

MEETING OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES
OF THE
UNIVERSITY OF ILLINOIS

June 15, 1966



The June meeting of The Board of Trustees of the University of Illinois was held in the Illini Union South, Urbana, Illinois, on Wednesday, June 15, 1966, beginning at 10:30 a.m.

President Howard W. Clement called the meeting to order and asked the Secretary to call the roll. The following members of the Board were present: Mr. Howard W. MINUTES APPROVED

The Secretary presented the minutes of the meeting of the Board of Trustees on November 18, 1965, press proof copies of which have previously been sent to the Board.

On motion of Mrs. Watkins, these minutes were approved as printed on pages 903 to 924, inclusive.

BUSINESS PRESENTED BY THE PRESIDENT OF THE UNIVERSITY
The Board took up consideration of the following reports and recommendations from the President of the University.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

President Henry presented a report on selected topics of current interest, copies of which were distributed at the meeting, and a copy was filed with the Secretary of the Board.

ANNUAL OPERATING BUDGET FOR 1966-67

(1) The budget for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1966, for academic and administrative appointments beginning September 1, 1966, and for appointments to the nonacademic personnel staff beginning July 1, 1966, is submitted herewith.

The budget has been prepared by the Executive Vice-President and Provost and the Vice-President and Comptroller, based upon recommendations of the deans, directors, and other administrative officers, and in consultation with the University Budget Committee¹ representing all campuses of the University. The budget policies with respect to assignments of funds for promotions and salary adjustments have also been reviewed with the University Council.

The budget document submitted contains: a condensed analysis, which describes the principal increases in the budget; Schedules A through H, which give the budget totals and major subtotals; and summaries for each college or administrative unit. The budget details are presented in three volumes, one for each campus, containing both the academic and nonacademic appointments. (Volume I, the Urbana-Champaign budget, is in two parts, academic and nonacademic; Volumes II and III are for the Medical Center and Chicago Circle budgets, each including both academic and nonacademic appointments.)

I recommend that this budget, covering the allocation of the estimated operating income from all sources for the year beginning July 1, 1966, and as approved by the Finance Committee, be approved by the Board, and that the President of the University be authorized, in accordance with the needs of the University and the equitable interests involved, and within total income: (a) to accept resignations, (b) to make such additional appointments as are necessary subject to the provisions of the University Statutes and the Policy and Rules Relating to Compensation and Working Conditions of Nonacademic Employees, and (c) to make such changes and adjustments in items included in the budget as are needed, all such changes to be covered in the Vice-President and Comptroller's quarterly financial reports, or in reports to the Board by its Secretary, provided that assignments for new projects or programs and for nonrecurring capital expenditures in excess of \$10,000 shall be presented to the Board for approval.

Copies of the complete budget for all three campuses of the University together with a condensed analysis had been sent to all members of the Board of Trustees for study in advance of today's meeting.

The President of the University formally presented the budget, with supporting presentations by the Executive Vice-President and

Provost and the Vice-President and Comptroller, and explained several recommendations as outlined in the condensed analysis and the classifications of expenditures. A copy of the condensed analysis is filed with the Secretary of the Board for record.

Mr. Williamson, Chairman of the Finance Committee, reported that the Committee had reviewed the budget on Tuesday, June 14, in consultation with the President of the University and other central administration officials. In addition to members of the Finance Committee (Mr. Williamson, Mr. Swain, and Mr. Jones), Mr. Dilliard, Mr. Hughes, and Mrs. Watkins participated in the work session. Mr. Williamson stated that the Finance Committee recommends approval of the budget.

Following the presentations of reports and discussions by members of the Board, on motion of Mr. Williamson, the budget was approved; authority was given as requested in the President's recommendations; and the appropriations required were made by the following vote: Aye, Mr. Clement, Mr. Dilliard, Mr. Hughes, Mr. Johnston, Mr. Pogue, Mr. Swain, Mrs. Watkins, Mr. Williamson; no none; absent, Mr. Jones, Governor Kerner, Mr. Page.

The complete budget is printed separately as a supplement to these minutes.

BUDGET OF THE ATHLETIC ASSOCIATION FOR 1966-67

(2) The Director of Intercollegiate Athletics submits, on behalf of the Board of Directors of the Athletic Association, the budget for the Association for 1966-67 which is summarized as follows with comparative figures for the preceding year:

The budget has been examined and approved by the Executive Vice-President and Provost and the Vice-President and Comptroller.

I recommend that this budget be approved and that the President of the University be authorized to make such changes and adjustments, including approval of new appointments and acceptances of resignations, as are necessary and recommended by the Board of Directors of the Athletic Association within the total income realized.

A copy of the budget is being filed with the Secretary of the Board for record.

On motion of Mr. Swain, this budget was approved.

AWARD OF CERTIFIED PUBLIC ACCOUNTANT CERTIFICATES

(3) The Committee on Accountancy recommends that the certificate of Certified Public Accountant be awarded, under Section 5 of the Accountancy Act of 1943, as amended, to the following candidates who have presented evidence that they are holders of valid and unrevoked Certified Public Accountant certificates obtained by passing a standard written examination in another state or territory of the United States and who qualify in all other respects under this provision of the law:

ADDITIONAL APPOINTMENTS TO CENTER FOR ADVANCED STUDY

(4) With the concurrence of the Members of the Center for Advanced Study, the Dean of the Graduate College recommends the appointment of three additional members, effective September 1, 1966.

The heads of the departments concerned, the Dean of the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences, and the Executive Vice-President and Provost have also been consulted and concur. In addition, the Dean of the Graduate College asked authorities outside of the University to appraise the scholarly achievements of the nominees and the comments received attest to their stature in the academic community.

Brief statements in support of the nominees with a few of the more relevant comments received from outside of the University are submitted for inclusion in the record and are filed with the Secretary.

I recommend approval.

On motion of Mr. Hughes, these appointments were approved.

**SERVICES OF DR. LOUIS B. HOWARD TO THE NATIONAL
 ASSOCIATION OF STATE UNIVERSITIES
 AND LAND-GRANT COLLEGES**

(5) The National Association of State Universities and Land-Grant Colleges has requested the services of Dr. Louis B. Howard, Professor of Food Science and former Dean of the College of Agriculture, Director of the Agricultural Experiment Station, and Director of the Cooperative Extension Service in Agriculture and Home Economics, as Director of the Association's International Rural Development Office in Washington, D.C., during the academic year, beginning in September, 1966.

The Association will reimburse the University for the full amount of Professor Howard's salary plus 10 per cent of the salary to cover the cost of all employee benefits, including the University's contribution to the State Universities Retirement System of Illinois.

On recommendation of the University officers concerned, I have approved the release of Professor Howard for this service and report my action for record.

On motion of Mr. Hughes, the action of the President was confirmed.

SABBATICAL LEAVE OF ABSENCE, 1966-67

(6) With the approval of the University Research Board and concurrence of the Executive Vice-President and Provost, I recommend that Paul A. Beck, Professor of Physical Metallurgy, be granted sabbatical leave of absence for the second semester of the academic year 1966-67 on full pay for study at the University of Chicago on newer developments in the electron band theory of metals by interaction.

On motion of Mr. Williamson, this leave was granted as recommended.

**INVITATION TO PRESIDENT TO PARTICIPATE IN MEETINGS WITH
 VICE-CHANCELLORS OF BRITISH UNIVERSITIES IN JULY, 1966**

(7) I request the Board of Trustees to authorize my participation in an educational mission to Great Britain in July, 1966, to meet with Vice-Chancellors of British

Universities. The invitation has been presented through the Association of American Universities, and the presidents of twelve member institutions of that Association will constitute the delegation.

The members of the delegation will have unusual opportunity to study British higher education and to bring back to their own institutions comparative information and insights from the experience.

The trip will involve no travel expense to the University of Illinois.

On motion of Mr. Williamson, the President's request was approved.

UNIVERSITY CHANCELLORS

(8) In accordance with the provisions of Section 2 of the University of Illinois Statutes, I recommend the establishment of an administrative position to be designated Chancellor of the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign.

The Chancellor, under the direction of the President, will serve as the chief executive officer for the campus. The Chancellor will perform such duties as may be delegated and assigned to him by the President and as may be consistent with the Statutes of the University and the actions of the Board of Trustees.

The Chancellor will be appointed biennially by the Board of Trustees on nomination of the President, in a manner consistent with University Statutes governing the appointment of deans, directors, and other administrative officers. In the appointment of a new Chancellor, the President shall have the advice of a committee selected by the Senate.

I also recommend the following changes in titles of two present administrative officers: (1) Vice-President of the University of Illinois at the Medical Center to Chancellor of the University of Illinois at the Medical Center (Dr. Joseph S. Begando), and (2) Vice-President of the University of Illinois at Chicago Circle to Chancellor of the University of Illinois at Chicago Circle (Dr. Norman A. Parker).

These changes in titles shall become effective September 1, 1966.

President Henry also submitted a statement, which appears below, in support of his actions.

On motion of Mr. Pogue, these recommendations were approved, and the supporting statement was accepted.

The recommendation which I have presented to the Board of Trustees for the establishment of a new administrative position, to be known as Chancellor of the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign, and for changing the title of the executive head at each Chicago campus from Vice-President to Chancellor, has a background of study and consideration by the administrative officers of the University over a period of several years.

The changes recommended are a first step in planning for a clearer definition of the role of the general administrative offices in the administration of the University and of the specific duties to be delegated to campus administration.

For the present, the Chancellor of the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign will have the general role described in the Statutes for the Vice-President in charge of the Medical Center. This statutory provision has also been the reference for the establishment of the Vice-Presidency at Chicago Circle.

I expect that additional guidelines for administrative operations will be delineated as the general study of administrative organization proceeds.

Meanwhile, the new position at the Urbana-Champaign campus will bring the incumbent in that office into consultation in the further administrative reorganization. There will also be certain immediate benefits in campus administration. The changes in titles of the Vice-Presidents at the Chicago campuses will also have a number of immediate benefits.

The general setting for administrative reorganization is the greatly increased volume of administrative business of the University as it has grown in size, scope, and function. Further, the campuses in Chicago have developed from branch status into units which should have a fuller measure of operational autonomy. More decision-making at the campus level is required to expedite the increased volume of business. Improved communication between the general offices and the campuses should result from the changes proposed.

At Urbana-Champaign, as in Chicago, there should be available to faculty and students, as well as to the public, a chief executive officer identified intimately with the administrative business of the campus and whose title reflects this responsibility. This is important in student affairs, in faculty relationships, and in public relations. The general officers of the University can not adequately fulfill the responsibility for campus administration and at the same time carry out the broader responsibilities which now fall to the President and his colleagues in central administration.

Furthermore, the welfare of the University requires that the present general administrative officers give even more time and attention to the affairs of the University other than internal campus administration, although it is expected that they will continue to share in certain campus administrative responsibilities.

The new demands on the officers with University-wide responsibilities arise from the following conditions:

1. Increased relationships with the federal government, including all of the executive departments and many commissions and offices;
2. The recently established relationships with the Board of Higher Education;
3. The newly established relationships with the Illinois Building Authority;
4. Expanding relationships with state commissions and departments in arranging for professional service from the University of Illinois and with the offices of state government;
5. Widening relationships with new regional and national bodies, such as the Committee on Institutional Cooperation, the National Compact for Education, and national professional organizations;
6. Increased complexity of policy formulation for the review of the Board of Trustees;
7. The new demands for coordination among the three campuses and for inter-campus administration;
8. New needs for development of resources from gifts and grants;
9. New responsibilities for public interpretation of the University as a whole;
10. New responsibilities for cooperation in state-wide planning of higher education;
11. New responsibilities for coordination of intercampus planning, both for program and physical facilities.

It is expected that the changes in administrative relationships to be established will involve extensive consultation both with staff members immediately concerned with the activities under review and with committees and boards working in these areas.

The recommendation for the establishment of the office of Chancellor of the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign comes to the Board of Trustees with the endorsement of the Urbana-Champaign Senate, the deans and directors at the Urbana-Champaign campus, and the Consultative Committee of the University Council.

The changes in titles at the Chicago campuses have been reviewed with the administrative officers and have been reported to the Senates at those campuses.

APPOINTMENT OF DEAN OF STUDENTS

(9) As earlier announced, Dr. Fred H. Turner, Dean of Students, has accepted an administrative assignment as Chairman of the University Centennial Committee with the understanding that with the beginning of the school year 1966-67 he would devote full time to the planning and direction of Centennial events. I now recommend that this assignment be formalized by Dr. Turner's appointment as Director of the Centennial and that he be released from his administrative responsibilities as Dean of Students effective September 1, 1966. He will hold the title of University Dean of Students until September 1, 1968 (when he will retire from active service), with such duties as may be assigned to him by the President, but excluding the administrative supervision of extracurricular activities and affairs of undergraduate students as defined in the sections of the University Statutes and General Rules Concerning University Organization and Procedure specifying the duties of the Dean of Students.

I also recommend the appointment of Dr. Stanton Millet, presently Associate Professor of English and Associate Dean of the Graduate College, as Dean of Students for the Urbana-Champaign Campus, beginning September 1, 1966, at an annual salary rate of \$20,000 on a twelve months' service basis.

Dr. Millet's appointment has been endorsed by a Consultative Committee¹ appointed by the President to advise on this subject. The Executive Vice-President and Provost and other officers in the central administration who have been consulted concur.

Dr. Millet will continue to hold the rank of Associate Professor of English, on indefinite tenure. The initial appointment as Dean of Students is for one year and thereafter the appointment will be on a biennial basis in accordance with statutory provision for continuing administrative appointment.

It is my view and that of the Consultative Committee and of others consulted that Professor Millet fully meets the criteria as set forth by the Committee and approved by the President. They are:

1. The person chosen should hold an earned doctorate, or have other qualifications which entitle him to unquestioned respect from members of the academic community.
2. He should have experience in administration. Further he should have experience in the student personnel field, or equivalent knowledge of student affairs and the administrative problems involved in working with students on a large and complex campus.
3. He must not only have respect of the faculty for himself as a person, but also he must have the ability to improve relationships between his office and the college offices. It is vital that those who counsel students in the Dean of Students' offices, in the residence halls, and in the Student Counseling Service coordinate their programs with advisory activities of Assistant Deans and faculty members in the colleges.
4. He should provide educational leadership by anticipating problems and focusing faculty-student discussion on problems requiring examination.
5. He must have the kinds of personal qualities that make him approachable and attractive. He must be able to establish rapport with students and understand the outlook of young people; he must maintain dialogue with them. He must not be rigid, arbitrary, or authoritarian, but he must have the ability to persist in working for his convictions even while "under fire" and in the face of criticism.

On motion of Mr. Johnston, this appointment was approved.

HEADSHIP OF DEPARTMENT OF GEOGRAPHY

(10) The Dean of the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences recommends the appointment of Associate Professor John Thompson of the Department of Geography and Director of the Center for Latin-American Studies as Head of the Department of Geography effective September 1, 1966, at an annual salary of \$14,500 on an academic year service basis.

This appointment is unanimously recommended by a special search committee,² and is supported by the Executive Committee of the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences, the Dean of the Graduate College, and the Executive Vice-President and Provost.

Professor Thompson will continue as Director of the Center for Latin-American Studies until such time as a suitable replacement can be appointed.

On motion of Mr. Johnston, this appointment was approved.

CHAIRMANSHIP OF DEPARTMENT OF ARCHITECTURE

(11) The Dean of the College of Fine and Applied Arts recommends the appointment of Professor Jack H. Swing of the Department of Architecture as Chairman of the Department for one year from September 1, 1966, at an annual salary rate of \$17,000 on an academic year service basis.

This appointment is to fill the vacancy created by the retirement of Professor Granville S. Keith at the end of the current academic year. Professor Swing was nominated by a search committee,¹ and his appointment is endorsed by the Executive Committee of the Department of Architecture, the Dean of the Graduate College, and the Executive Vice-President and Provost.

I recommend approval.

On motion of Mr. Swain, this appointment was approved.

HEADSHIP OF DEPARTMENT OF ORTHODONTICS

(12) The Dean of the College of Dentistry and the Vice-President at the Medical Center recommend the appointment of Dr. Earl W. Renfro, of the College of Dentistry faculty, as Professor of Orthodontics on indefinite tenure and Head of the Department beginning September 1, 1966, at an annual salary of \$19,000 on a twelve months' service basis.

This appointment is to fill the vacancy which will occur when Dr. Allan G. Brodie, present Head of the Department, retires from active service at the end of the current academic year. Dr. Renfro was nominated by a search committee² and his appointment is supported by the Dean of the Graduate College and the Executive Vice-President and Provost.

I recommend approval.

On motion of Mr. Dilliard, this appointment was approved.

Mr. Dilliard stated that he made this motion in the absence of Mr. Jones who had informed the Secretary that he desired to have his support of the appointment recorded.

PROFESSIONAL EMPLOYEES IN THE COLLEGE OF EDUCATION

(13) The Dean of the College of Education has proposed establishment of four levels of a new class of professional (academic) employees. With the concurrence of the Dean of the Graduate College, the Executive Vice-President and Provost has approved the proposal, and it is recommended that the following ranks and minimum salaries be authorized:

On motion of Mr. Johnston, this recommendation was approved.

APPOINTMENTS TO THE FACULTY

(14) The following new appointments to the faculty of the rank of Assistant Professor and above, and involving tenure, have been approved since the previous meeting of the Board of Trustees.

Positions in the University are classified in the following categories and are designated in the budget by the symbols indicated: A—indefinite tenure; B—two years; D—one year; E—nine months from the beginning of the academic

TEACHER EDUCATION MINOR IN COACHING

(15) Each year thousands of high school teachers in the United States receive appointments as head coaches or assistant coaches of various athletic teams, but do not have training in physical education. Commonly, the need for coaches exceeds the number of physical educators in a particular school. As high school athletic programs broaden in scope, school administrators are forced to look outside the field of physical education in hiring coaches. The University can be of assistance by preparing future teachers in other academic areas for their collateral duties as coaches.

Therefore, the Urbana-Champaign Senate recommends that the following coaching minor for nonphysical education majors in teacher education curricula be established effective September 1, 1966.

The University and the Urbana-Champaign Councils on Teacher Education and the faculty of the College of Physical Education concur in this recommendation. The Senate Coordinating Council indicates that no other Senate jurisdiction is involved.

CURRICULUM PREPARATORY TO THE TEACHING OF CHEMISTRY

(16) The Urbana-Champaign Senate, the University and Urbana-Champaign Councils on Teacher Education, the Graduate College, and the Faculty of the Col-

lege of Liberal Arts and Sciences recommend revisions, to become effective as soon as they can be implemented, in the existing curriculum preparatory to the teaching of chemistry leading to the degrees of Bachelor of Science in the Teaching of Chemistry, Master of Science in the Teaching of Chemistry, and Master of Science in the Teaching of Physical Sciences.

The present curriculum does not fully provide for students with unusual backgrounds or sufficient challenge for the increasing numbers of students with superior ability who are coming to the University.

The revisions proposed are designed to provide the students with a flexible program of chemistry courses, while insuring that the minimal program chosen provides a sound training in chemistry. Students with unusual backgrounds or superior ability can select from a number of advanced level courses in making up their programs of chemistry courses. Since it is no longer feasible to require that students in the teaching of chemistry also acquire an adequate teaching competence in both mathematics and physics, a minor in either mathematics or physics is required in this curriculum. The University and College of Liberal Arts and Sciences requirements in humanities, social sciences, and foreign language are met within the context of the proposed curriculum. Almost all of the education course work is given in one semester.

Submitted herewith is a statement which was presented to the Urbana-Champaign Senate describing in detail the proposed curriculum, a copy of which is being filed with the Secretary of the Board. The Senate Coordinating Council has indicated that no other Senate jurisdiction is involved.

I concur.

NATIONAL INSTITUTE FOR THE DEAF

(17) Last year the Congress passed the National Technical Institute for the Deaf Act of 1965 (Public Law 89-36), which provides for the establishment and operation of a coeducational, residential facility for post-secondary technical training and education for persons who are deaf.

In signing the Act on June 8, 1965, President Johnson made the following statement:

This institution will help meet the needs of hundreds of deaf young people, both students and adults, who want to be and can be trained for various technical operations and placed in very useful careers. Deafness is not and need not be regarded as the handicap that men thought it was in the past. Given the opportunity to learn and to prepare themselves, the deaf can fill a wide array of useful and important positions in industry and professions throughout our society.

The enabling Act authorizes the Secretary of the Department of Health, Education, and Welfare to enter into an agreement with an institution of higher education to establish and operate the new national Institute. The law requires that such an institution of higher education be one empowered to grant bachelor's degrees and one with professional or graduate schools. The Department of Health, Education, and Welfare has emphasized that the Institute, which is a unique facility for a unique type of student, "should be affiliated with a major university for the administration of its programs" to take advantage of the supporting scientific, professional, and management services needed to insure its success. The preferred location is a large metropolitan area.

Under the terms of the Act, the new Institute will be entirely supported by federal funds, including the full costs of its construction and its annual operation.

Some months ago, at the invitation of Governor Kerner and other interested state officers, the University of Illinois considered the desirability of making application to the Department of Health, Education, and Welfare to serve as the establishing and operating institution for the National Technical Institute for the Deaf. An all-University committee,¹ composed of specialists in areas of education

related to the deaf and to technical education, recommended that the University make such application, and developed a proposal for the establishment of the Institute. The University's application was submitted to the Department of Health, Education, and Welfare on May 31, 1966.

The University has proposed that the Institute be located in Chicago, in an area adjacent to the Chicago Circle Campus. With its extensive and highly diversified industrial and technical resources, its centralized location, and its national transportation system, Chicago is thought to be an ideal location. The comprehensive educational and research resources of the University of Illinois, at the campuses in Chicago and at Urbana-Champaign, including its programs of training and research in the education and rehabilitation of the deaf and in vocational and technical education, support the University's qualifications to serve as the establishing and operating institution.

The University's interest in undertaking the responsibility is based upon the following considerations: (1) a strong conviction at all levels that the institution should respond to a social need of significant proportions where the resources of the University can make an important contribution; (2) agreement with the Department of Health, Education, and Welfare that an Institute of the type envisioned should be affiliated with a major university for the administration of its programs; and (3) a belief that considerable benefit to the University may be expected in the strengthening and broadening of research and training programs related to the deaf now operated by the University. At present five major academic units are heavily involved in such activity. As a new element of the University system, the Institute would permit the further development of this work and give additional national emphasis to it. It appears clear that the benefits envisaged for the University will also be reflected in the quality and significance of the operation of the Institute.

It is understood that representatives of the Department of Health, Education, and Welfare will confer with applying universities throughout the summer and that a selection of one institution to operate the Institute will be made in the fall. When this determination is made, the university selected and the Department of Health, Education, and Welfare will negotiate an agreement.

I recommend that the University's application to serve as the establishing and operating institution for the National Technical Institute for the Deaf be confirmed and, if the University of Illinois application is approved, authorization granted to negotiate an agreement with the Department of Health, Education, and Welfare—such authorization subject to further approval by the Board of Higher Education.

On motion of Mr. Swain, the actions taken by University officials in this matter were confirmed.

CONTRACT FOR EXPANSION OF ELECTRICAL DISTRIBUTION SYSTEM

On motion of Mr. Hughes, this contract was awarded, as recommended, by the following vote: Aye, Mr. Clement, Mr. Dilliard, Mr. Hughes, Mr. Johnston, Mr. Pogue, Mr. Swain, Mrs. Watkins, Mr. Williamson; no, none; absent, Mr. Jones, Governor Kerner, Mr. Page.

REQUEST TO ILLINOIS BUILDING AUTHORITY TO CONTRACT FOR THE GENERAL WORK FOR THE UTILITIES CENTER ADDITION PHASE II — CHICAGO CIRCLE

(25) The Illinois Building Authority has received bids on the general work for the Utilities Center Addition — Phase II at Chicago Circle. The lowest bidder is E. H. Marhofer, Jr., Co., 2424 North 25th Avenue, Franklin Park, with a base bid and recommended alternates of \$300,750. Three other bids were received:

The lowest bidder is deemed fully qualified and has performed satisfactorily under contract with the University in the past.

The project is a part of Phase II construction which the Board of Trustees, acting through its Executive Committee on September 2, 1965, requested the Illinois Building Authority to provide. The Authority will finance the construction and lease the facilities to the University. State appropriations are available for payment of the rentals for projects financed and constructed by the Authority. The University will transfer jurisdiction of the land on which the project will be constructed to the Authority.

The Director of the Physical Plant and the Vice-President and Comptroller recommend that the Board request the Illinois Building Authority to award a contract for the described work to the lowest bidder, and proceed to procure this facility for the University.

I concur and recommend the adoption of the following resolution.

Resolution

Be It, and It Hereby Is, Resolved by The Board of Trustees of the University of Illinois, a public corporation of the State of Illinois, that Illinois Building Authority be, and it hereby is, requested to award to E. H. Marhoefer, Jr., Co., 2424 North 25th Avenue, Franklin Park, Illinois, a contract for the general work for the construction of the Utilities Center Addition at Chicago Circle, Phase II, for the fixed price of \$300,750.

Be It, and It Hereby Is, Further Resolved by The Board of Trustees of the University of Illinois, a public corporation of the State of Illinois, that the Comptroller and Secretary of this public corporation be, and they hereby are, authorized to make, execute, acknowledge and deliver, in the name and in behalf of this corporation, such instruments of transfer, conveyance, lease, contract, and other documents as are necessary or appropriate in order to provide for the carrying out of the foregoing project and facility by the Illinois Building Authority.

On motion of Mr. Swain, the recommendation was approved, and the foregoing resolution was adopted by the following vote: Aye, Mr. Clement, Mr. Dilliard, Mr. Hughes, Mr. Johnston, Mr. Pogue, Mr. Swain, Mrs. Watkins, Mr. Williamson; no, none; absent, Mr. Jones, Governor Kerner, Mr. Page.

AGREEMENT WITH CITY OF URBANA FOR STREET LIGHTING IMPROVEMENTS

(26) The Director of the Physical Plant and the Vice-President and Comptroller recommend that the Board authorize its Comptroller and the Secretary to execute an agreement with the City of Urbana to start in the cost of improving the street lighting system on Mathews Avenue from Springfield Avenue south to Smith Memorial Hall and on Oregon Street from Mathews Avenue to Goodwin Avenue. The total cost of the project is estimated at \$33,200 and based on the ratio of University-owned property frontage to total property frontage, the University's share of the cost will be approximately \$26,900.

Funds are available in state capital appropriations to the University for 1965-67 and have been released.

I concur.

On motion of Mr. Johnston, this agreement was authorized by the following vote: Aye, Mr. Clement, Mr. Dilliard, Mr. Hughes, Mr. Johnston, Mr. Pogue, Mr. Swain, Mrs. Watkins, Mr. Williamson; no, none; absent, Mr. Jones, Governor Kerner, Mr. Page.

ADDITION TO CONTRACT FOR CONSTRUCTION OF EAST CHEMISTRY BUILDING ADDITION

(27) The Director of the Physical Plant and the Vice-President and Comptroller recommend an increase of \$13,772.11 in the contract with Kuhne-Simmons Co.,

Inc., Champaign, for construction of the East Chemistry Building Addition for furnishing and installing 570 fine control nitrogen gas valves in lieu of those specified.

Funds are available in the construction budget.

I concur.

On motion of Mr. Williamson, this change in contract was authorized.

REJECTION OF PLUMBING BIDS FOR CONSTRUCTION OF PHASE I KRANNERT CENTER FOR THE PERFORMING ARTS

(28) The Director of the Physical Plant and the Vice-President and Comptroller have reported the receipt of the following four bids for plumbing work for Phase I construction of the Krannert Center for the Performing Arts:

The lowest bidder, Healy Plumbing & Heating Co., subsequently withdrew its bid due to errors in the original bid and requested the return of the \$6,000 bid deposit. After investigation, this request has been denied and the bid deposit retained by the University to cover costs incurred by the University. The remaining bids were then rejected on recommendation of the Director of the Physical Plant and the Vice-President and Comptroller.

This report is for the record.

On motion of Mr. Johnston, the rejection of the bid was confirmed.

EMPLOYMENT OF ARCHITECTS FOR CHICAGO CIRCLE CAMPUS

(29) The Director of the Physical Plant and the Vice-President and Comptroller recommend the employment of Skidmore, Owings & Merrill for architectural services for the Science and Engineering Laboratory, a part of the Phase III project at the Chicago Circle Campus, at a fee of 6 per cent of the actual construction costs.

The firm will be authorized to undertake building design studies for the total project and to proceed with working drawings and specifications to the extent that funds are available in 1965-67 state capital appropriations to the University.

The Committee on Buildings and Grounds and the Advisory Committee on the Selection of Architects and Engineers have been consulted and support this recommendation, which will give priority to this project over the Student Services Administration Building and will supersede the May 19, 1966, Board action on the latter project.

I concur.

On motion of Mr. Swain, this recommendation was approved.

EMPLOYMENT OF ENGINEERS FOR SERVICES FOR MEDICAL CENTER CAMPUS

(30) The Director of the Physical Plant and the Vice-President and Comptroller recommend the employment of Howell-Stiggleman Company, Chicago, for complete engineering services for design of air conditioning installations in the Manufacturing Pharmacy area of the East Dentistry-Medicine-Pharmacy Building at a fee of actual salaries and wages for the time spent on the project plus 100 per cent for overhead and commission, but not to exceed a total cost of \$5,500.

Funds are available in state capital appropriations to the University for 1965-67 and have been released.

The Advisory Committee on the Selection of Architects and Engineers and the Committee on Buildings and Grounds have been consulted and also recommend this firm.

I concur.

On motion of Mrs. Watkins, this recommendation was approved.

**AMENDMENT OF SECTION IV OF POLICY AND RULES RELATING
TO COMPENSATION AND WORKING CONDITIONS
OF NONACADEMIC EMPLOYEES**

(31) The Director of Nonacademic Personnel recommends that Section IV of the "Policy and Rules Relating to Compensation and Working Conditions of Nonacademic Employees" be amended to provide for a work schedule for the four bus operators in the Division of Rehabilitation-Education Services which will accommodate the needs of the students transported by the Division's buses.

Because of class schedules it is not feasible to schedule the operators on an eight-hour work day or on any of the schedules now listed in Section IV which covers hours of employment and work weeks.

It is recommended that the bus operators be employed on a regular ten-hour schedule for five days of the week with occasional overtime beyond the ten hours; and that compensation be a uniform weekly payment computed on the basis of eight hours daily at straight time and two hours daily at time and one-half for forty weeks of each year. Any occasional additional overtime would be recorded, allowed to accumulate, and offset by compensatory time off at one and one-half times the overtime hours worked. Compensatory time off would be granted during student vacation periods and such other times as feasible. To the extent that compensatory time off is not used up by the end of the work year, the Division would carry the operators beyond the forty weeks to use up the accumulation.

I concur.

On motion of Mr. Swain, this amendment was approved.

NAMES OF FLORIDA AVENUE RESIDENCE HALLS

(32) Upon recommendations initiated by the Housing Division and after securing the advice of the Consultative Committee of the University Council, I recommend that the two Florida Avenue Residence Halls scheduled for completion in September, 1966, be named: women's hall, Leah Fullenwider Trelease Hall, and men's hall, Richard J. Oglesby Hall.

The late Mrs. Trelease, who died on July 12, 1957, had been associated with the University of Illinois since she came here to begin graduate work in 1916. She was a member of the English Department faculty from 1920 until illness forced her to go on leave of absence in 1955. She was one of the University's truly distinguished academic citizens and one of its memorable teachers. From 1945 to 1948, she also served as Dean of Women. In addition to a full-time career as a teacher of English composition and literature, Professor Trelease was author and co-author of English texts and anthologies. She was undoubtedly one of the most popular teachers of her time, and she touched the lives of so many that her influence in undergraduate student life merits a memorial.

Richard J. Oglesby was elected three times as Governor of Illinois, in 1864, 1872, and 1884. (He resigned as Governor in 1873, shortly after his second inauguration, to become United States Senator.) He had practiced law in Sullivan, Illinois, before going into public office. He served under General U. S. Grant in the Civil War and became a Major General in 1863. He was Governor of Illinois when the University was established, signed the bill creating the Illinois Industrial University, and appointed its first Board of Trustees.

The Committee on Buildings and Grounds has also been consulted and concurs in this recommendation.

On motion of Mr. Dilliard, these recommendations were approved.

Mr. Pogue asked that consideration be given to naming an appropriate building for the late Governor Adlai E. Stevenson.

Mr. Dilliard suggested that the exterior signs identifying University buildings carry the full names of individuals for whom they have been named.

On motion of Mr. Johnston, this suggestion was referred to the Committee on Buildings and Grounds.

HOSPITAL-MEDICAL-SURGICAL INSURANCE AS SUPPLEMENT TO MEDICARE

(33) Medicare, which becomes effective July 1, 1966, will eliminate the need for part of the health insurance coverage provided by the University's hospital-medical-surgical insurance for staff.

As in the case of other group contracts, University insurance will not make payments for services provided by Medicare and therefore a plan to supplement the Medicare benefits is recommended by representatives of faculty and staff for all three campuses.

The Medicare Supplemental Plan will be an amendment to the University group contract and employees or dependents not eligible for Medicare may continue their coverage under the basic group contract. The supplemental plan will provide:

Hospital Room and Board.....	80 per cent of the expense incurred after ninety days confinement for each disability.
Hospital Miscellaneous Expense....	80 per cent of the expense incurred after ninety days confinement for each disability.
In-Hospital Medical Benefit.....	\$4.00 per day for the first thirty days of a hospital confinement for each disability.
Private Duty Nurse.....	80 per cent of the expense incurred. (No benefit available under Medicare so that there is no waiting period.)
Maximum Benefit.....	\$10,000 per disability.

The premiums and benefits have been negotiated with the Continental Assurance Company, the current underwriter of University insurance, and are comparable with premiums charged for the same benefits under other group contracts.

Administrative allowance.....	05
Insured pays.....	\$2 00

The Vice-President and Comptroller recommends amendment of the present contract with the Continental Assurance Company to provide benefits to supplement Medicare at the premiums quoted.

I concur.

On motion of Mr. Swain, this recommendation was approved.

PURCHASES

(34) The President submitted a report of purchases authorized by his office, on recommendation of the Director of Purchases and the Vice-President and Comptroller. He also presented a list of purchases recommended by him.

The reports of purchases authorized and purchases recommended for Board approval were presented in two categories: purchases from appropriated funds (i.e., from state appropriation to the University) and purchases from institutional funds. The latter term designates funds received by the University under contracts with the United States government, contracts with private corporations and other organizations, funds from foundation grants and grants from corporations and other donors, and University revolving funds authorized by law.

REJECTION OF BIDS ON VETERINARY MEDICINE SMALL ANIMAL CLINIC

Mr. Pogue, for the Committee on Buildings and Grounds, presented the following:

The Illinois Building Authority on May 10, 1966, received bids for the construction of the Small Animal Clinic which was declared by the General Assembly to be in the public interest at an authorized total cost of \$4,000,000. The amount of the low construction bid, when added to other project costs, would result in a total project cost exceeding the amount authorized by approximately \$850,000. No other funds are available and further reduction of the scope of the project is not considered feasible.

Accordingly, the Committee on Buildings and Grounds recommends that the Illinois Building Authority be requested to reject the Small Animal Clinic bids received on May 10, 1966.

On motion of Mr. Pogue, this recommendation was approved.

COMMUNICATIONS AND PETITIONS

(39) President Henry presented two communications received from the University of Illinois (Urbana) Chapter of the American Association of University Professors: one urging the Board of Trustees and administrative officers of the University to seek all appropriate means to obtain repeal of the Clabaugh Act of 1947; and the other, urging the same officers to seek the repeal of the state law requiring each state employee to sign an affidavit.

The President also presented a joint report from the Urbana-Champaign Senate Committees on Academic Freedom and Tenure and on Educational Policy, including the following resolution:

"Resolved, that the Clabaugh Act of 1947 should be repealed;

"Resolved Further, that the President be requested to transmit this resolution and accompanying report to the Board of Trustees on behalf of this Senate; and

"Resolved Further, that the President and the Board of Trustees be urged to seek repeal of this Statute by all appropriate means."

Copies of the two communications from the American Association of University Professors and of the report from the Urbana-Champaign Senate were distributed at the meeting. The communication from the Urbana-Champaign Senate was not received in time for transmittal to the Board in advance of the meeting. Copies of these documents were filed with the Secretary for record.

On motion of Mrs. Watkins, these communications were referred to the Committee on General Policy.

A resolution from the faculty of the College of Law calling for repeal of the Clabaugh Act was presented to the Board of Trustees on April 20, 1966, and had also been referred to the Committee on General Policy.

RECESS

At this point, on motion of Mr. Swain, the Board recessed.

When the Board reconvened, the same members and officers of the Board (with the exception of Mr. Manchester, Treasurer, who asked to be excused) and officers of the University were present as recorded at the beginning of these minutes.

The Board took up consideration of the following recommendation from the President of the University.

BUILDING PROGRAM FOR 1967-69

(40) Submitted herewith are the building program and estimates of capital funds required for the biennium of 1967-69.

The buildings and other capital improvements listed are recommended by the Executive Vice-President and Provost, Chairman of the University Building Program Committee,¹ after receiving recommendations from the auxiliary campus planning committees, and after consultation with the deans, directors, and other administrative officers concerned.

I recommend approval of this schedule of capital funds by the Board of Trustees for filing with the State Department of Finance, as required by law, and for presentation to the state administration, the Board of Higher Education, and other state agencies involved in budget considerations.

Copies of this building program and capital budget for 1967-69 were previously sent to all members of the Board of Trustees for study in advance of today's meeting.

The President, and the Executive Vice-President and Provost as Chairman of the University Building Program Committee, formally presented the building program and discussed the capital appropriations required for 1967-69. Supporting presentations were made by the Vice-President and Comptroller and the Director of the Physical Plant.

The Committee on Buildings and Grounds had received preliminary reports and recommendations relating to the building program at two meetings held on April 20 and May 18, 1966, and subsequently reviewed the complete program at a third meeting.

Mr. Pogue, Chairman, reported that the Committee recommends approval and that the President of the University be authorized to make adjustments in the schedules of capital requests following further studies of costs of buildings and other permanent improvements in pre-

At the conclusion of these presentations, and following discussion by the members of the Board, Mr. Swain moved approval of the building program as submitted, including authorization of the adjustments in schedules of capital appropriations recommended by the Committee on Buildings and Grounds, for filing with the appropriate state agencies. This motion was adopted by the following vote: Aye, Mr. Clement, Mr. Dilliard, Mr. Hughes, Mr. Johnston, Mr. Pogue, Mr. Swain, Mrs. Watkins, Mr. Williamson; no, none, absent, Mr. Jones, Governor Kerner, Mr. Page.

A copy of the building program and capital appropriation requests was filed with the Secretary of the Board for record. The building program and revised schedules of capital requests for 1967-69 will be submitted to the Board of Trustees at its next meeting, and will be in the record of that meeting. — Secretary's Note.

PURCHASE OF 806 SOUTH FIFTH STREET PROPERTY

\$75,000 and lease the property to the University at a rental sufficient to pay the interest costs on a loan to the Foundation to purchase the property.

The improvements on this property will be demolished, and the land will be used for parking facilities.

The property consists of a lot 75 feet by 99 feet (7,425 square feet) and is improved with a two and one-half story frame student rooming house with a capacity of thirty-eight men.

**REQUEST TO THE ILLINOIS BUILDING AUTHORITY TO PURCHASE
PROPERTY AT 1303 WEST MAIN STREET, URBANA**

(43) The Board of Trustees has authorized a request to the Illinois Building Authority to acquire by condemnation proceedings the property at 1303 West Main Street, Urbana, Illinois, to be used as part of the site for the Civil Engineering Building, Phase II. Subsequent negotiations with the owners of the property have resulted in their agreement to a price of \$28,875, which is within the appraisals received on the property. Accordingly, the Director of the Physical Plant and the Vice-President and Comptroller recommend that the Illinois Building Authority be requested to purchase the property at this price.

at a purchase price of Twenty-eight Thousand Eight Hundred Seventy-five Dollars (\$28,875.00) and with title to be conveyed and possession delivered to the Illinois Building Authority not later than September 1, 1966.

Be It, and It Hereby Is Further Resolved that the Comptroller and Secretary of this public corporation be, and they hereby are, authorized and directed, to execute in the name of, and on behalf of, this public corporation such lease agreement or other document or documents, and to secure and submit appraisals and such other documentation, as they may deem to be necessary or desirable in order to effectuate such conveyance of title to the Illinois Building Authority and to secure to this public corporation the beneficial use of said property.

**ACQUISITION OF LAND ADJOINING
UNIVERSITY OF ILLINOIS AIRPORT**

(44) At its meeting of December 15, 1965, the Board of Trustees authorized acquisition of certain parcels of land adjoining the University of Illinois Airport for a clear zone approach and approach lighting system for instrument runways. Condemnation proceedings have been instituted pursuant to that authority and

subsequent negotiations indicate that a settlement may be possible with respect to some or all of the parcels in the condemnation suit at a price within the University appraisals. Accordingly, the Director of the Institute of Aviation and the Vice-President and Comptroller recommend that authority be given to settle the condemnation proceedings as to the individual parcels, to the extent that the settlement for any parcel does not exceed the University appraisals thereon.
