambition, in every way competent as a member of the staff in the new department of Railway Engineering and Administration. It seems to be desirable for him to begin his work on the first of July, since it will be necessary for him to do considerable work in organizing the department and adjusting the equipment for the most efficient work during the coming year.

I recommend that this appointment be made.

Voted that the recommendation be approved.

3. Professor Grindley has informed me that the cold storage interests of Chicago have offered to the University the sum of \$500 to be expended in scientific investigation of the effect of refrigeration on meats and other food supplies.

 $\hat{H}e$ requests permission to accept this money and recommends that a research fellowship be created with a salary of \$300 for the coming year, and that \$200 of the same be utilized in the necessary expenditure for materials, etc., connected with this investigation.

Voted that the University accept the money to be expended under the direction of Professor Grindley, and that said research fellowship be created and the President of the University be authorized to appoint the incumbent.

4 The head of the Military Department requests that Mr Frederick Post be appointed Armorer and Administrative Assistant in the Military Department for thirteen months, beginning June 1, 1906, at a salary of \$45 a month.

Voted that such appointment be made.

5. The Secretary of the Medical College of the University has submitted the list of candidates for the degree of Doctor of Medicine at the approaching commencement.

Voted that the President of the University be authorized to confer the degree of Doctor of Medicine upon the following named persons who have, according to the certificate of the Secretary of the Medical Faculty, completed the work of the Medical course.
