The June meeting of the Board of Trustees of the University of Illinois was held in the Illini Union Building, Urbana, Illinois, on Mon-

day, June 22, 1953, beginning at 12:30 p.m. (C.D.S.T.).

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## REQUEST FROM THE TWIN CITY FEDERATION OF LABOR OF CHAMPAIGN AND URBANA, ILLINOIS

At this point President Livingston brought up for discussion a letter written on June 17, 1953, to all members of the Board of Trustees by Senator Everett R. Peters, Chairman of the Illinois Budgetary Commission, requesting the Board to give consideration to the layoff of a number of employees by the Physical Plant Department. In order to operate within its budget allotment for 1953-1954, the Physical Plant Department has been obliged to reduce its operating personnel and notices of layoffs to be become effective on or about June 30, 1953, have been sent to approximately one hundred employees.

Messrs. Clifford H. James and Sherdie C. Jones, President and Vice-President respectively of the Twin City Federation of Labor of Champaign and Urbana, Illinois, appeared before the Board to protest these layoffs of employees. Each made a statement in support of a request that the Board and other appropriate University officers reconsider the layoff policy with respect to employees already affected and

those who might be affected in the future.

In the discussion of the matter with these gentlemen it was brought out that all departments of the University are obliged to reduce their budgets by at least five per cent in addition to further specific reductions to be made in certain areas. These reductions are necessary to offset loss of fee income not replaced by appropriations from tax revenues and to provide funds for crucial needs as shown in the interim report on the internal budget for 1953-1954 presented by the President of the University.

At the conclusion of this hearing, on motion of Mr. Herrick, the request of Senator Peters and of the Twin City Federation of Labor of Champaign and Urbana, Illinois, was referred to the Committee on Nonacademic Personnel for consideration and advice to the Board.

## REPORT OF THE SPECIAL COMMITTEE ON CHICAGO UNDERGRADUATE DIVISION

Mr. Johnston, Chairman of the Special Committee appointed by the Board of Trustees on May 23, 1953, to consider the petition and proposal from the faculty of the Chicago Undergraduate Division for a four-year university in Chicago, stated that the Committee has held three meetings, is still working on its report, and that as soon as its report is finished and approved by the Committee it will be submitted to the President of the Board.

A delegation from the Council of the Faculty of the Chicago Undergraduate Division, headed by Professor John D. McNee, Jr., was present at the meeting and at its conclusion had an informal discussion with Mr. Johnston and other members of the Board.

#### APPOINTMENTS TO THE FACULTY

(2) The following new appointments to the faculty of the rank of Assistant Professor and above, and involving tenure, have been approved since the previous meeting of the Board of Trustees.

1. John E. Eichenlaub, Assistant Professor of Hygiene and Medical Ad-

viser in the Health Services, beginning June 8, 1953, at an annual salary of

\$8,000 (DY).

2. ROBERT RODIN, Assistant Professor of Hygiene and Medical Adviser in the Health Services, beginning July 1, 1953, at an annual salary of \$8,000 (DY).

On motion of Mr. Nickell, these appointments were confirmed.

#### CHANGES IN SABBATICAL LEAVES OF ABSENCE FOR 1953-1954

(3) The Board of Trustees on March 25, 1953, approved a number of sabbatical leaves of absence for 1953-1954. The following changes subsequently have been requested.

M. Zbigniew Krzywoblocki, Professor of Aeronautical Engineering, who was granted leave of absence for the full academic year on one-half pay, has

requested the cancellation of his leave.

I recommend that this leave be cancelled without prejudice.

Stanley Fletcher, Professor of Music, was granted leave for the full year on one-half pay, with the option of changing to leave for the first semester on full pay. He has exercised this option and is requesting a leave of absence for

the first semester of 1953-1954 on full pay.

John M. Kuypers, Professor of Music, was granted leave for the full year on one-half pay, with the option of changing to leave for the second semester on full pay. He has exercised this option and is requesting a leave of absence for the second semester of 1953-1954 on full pay.

The above changes are reported for record.

On motion of Mr. Johnston, these changes were approved.

## LEAVE OF ABSENCE FOR DR. A. C. IVY

(4) On December 22, 1952, the Board of Trustees granted Dr. A. C. Ivy, Vice-President of the University in Charge of the Chicago Professional Colleges, Distinguished Professor of Physiology, and Head of the Department of Clinical Science, leave of absence without salary for the period from January 1 through June 30, 1953. In requesting this leave of absence Dr. Ivy indicated that he would like to have the privilege of extending the leave up to August 31, 1953, and this was generally understood.

He has now requested an extension of his present leave of absence without

salary from July 1 through August 31, 1953.

I recommend that this extension of leave be granted but that the additional leave during July and August be on full pay because (a) he is entitled to a month's vacation with pay, and (b) he contemplates making a lecture tour of a month's duration.

On motion of Mr. Nickell, this recommendation was approved.

#### CURRICULUM IN CITY PLANNING

(5) The University Senate has approved for presentation to the Board of Trustees a proposal from the College of Fine and Applied Arts for a new curriculum in city planning leading to the degree of Bachelor of Science in City Planning. The curriculum will require a total of 130 semester hours, including physical education and basic military training. The course requirements will include the following:

It is recommended that this curriculum be established September 1, 1953. I concur.

On motion of Mrs. Watkins, this recommendation was approved.

# REQUIREMENTS FOR ADMISSION TO CURRICULA IN LANDSCAPE ARCHITECTURE, LANDSCAPE OPERATION, AND CITY PLANNING

(6) The University Senate has approved for presentation to the Board of Trustees a recommendation from the College of Fine and Applied Arts that the requirements for admission to the curricula in landscape architecture, landscape operation, and city planning be uniform with the requirements for admission in the curriculum in architecture. The effect of this change will be to add one-half unit of algebra to the one unit of algebra and one unit of geometry now constituting the mathematics requirement for admission to the curricula in landscape architecture and landscape operation. Admission will be granted without this additional one-half unit in algebra, on condition that the deficiency be removed during the first year, as is authorized in the case of the curriculum in architecture.

I concur.

On motion of Mr. Nickell, this recommendation was approved.

## PROFESSIONAL WORK EXPERIENCE REQUIREMENT FOR DOCTOR'S DEGREES IN PSYCHOLOGY AND EDUCATION

(7) The University Senate has approved for presentation to the Board of Trustees a recommendation from the College of Education, the Department of Psychology, and the Graduate College that candidates for the degrees of Doctor of Philosophy in Psychology or in Education, or for the degree of Doctor of Education, who are preparing to become public school psychologists and are following the approved program for such graduate training, shall be required to complete a twelve-month period of professional work experience (internship) under the direction of the Joint Committee on School Psychology and under conditions specified by the Senate. A committee of the College of Education and the Department of Psychology has outlined options suitable for school psychologists under these three degrees and proposes that a year of practical work experience, similar to that now required of candidates for advanced degrees in clinical psychology, be made a specific requirement.

I concur.

On motion of Mr. Johnston, this recommendation was approved.

#### FOUR-YEAR PROGRAM IN NURSING

(8) The University Senate has approved, in principle, for presentation to the Board of Trustees a recommendation from the School of Nursing for a four-year curriculum leading to the degree of Bachelor of Science in Nursing.

This program will consist of one year of studies in the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences (in Urbana or at Navy Pier) followed by eleven quarters (three academic years plus two summer quarters) in the School of Nursing on the campus of the Chicago Professional Colleges. All instruction in nursing under this program would be given by regular members of the University of Illinois nursing faculty. Courses in related areas (biological sciences, physical sciences, social sciences) would be given by members of the faculty of the appropriate departments of the University of Illinois and subject to appropriate departmental approval.

It is recommended that admission to the first year of the program (prenursing) begin September, 1953. The existing approval for the two years of prenursing under the Affiliation Program for Hospital Schools of Nursing would cover admission to this new program pending approval of new

requirements.
I concur.

On motion of Mrs. Holt, this recommendation was approved.

## HARRY G. AND HARRIETTE A. WRIGHT SCHOLARSHIPS

(9) The regulations governing the award of scholarships under the Harry G. and Harriette A. Wright endowment included a provision that the value of undergraduate scholarships shall be \$400 a year plus an amount sufficient to cover University fees. The Committee on Undergraduate Scholarships which administers the awards of all University undergraduate scholarships established by private gifts recommends that this provision in the regulations be amended to authorize the granting of half scholarships of \$200 a year plus University fees from the Wright endowment.

I concur.

On motion of Mr. Megran, these regulations were amended as recommended.

#### UNIVERSITY OF ILLINOIS LEASE OF ILLINI CENTER

(10) The University has leased quarters in the LaSalle Hotel for the Illini Center since 1947. The first lease was for two years ending June 30, 1949, the University having the right to renew for three successive two-year periods, and the Hotel having the right to call for an adjustment in rental upon the occasion of each renewal. Renewals of the lease have been approved through June 30, 1953.

The Hotel has agreed to continue the present rental of \$6,900 a year through an additional two-year period ending June 30, 1955.

This facility is used regularly by the University Placement Bureau, the University Extension Division, the Institute of Labor and Industrial Relations, and the School of Social Work in their Chicago activities. It is also used by alumni and other University agencies.

The Comptroller recommends that he be authorized to extend this lease for

two years ending June 30, 1955, at a rental of \$6,900 a year.

Action on this recommendation was deferred.

#### SPECIAL APPROPRIATIONS FOR NONRECURRING EXPENDITURES

(11) The Committee on Nonrecurring Appropriations recommends assignments of funds as follows:

 Physical Plant Department, improvement of rest room facilities in Mumford Hall, David Kinley Hall, and the Library................\$ 6 950
 Department of Botany, construction of a cold room in basement of Natural History Building and installation of refrigerating equipment...

I recommend that these appropriations be made from the General Reserve

#### SALE OF UNIVERSITY PROPERTY

(12) The University owns a vacant lot, 54 feet by 114 feet, at 1108 South Third Street in Champaign between Gregory Drive and Armory Avenue, acquired in 1923 as part of a parcel which included four other lots purchased for future campus expansion. Some of these lots are part of the Parade Ground area south of Gregory Drive. Present plans do not contemplate need for the lot on Third Street which is the only one now owned by the University in this particu-

The University has been offered \$3,000 (the appraised value) by the Indeco House Association for this lot. The Indeco House Association, an organization of parents of women students, owns the adjoining property.

The Director of the Physical Plant and the Comptroller recommend ac-

ceptance of this offer.

I concur and recommend that the Secretary of the Board and the Comptroller be authorized to execute, acknowledge, and deliver a warranty deed and such other documents as may be necessary to effectuate the transfer of title to this property.

On motion of Mr. Herrick, the sale of this property was authorized by the following vote: Aye, Mr. Herrick, Mrs. Holt, Mr. Johnston, Mr. Livingston, Mr. Megran, Mr. Nickell, Mrs. Watkins; no, none; absent, Mr. Bissell, Mr. Grange, Mr. Hickman, Mr. Stratton.

#### STANDING CONTRACT FOR PLASTERING WORK

(13) The Director of the Physical Plant and the Comptroller recommend award of a contract for plastering maintenance and minor improvement work as needed at Urbana-Champaign for one year from July 1, 1953, to E. G. Lindsey, Champaign. The contract provides for payments on the basis of costs, plus 21 per cent, but charges of less than \$25 will be billed on a lump sum basis; trucking charges will be at the rate of \$2.50 per hour and will not exceed 15 per cent of the cost of labor and materials on any job.

I concur and recommend that the Comptroller and the Secretary of the

Board be authorized to execute this contract.

On motion of Mr. Johnston, this contract was awarded and the Comptroller and the Secretary of the Board were authorized to execute the same.

## CONTRACT FOR FURNACE MAINTENANCE AND REPAIRS IN HOUSING UNITS

(14) The Director of the Physical Plant and the Comptroller recommend award of a contract to J. R. Boers Heating Company, Inc., Champaign, the lowest bidder, for furnace maintenance and repair work in the temporary housing units on the campus at Urbana-Champaign during the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1953. The contract provides for services only as required and payments will be made at the following rates: Furnace Repairman and Serviceman, \$2.00 per hour straight time and \$3.00 per hour for overtime and for work on Sundays and holidays; Helper, \$1.50 per hour straight time and \$2.25 per hour overtime and for work on Sundays and holidays; 30 per cent to be added to job costs as contractor's fee.

Payments for these services will be made from the operating funds of the

Housing Division.

I concur and recommend that the Comptroller and the Secretary of the Board be authorized to execute this contract.

On motion of Mr. Nickell, this contract was awarded and the Comptroller and the Secretary of the Board were authorized to execute the same.

## CONTRACT FOR REMODELING AT CHICAGO UNDERGRADUATE DIVISION

(15) The Director of the Physical Plant and the Comptroller recommend award of a contract for \$4,802 to the Mutual Contracting Company, Chicago, the low-

est bidder, for remodeling at the Chicago Undergraduate Division.

The work will consist of rebuilding a wooden frame bulkhead beneath the west-end lounge picture windows and replacement of aluminum frames in the snack bar. The bulkhead has deteriorated, through rotting, to such an extent that it has been necessary to provide temporary bracing to keep the plate glass from falling. If this condition is not remedied as soon as possible additional damage will occur and make the area unsafe.

Funds are available in the operation and maintenance budgets of the Chi-

cago Undergraduate Division.

I concur and recommend that the Comptroller and the Secretary of the Board be authorized to execute this contract.

On motion of Mr. Johnston, this contract was awarded and the Comptroller and the Secretary of the Board were authorized to execute the same.

#### BUILDING IMPROVEMENTS ON ENDOWMENT FARMS

(16) The College of Agriculture which manages the University's endowment farms has a systematic program of modernizing buildings and making other improvements on these farms as funds become available. This year's program calls for remodeling of houses on the Hackett and Allerton farms.

The Dean of the College of Agriculture and the Comptroller recommend award of a contract to M. Osmond of Monticello for remodeling the house on Allerton Farm No. 3. The work will include installation of a central heating system, a bathroom, and modernization of the kitchen and living room. The estimated cost is \$7,500.

The Dean of the College of Agriculture and the Comptroller recommend award of a contract to Hammerschmidt Brothers of Monticello for remodeling House No. 2 on Allerton Farm No. 1. The work will include repairing the exterior, installation of a new bathroom, a new deep-well water system with the necessary plumbing, and some deferred maintenance work. The estimated cost is \$3,500.

The Dean of the College of Agriculture and the Comptroller recommend award of a contract to Chenoweth Brothers of Atwood for remodeling the house on the Hackett farm. This work will include installation of a bathroom, construction of closets in the living room and bedroom, modernization of the kitchen, and some deferred maintenance work. The estimated cost is \$3,500.

Funds are available for all of these improvements in the income from the

operations of these farms.

I concur and recommend that the Comptroller and the Secretary of the Board be authorized to execute these contracts.

On motion of Mrs. Holt, these contracts were awarded, and the Comptroller and the Secretary of the Board were authorized to execute the same.

#### CONTRACTS FOR REMODELING OF MEN'S RESIDENCE HALLS ADDITION NO. 1

(17) The Director of the Physical Plant and the Comptroller recommend award of contracts as follows for alterations in the first addition to the Men's Residence Halls:

Felmley-Dickerson Co., Urbana - For the erection of corridor partitions and doors, installation of asphalt tile floor covering in the dormitories and corridor areas, and the installation of acoustical materials on the corridor ceilings on the first, second, third, and fourth

The Board of Trustees has previously authorized this remodeling and has assigned the necessary funds. The first phase of the work was completed between the first and second semesters in February, and the contracts now being recommended are for the completion of the project.

I concur.

On motion of Mr. Herrick, these contracts were awarded and the Comptroller and the Secretary of the Board were authorized to execute the same.

#### NAMES OF UNITS OF MEN'S RESIDENCE HALLS

(18) When the first group of Men's Residence Halls buildings were constructed in 1940-1941, five names were officially assigned by the Board of Trustees to the three buildings: Clark House for the center building, Lundgren House and Noble House for the north units, and Barton House and Flagg House for the south units. Experience has shown that two names on one building, even though it consists of two units, cause confusion. Accordingly, the Director of Housing and the Dean of Students have recommended that the north unit of the original Halls be named Lundgren House, the south unit be named Barton House, and that the two other names be assigned to the newly constructed units: Addition No. 1 to be Noble House and Addition No. 2 to be Flagg House.

The official address of all units of the Men's Residence Halls located in the

area bounded by Gregory Drive, Peabody Drive, Fourth Street, and Euclid Street extended will be 1215 South Fourth Street, Champaign, Illinois.

I have approved these changes and report them to the Board as a matter of record.

On motion of Mr. Johnston, the President's action was confirmed.

At the conclusion of the Board meeting, the Executive Committee authorized the purchase of a video recorder (kinescopic recorder), including a 16 millimeter sound camera and amplifier, from the General Precision Laboratory of Pleasantville, New York, at a cost of \$21,600 t.o.b. Ossining, New York, to be paid for from the grant of \$100,000 which has been offered the University by the Fund for Adult Education.

## EXECUTION OF LEASES BY THE COMPTROLLER AND THE SECRETARY OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES

(22) The University of Illinois Statutes provide (Section 52) that "Minor contracts and those involving the purchase of ordinary supplies, advertising and publicity matters, and other routine matters in the ordinary operation of university affairs, shall be signed by the Secretary of the Board of Trustees and by the Comptroller of the University, to whom authority is hereby delegated by the Board for such purpose." This authority is being interpreted to mean routine contracts involving less than \$2,500 (the amount which the Board has specifically

authorized for purchases without prior approval of the Board), and all contracts executed under this authority have subsequently been reported to the Board. This expedites business and relieves the Board of many minor details in

the routine operations of the University.

The Statutes also authorize the Comptroller to sign leases for land for agricultural experimental work provided that the President of the University has specifically authorized the negotiations for such land. This provision, to gether with the provisions of Article III, Section 4, and Article IV, Section 3, of the Board's By-Laws, apparently limits the power of the Comptroller to enter into leases, even of a minor nature, to those of land for "agricultural experimental work" and requires that all other leases (with the exception of leases of University housing facilities which by Board authorization in September, 1950, may be executed by the Director of Housing) be approved by the Board of Trustees.

There are two situations under which authorization of the Comptroller to execute leases of land without prior Board approval is highly desirable:

a. Leases of endowment farms owned by the University to tenants, where the terms and the rental to be paid by the tenants conform to those prevailing in the area, and which in each case are recommended by the Dean of the College of Agriculture.

b. Leases of property by the University when such property is needed for University work and where the annual rental to be paid does not exceed \$2,500, provided funds are available to pay the rental.

Accordingly, the Legal Counsel and the Comptroller recommend that Section 52(d)II of the present University of Illinois Statutes be amended to

read (new language is in italics):

Minor contracts and those involving the purchase of ordinary supplies, advertising and publicity matters, and other routine matters in the ordinary operation of University affairs, including leases of farms owned by the University and leases for property needed for projects for which funds are available, shall be signed by the Secretary of the Board of Trustees and by the Comptroller of the University, to whom authority is hereby delegated by the Board for such purposes provided that no such lease to the University shall create any liability for rent in excess of \$2,500 per year and provided further that funds are then available for the rent to be paid thereunder.

To make this amended provision operative, it will also be necessary to amend Article III, Section 4, of the By-Laws of the Board to read (new lan-

guage is in italics):

A record vote of the Board shall be had on all propositions for the appropriation of the funds of the University or to create any liability, or on the sale, purchase, or leasing of real estate except where such authority is specifically delegated to University administrative officers in the Statutes of the University or any amendment or revision of the Statutes of the University or By-Laws of the Board, and on the demand of any member of the Board made before the announcement of a vote otherwise taken.

On motion of Mr. Johnston, the amendments of the Statutes and of the By-Laws of the Board, as recommended, were adopted. This action was taken by the following vote: Aye, Mr. Herrick, Mrs. Holt, Mr. Johnston, Mr. Livingston, Mr. Megran, Mrs. Watkins; no, Mr. Nickell; absent, Mr. Bissell, Mr. Grange, Mr. Hickman, Mr. Stratton.

#### LEVIS LOAN FUND

(23) Mr. William E. Levis of the Class of 1913, donor of the William E. Levis Student Loan Fund, has indicated his desire to alter the regulations governing the fund, which were a part of the deed of gift, in such manner as to make the fund as useful as possible and to conform more nearly with general student loan regulations. He has authorized the following changes:

Interest: Notes will bear interest at four per cent per annum from graduation or leaving school to date of maturity and six per cent thereafter until prin-

cipal is paid.

Period of Loan: Notes are payable in graduated monthly installments, beginning four months after graduation or withdrawal from the University. The total amount borrowed must be repaid by no later than four years following graduation or date of withdrawal.

The Comptroller recommends acceptance of these revisions and I concur.

On motion of Mr. Herrick, these revisions were approved.

#### PROPOSED AFFILIATION WITH CHICAGO MEMORIAL HOSPITAL

(24) For over a year there have been discussions between representatives of the Chicago Memorial Hospital and the University of Illinois with respect to the proposed removal of Memorial Hospital to the Medical Center in order to continue its functions as a private hospital in affiliation with the University. The discussions have been chiefly between Mr. Vernon Loucks, Chairman of the Board (now succeeded by Mr. William H. Mitchell), Dr. Paul C. Bucy and Dr. John V. Prohaska, representing Memorial Hospital, and Dr. Ivy, Dr. Harvey, the Provost, and myself, representing the University. On January 16, 1953, the Memorial Hospital formalized its position as follows:

1953, the Memorial Hospital formalized its position as follows:

RESOLVED that the Board of Trustees of The Chicago Memorial Hospital is interested in moving its location to a site in the Medical Center, Chicago, Illinois, to be designated by the University of Illinois, and desirous of exploring with President George D. Stoddard of the University of Illinois the financing of such a move and working out the details of an operating arrangement between the University of Illinois and The Chicago Memorial Hospital, and that President George D. Stoddard be so advised.

Accordingly, we have been exploring the desirability of such a move and especially the matter of cost and the possible sources of funds.

From the standpoint of the University this would be a desirable development for the following reasons: (1) it would increase the effectiveness of the faculty of the University of Illinois by saving time and energy in their partime private practice; (2) it would increase the number of patients available for study and teaching, and it would broaden the teaching program; (3) it would assist in the program of nursing education.

The proposal, in brief, calls for a 300-bed hospital, together with a building which would provide 50 offices and 92 examination rooms. The proposal is outlined in some detail in the attached brochure<sup>1</sup> which was prepared by Mr. Todd Wheeler in collaboration with the staff of the Chicago Memorial Hospital and the University of Illinois. It will be noted that the estimated cost of the project \$6,000,000 and that the resources in sight total \$3,000,000. It is, therefore, necessary to find the sum of \$3,000,000 in order to launch this project. Subject to the approval of the Board of Trustees of the University of Illinois, we have offered to assist the Chicago Memorial Hospital in this fund raising.

I believe that a mutually advantageous plan of affiliation could be worked out between the Memorial Hospital and the University and that the project would be extremely helpful to the morale and efficiency of our medical staff. I recommend, therefore, that the Board of Trustees endorse in principle the proposed removal of the Chicago Memorial Hospital to a site in the Medical Center, together with some form of affiliation to be agreed upon by the respective boards, and that the staff of the University be authorized to assist the Chicago Memorial Hospital in securing the necessary funds from private sources, all with the understanding that there will be no obligations in tax support.

On motion of Mr. Johnston, this proposal was endorsed in principle, subject to an approving opinion from the Legal Counsel on the legality of the affiliation.

#### PATENTABLE DISCOVERIES

(25) The University Patent Committee submits the following recommendations relating to potentially patentable discoveries:

Harold R. Snyder, Professor of Chemistry, has developed a process for making acetyltryptophan, one of the amino acids. This is a new method of

synthesis but is an expensive process and could not compete commercially with other methods now used. Accordingly, the Head of the Department of Chemistry and Chemical Engineering, the University Patent Committee, and the University Research Board recommend that this discovery be released to the inventor.

E. I. Radzimovsky, Research Associate in Mechanical Engineering, has invented an equalizing reducer, a mechanical device for installation in various types of conveyors, which operate on sprockets, to provide a more uniform velocity. In some types of such conveyors, there is a rhythmic variation in the velocity due to a difference between the momentum of the conveyor and the speed of the sprocket at the points of contact. The equalizing reducer will eliminate this jerking motion of the conveyor. The Patent Committee is of the opinion that the University's rights to the discovery are very limited because Mr. Radzimovsky did so much of the work on his own time and made very little use of University facilities. However, to facilitate securing a patent, the Committee recommends that any rights the University may have be assigned to the University of Illinois Foundation with the suggestion that if a patent is secured and is commercially exploited a liberal share of the royalties be granted the inventor. The Head of the Department of Mechanical Engineering concurs in the judgment of the Committee, and its recommendation is acceptable to the inventor.

Fred A. Kummerow, Assistant Professor in the Department of Food Technology, and Szu Shiang Chang, Research Associate in Food Technology, have developed what they call the depolymerization of oxidative dimers and trimers, which has to do with the chemistry of soybean oil. This discovery has already been disclosed in a thesis, and it is, therefore, unlikely that a patent can be secured. The Committee recommends that the discovery be released to the inventors for dedication to the public by publication and they agree to this.

I concur in the above recommendations.

On motion of Mr. Johnston, these recommendations were approved.

#### RESPIRATOR CENTER AT CHICAGO PROFESSIONAL COLLEGES

(26) At its January, 1953, meeting, the Board of Trustees authorized the establishment of a respirator center for poliomyelitis patients at the Chicago Professional Colleges with funds to be paid the University by the National Foundation for Infantile Paralysis and authorized the execution of an agreement with that Foundation.

The National Foundation for Infantile Paralysis has requested that its Chicago Chapter be made a party to the proposed agreement, with the understanding that grants of \$12,500 and \$13,500 to be paid the University for certain structural alterations needed for the center and for the purchase and maintenance of required special equipment shall be made by that Chapter instead of by the National Foundation.

The Comptroller and the Legal Counsel recommend that these changes in the proposed agreement be authorized.

I concur.

On motion of Mrs. Watkins, the above changes in the proposed agreement were authorized.

## REPORT OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

The Secretary of the Board presented the following report of actions taken by the Executive Committee:

## Appointment of B. L. Dodds as Dean of the College of Education

On June 3, 1953, the Executive Committee approved the following recommendation from the President of the University:

I recommend the appointment of Dr. B. L. Dodds, now Director of the Division of Education and Applied Psychology at Purdue University, as Dean of the College of Education beginning November 1, 1953, and continuing to September 1, 1955, and as Professor of Education on indefinite tenure, at a salary of \$14,000 per year on "Y" basis. The appointment as dean on limited tenure is in conformity with the standard statutory provision that the dean of

a college shall be appointed biennially except that in this case the appointment will become effective November I instead of September I, 1953, since Dr. Dodds will not be available until the later date. In making this nomination I have had the advice and unanimous recommendation of the Executive Committee of the College of Education.

Since this is a major appointment, the Secretary of the Board reported the Committee's action to the other trustees requesting that they advise him if they had any objection to this procedure before the appointment was announced.

### Oil and Gas Lease on Former Agricultural Experiment Farm in Olney, Illinois

A proposal from the Calvert Drilling Company, Inc., of Olney, Illinois, for an oil and gas lease on a former Agricultural Experiment Station fruit farm in Richland County, which the University sold but in which the University has retained one-half the mineral rights, was presented to the Board of Trustees on April 20, 1953, and was referred to the Executive Committee with power to act.

On instruction from the Committee, the Comptroller negotiated with the Calvert Drilling Company, Inc., for better terms than it had previously offered which included one-sixteenth (i.e., one-half of the standard one-eighth specified in such leases) of any oil or gas produced plus \$1.00 per acre rental to be paid in the event the Company wishes to continue the lease in the second year in the absence of successful drilling. After considerable discussion the Company indicated willingness to make a lease bonus of \$1.00 per acre (the University to receive one-half of this amount since it has one-half interest in the lease) rather than payment of \$1.00 per acre delayed rental. This will assure the collection by the University of \$38.50 for a lease for a primary term of two years in addition to any royalties that may accrue as a result of successful

The Committee has authorized execution of a lease on the basis of these revised terms.

## **GRANT FOR TELEVISION FACILITIES**

(See page 674)

The Fund for Adult Education of the Ford Foundation has offered the University \$100,000 to aid in the construction of the station. The principal conditions of this grant are:

- 1. That, within ninety days after an agreement with the Fund for Adult Education has been executed, the University file an application with the Federal Communications Commission for permission to construct such a station. (This has been done.)
- 2. That after receiving a permit the University will proceed "with reasonable expedition" to construct an educational television station and to operate it for at least eight years; provided that if the University fails to do so, it shall turn over to the donor the equipment purchased under the grant and the unexpended balance of the grant.
- 3. That the University provide from other sources a minimum of \$200,000 for building and equipping a television station. (Through the assignment of funds already made by the Board of Trustees for the purchase of equipment, and through the acceptance of a gift from the General Electric Company of a television transmitter, valued at \$90,000, this condition has been met.)
- 4. That the University show evidence of resources available to operate a television station for at least two consecutive years after its construction. (This will be a matter of budgetary allocation.)
- 5. That the grant be expended only for the purchase of equipment including approximately \$30,000 for television recording equipment and related facilities.
- 6. That the University participate in the Educational Television and Radio Center.

In accordance with the authorization of the Board of Trustees at its meeting on April 20, 1953 (Minutes, page 610), the Comptroller and Secretary of the Board have executed an agreement with the Fund for Adult Education covering this grant.

### JULY MEETING
