MEETING OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES

October 12, 1921

The October monthly meeting of the Board of Trustees of the University of Illinois was held at 10 o'clock a. m. on Wednesday, October 12, 1921, at the Blackstone Hotel, in Chicago.

When the Board convened, the following members were present: President Abbott, Mrs. Blake, Mrs. Busey, Mrs. Evans, Mrs. Grigsby, Mr. Hoit. Dr. Noble came later in the day.

President Kinley, Vice-President Davenport, and Professor J. M. White, Supervising Architect, were present.

MINUTES APPROVED

The Secretary presented the minutes of the meeting of September 8, 1921, and of the adjourned session of September 21, 1921.

On motion of Mrs. Evans, the minutes were approved as printed on pages 81 to 100 above.

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MATTERS PRESENTED BY PRESIDENT KINLEY

The Board considered the following matters presented by the President of the University.

REGISTRATION, OCTOBER 10, 1921

(1) A statement that the total registration on October 10, 1921, was 8948 students, of whom 8178 were in Urbana and 770 in the departments in Chicago.

This report was received for record.

UNIVERSITY STATISTICIAN

(2) A report for authority to appoint a University Statistician at a salary not to exceed \$3000 a year.

On motion of Mrs. Blake this request was granted.

CONTRACT WITH THE FEDERAL BOARD FOR VOCATIONAL EDUCATION FOR 1921-1922

(3) A request for authority to execute the proposed contract with the Federal Board for Vocational Education as of the first of July, as submitted, with the proviso that such changes may be made as are necessary on account of the changes in the laboratory and other fees in the University.

On motion of Mr. Hoit, authority was granted the President of the University to execute this contract.

LEAVE OF ABSENCE FOR ASSISTANT PROFESSOR A. H. KOLLER (4) A recommendation that leave of absence on full pay for one semester be granted to Professor A. H. Koller on account of illness.

On motion of Mrs. Evans, this recommendation was concurred in.

INJURY TO MISS VERNA BROOKS

(5) A request for authority to grant leave of absence to Miss Verna Brooks, Associate in Physical Education, who is temporarily disabled by injury.

This matter was referred to the President of the University with power to act.

APPROPRIATION FOR LABORATORY SUPPLIES, SCHOOL OF PHARMACY

(6) A request for an appropriation of \$2000 from the Reserve and Contingent Fund, to be assigned by the President for the purchase of additional laboratory supplies in the School of Pharmacy if on further inquiry he deems this necessary.

RESOLUTION FROM THE INDIANAPOLIS ILLINI CLUB

(7) A resolution from the Indianapolis Illini Club.

Whereas, The Central West was once inhabited by a most remarkable prehistoric race; and-

Whereas, a movement is on foot to investigate and explore the extensive group of Indian mounds at Cahokia, near East St. Louis, Ill.; and—

Whereas, the location of the state of Illinois being so central in the extensive territory occupied by the pre-historic race mentioned, viz.—the Mound-Builders, so

called, it is pertinent that the University of Illinois should lead in searching out the hidden facts relative to the life and development of that race; be it therefore,-Resolved, That the Indianapolis Illini Club, after due consideration deems the subject of sufficient importance to suggest to President Kinley and the management of the University of Illinois and urge upon them the appropriateness, importance, and desirability of establishing a course of study in connection with its Biological Department which would systematically develop this line of local ethnology, ethnography, and archeology, to the extent of teaching practical methods and using the same through applied science and research among the remains of this unknown race; and further, that steps be taken to participate in the research work now to be undertaken by the scientific institutions referred to.

This resolution was received for record.

CLAIMS FOR COMPENSATION FOR INJURIES

(8) A recommendation that \$201.70 be appropriated from the Reserve and Contingent Fund to pay bills for injuries to employees as follows: HARRY GRISSEMER 2.00 consisting of Judge Harker and Mr. Morey.

INJURY SUSTAINED BY MR. RALPH BRADY, A STUDENT

(9) A recommendation that the claim of Mr. Ralph Brady for \$87.50, be paid. Mr. Brady is a student who cut his hand on a broken bottle while performing military drill under orders which included crawling through the grass on the drill field.

APPROPRIATION TO CHEMISTRY DEPARTMENT, COLLEGE OF MEDICINE, TO REPLACE APPARATUS LOST BY FIRE

(10) A recommendation that the sum of \$160, received as reimbursement for a loss caused by fire on May 21, 1921, in the chemical laboratory of the College of Medicine, be appropriated to the Department of Chemistry of the College of Medicine to replace the apparatus destroyed by the fire.

On motion of Mrs. Blake, this appropriation was made, by the following vote: Aye, Mr. Abbott, Mrs. Blake, Mrs. Busey, Mrs. Evans, Mrs. Grigsby, Mr. Hoit; no, none; absent, Mr. Blair, Mr. Herbert, Mr. Noble, Mr. Small, Mr. Trimble.

At this point, Dr. Noble took his place with the board.

ARCHITECTS FOR THE NEW AGRICULTURAL BUILDING

(11) The following statement: The benefits which have come from the advice of the architects who have been the Computer Plan Commission and to design employed by the Board to advise on the Campus Plan Commission and to design

the Horticultural Field Laboratory and the proposed new Library have been so great as to suggest the likelihood of even greater advantages from a more extended consulting group. I therefore recommend that the new Agricultural Building be given to some architect or firm of architects not now in the service of the University.

On motion of Mrs. Busey, this recommendation was concurred in.

At this point, a recess was taken.

AFTERNOON SESSION, OCTOBER 12, 1921

When the Board convened for the afternoon session of October 12, 1921, the same persons were present as during the morning session.

STADIUM FUNDS AND TREASURER

The Secretary reported that the Executive Committee had held a meeting at 2 p. m. on October 12, 1921. Mr. W. L. Abbott, Chair-man, Mrs. Mary E. Busey, and Mr. O. W. Hoit, members of the Committee, and President Kinley were present. The Executive Committee adopted the following:

Resolved. That the Board of Trustees receive and receipt for any funds offered for the purpose of erecting a Stadium at the University. The Committee voted also to appoint a Treasurer for Stadium

funds who should be properly bonded.

This report was received for record.

ARCHITECTS FOR NEW AGRICULTURE BUILDING

On motion of Mrs. Blake, the President of the Board was requested to appoint a committee of three members of the Board to recommend an architect for the Agriculture Building. President Abbott appointed the following committee: Mrs. Blake, Dr. Noble, and Mr. Abbott, Chairman.

CAMPUS PLAN COMMISSION

Mrs. Blake reported for the Campus Plan Commission that studies were being made to ascertain the best site for the Stadium; and also that studies of the plans and elevation of the proposed Library building had been prepared.

This report was received for record.

PAYMENT ON LIBRARY PLANS

On motion of Mrs. Blake, the Comptroller was authorized to pay to Holabird & Roche the sum of \$2500, being one-half the amount due under the contract, for work already done on the Library plans.
