

MEETING OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES
OF THE
UNIVERSITY OF ILLINOIS

June 18, 1969



The June meeting of The Board of Trustees of the University of Illinois was held in the Chicago Illini Union, Medical Center campus, on Wednesday, June 18, 1969, beginning at 9:30 a.m.

President Earl M. Hughes called the meeting to order and asked the Secretary to call the roll. The following members of the Board were present: Mr. Howard W. Clement, Mr. Donald R. Grimes, Mr. Ralph C. Hahn, Mr. Earl M. Hughes, Mr. Theodore A. Jones, Mr. Russell W. Steger, Mr. Timothy W. Swain. Governor Richard B. Ogilvie and Mr. Ray Page were absent. Mr. Harold Pogue was not present when the Board convened, but joined the meeting later. Dr. James Weatherly resigned as a member of the Board of Trustees of the University of Illinois effective June 10, 1969, and his resignation was accepted by the Governor.

ACTING DEAN OF STUDENTS, URBANA

(5) The Chancellor at Urbana has recommended that Mr. Hugh M. Satterlee, presently Director of Student Financial Aids, be appointed Acting Dean of Students effective September 1, 1969, through August 31, 1970, or until a dean is appointed, and that he be given an additional salary at the rate of \$2,000 per year. Mr. Satterlee will continue as Director of Student Financial Aids.

This recommendation is endorsed by the Executive Vice President and Provost. I recommend approval.

On motion of Mr. Grimes, this appointment was approved.

**DIRECTORSHIP OF INSTITUTE OF COMMUNICATIONS RESEARCH,
URBANA**

(6) The Dean of the College of Communications, Urbana, has recommended to the Chancellor the appointment of Dr. James W. Carey, presently Associate Professor of Journalism and Research Associate Professor in the Institute of Communications Research, as Associate Professor of Journalism and Research Associate Professor in the Institute of Communications Research on indefinite tenure and Director of the Institute of Communications Research beginning September 1, 1969, on an academic year service basis at an annual salary of \$17,000.

This appointment is to succeed Professor Howard S. Maclay who has asked to be relieved of this administrative assignment as of August 31, 1969.

The Executive Vice President and Provost, the Chancellor, and the Dean of the Graduate College support this recommendation.

I concur.

On motion of Mr. Swain, this appointment was approved.

HEADSHIP OF THE DEPARTMENT OF PHYSIOLOGY AND BIOPHYSICS, URBANA

(7) The Dean of the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences, Urbana, has recommended to the Chancellor the appointment of Dr. William W. Sleator, presently Professor of Physiology and Biophysics at Washington University School of Medicine, as Professor of Physiology and Biophysics on indefinite tenure and Head of the Department of Physiology and Biophysics, beginning September 1, 1969, on an academic year service basis, at an annual salary of \$26,000.

This appointment is to succeed Professor C. Ladd Prosser who has asked to be relieved of his administrative assignment.

The nomination of Dr. Sleator was made with the advice of a search committee¹ and supported by the Executive Committees of the College and the School of Life Sciences, the Executive Vice President and Provost, the Chancellor, and the Dean of the Graduate College.

I concur.

On motion of Mr. Hahn, this appointment was approved.

HEADSHIP OF THE DEPARTMENT OF PSYCHOLOGY, URBANA

(8) The Dean of the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences, Urbana, has recommended to the Chancellor the appointment of Dr. Morton W. Weir, presently Professor of Psychology and Acting Head of the Department of Psychology, as Professor of Psychology on indefinite tenure and Head of the Department of Psychology beginning September 1, 1969, on an academic year service basis, at an annual salary of \$21,000.

This appointment is to succeed Dr. Lloyd G. Humphreys who has asked to be relieved of this administrative assignment as of August 31, 1969. Dr. Humphreys was on sabbatical leave of absence during the first semester of 1968-69 and was an Associate in the Center for Advanced Study during the second semester of 1968-69.

The nomination of Professor Weir is supported by the Executive Committee of the College and by the members of the Department of Psychology of professorial rank. The Executive Vice President and Provost, the Chancellor, and the Dean of the Graduate College concur.

I recommend approval.

On motion of Mr. Swain, this recommendation was approved.

APPOINTMENTS TO THE FACULTY

(9) The following new appointments to the faculty of the rank of Assistant Professor and above, and involving tenure, have been approved since the previous meeting of the Board of Trustees.

Positions in the University are classified in the following categories and are designated in the budget by the symbols indicated: A— indefinite tenure; P— indefinite term appointment for part-time service only; B— two years; D— one year; E— nine months from the beginning of the academic year; G— special tenure; Q— initial term appointment for Professor or Associate Professor; Y— twelve months' service required instead of two semesters; 1-7— indicates the number of years of service which will be credited at the end of the contract period toward completion of the probationary period relating to tenure.

Figures following a symbol indicate percentage of time if the appointment is on a part-time basis (e.g., D75 means one year on three-fourths time).

DISCONTINUANCE, DEGREE OF MASTER OF TELEVISION, URBANA

(10) On June 16, 1955, the Trustees approved the establishment of a curriculum leading to the professional degree, Master of Television, to be offered by the School of Journalism and Communications as it was then called (now the College of Communications).

The degree was intended to provide advanced training in the nonengineering areas of television and was rather technical in character in contrast to the existing Master of Science in Radio and Television, which was academically oriented. The

program also differed from the Master of Science in Radio and Television in not requiring a thesis or a minor.

Increasingly, the College of Communications has emphasized broader programs and a concern for basic academic areas of study in the field of communications. Accordingly, and in harmony with the interests of many students, those seeking graduate training in television have been encouraged to elect the more academically-oriented degree, the Master of Science in Radio and Television. It is now the judgment of the College that the degree approved in 1955, the Master of Television, has outlived its usefulness.

Accordingly, on recommendation of the College of Communications, and with the concurrence of the Graduate College, the Urbana-Champaign Senate has approved the discontinuance of the degree of Master of Television effective September, 1969, with the understanding that students currently in the program may continue in it and qualify for the degree if they so desire. The Senate Coordinating Council advises that no other Senate jurisdiction is involved.

The Chancellor at Urbana and the Executive Vice President and Provost support this recommendation.

I concur.

On motion of Mr. Jones, this recommendation was approved.

CENTER FOR INTERNATIONAL COMPARATIVE STUDIES, URBANA

(11) The Board of Trustees on June 17, 1964, approved the Center for International Comparative Studies in the Graduate College. It is now proposed that the Center be transferred to the Office of International Programs and Studies.

It is felt that under the proposed administrative arrangement, the policy formulation activity of the Center will benefit from a more direct relationship to the other international programs and activities in progress on the campus. At the same time, the executive committee structure of the Center will remain unchanged, in order to reflect campus involvement on as broad a scale as currently exists.

Budgetary support of the Center will not be altered; rather, the resources and programs of the Center will be complemented and reinforced by the proposed association with the Office of International Programs and Studies. It is hoped that better coordinated and more effective international programs possible under the proposed arrangement will enhance the total resources of the Center, in particular, in obtaining new long-term financial support.

In summary, no shift in policy formulation or budgetary control is foreseen, except to assure better communication and coordination of the Center with the Office of International Programs and Studies.

The Graduate College, the Director of the Center for International Comparative Studies, the Director of the Office of International Programs and Studies, and the Chancellor concur in this recommendation.

I recommend approval.

On motion of Mr. Hahn, this recommendation was approved.

OPERATION AND GOVERNANCE OF THE ILLINI UNION, URBANA

(12) The Chancellor at Urbana has made certain recommendations for the operation and governance of the Illini Union that would supersede earlier actions of the Board of Trustees.¹

The specific recommendations are as follows:

1. The Director of the Illini Union shall be responsible for the administration of all physical facilities, services, and operations of the Illini Union with the exception of the social, cultural, educational, and recreational activities and programs of a campus-wide nature which shall be the responsibility of the Illini Union Board.
2. The Director of the Illini Union and the Program Director shall proceed in accordance with the instructions of the Illini Union Board in the conduct of the social, cultural, educational, and recreational programs of the Illini Union.
3. The Program staff is administratively responsible to the Director. However, the Director shall seek the advice and consent of the Illinois Union Board in the employment and review of the Program staff.

4. Policies on the use of the Illini Union, including assignment of space, and the operation of all departments except Program Department (see Number 2 above) of the Illini Union shall be determined in full consultation between the Director of the Illini Union and the Illini Union Board. In those instances where agreement between the Director and the Illini Union Board can not be reached, the Chancellor, or his designee, will decide. (*See motion.*)
5. To provide for the maximum and informed consideration of all matters related to the operation of the Illini Union, the Illini Union Board shall annually assign to its student directors various aspects of these operations for their study and report to the Board.
6. The Chancellor of the Urbana-Champaign campus will seek the advice of the Illini Union Board in the appointment of the Director of the Illini Union.
7. The Director of the Illini Union and the Program Director of the Illini Union shall sit on the Illini Union Board but shall have no vote.
8. The Director of the Illini Union and the Illini Union Board shall report to the Chancellor with respect to administrative responsibilities via the Dean of Students and the Director of Plant and Services. (*See motion.*)
9. That the composition of the Illini Union Board be as follows:
 - a. Five to thirteen graduate or undergraduate students (selected by Illini Union Board—applicants not limited to persons with previous Illini Union experience).
 - b. One undergraduate student (appointed by Undergraduate Student Association).
 - c. One graduate student (appointed by Graduate Student Association).
 - d. Three faculty members (appointed by Chancellor).
 - e. Director of Illini Union (ex officio without vote).
 - f. Program Director of Illini Union (ex officio without vote).
 - g. Executive Director of Alumni Association (or his designee).

The major thrust of the recommendations provides for greater student participation through the Illini Union Board in the operation and governance of the Illini Union. Essentially, the operation of the Union, under these recommendations, will differ from the existing operation in the following ways:

1. The Illini Union Board is more directly involved in the supervision of the program personnel and program activities of the Illini Union.
2. The Director and Program Director remain as ex officio members but will not have a vote on the Illini Union Board.
3. The Chancellor will seek the advice of the Illini Union Board in the appointment of a Director of the Illini Union.

I concur in the recommendations of the Chancellor and recommend that previous Trustee actions be superseded accordingly.

President Henry introduced this agenda item for discussion, indicating that Chancellor Peltason would summarize and speak to the recommendations. The Chancellor did so, reviewing the background of the question. At his invitation, Professor Charles Wert, Chairman of the Urbana Senate Council, and Mr. John S. Adler, President of the Illini Union Board (a junior in the College of Commerce and Business Administration), were recognized and commented upon the positions taken by the Senate and the Union Board. (A prepared statement presented by Professor Wert was filed with the Secretary for record.)

The Board then considered a request from members of the Graduate Student Association to present a statement. On motion of Mr. Hahn, the Board approved the request and Miss Judith A. Stewart and Mr. Bruce A. Morrison of the Graduate Student Association spoke in favor of the recommendations as proposed by the Illini Union Board and approved by the Senate. Mr. Morrison made clear that his position represented a compromise that his preference would be for the original recommendations of the Senate Policy Committee on Student Affairs.

Following extended discussion and questioning of administrative officers and the student and faculty spokesmen, on motion of Mr. Jones, the Board approved the recommendations as submitted with the following provisos: (1) that it be understood, with regard to recommendation Number 4, that instances of disagreement concerning *program* not be referred to the Chancellor but that in such instances of disagreement the Illini Union Board will prevail; (2) (as suggested by Mr. Clement) that the following sentence be added to recommendation Number 8: "This provision is not to be interpreted as modifying the powers of the Illini Union Board and Director as set forth above."

The Board also approved a motion by Mr. Hahn that the new policies as approved be evaluated by the Chancellor, the Illini Union Board and other appropriate agencies at the end of the 1969-70 academic year and that the Chancellor prepare an evaluation report for presentation to the Board.

At this point, Mr. Steger asked to be excused.

**TABLING, PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO SECTION 48 OF THE
UNIVERSITY STATUTES: DEAN OF STUDENTS
OR STUDENT AFFAIRS**

(13) On September 20, 1967, the Board of Trustees adopted provisionally an amendment to Section 48 of the *Statutes*—Dean of Students—the intent being to eliminate the office of the University Dean of Students and to provide, in general terms, for an officer who would have "general supervision over extracurricular activities of students" at each campus.

The Senates' advice on the amendment differs, and the Senate Coordinating Council has forwarded the amendment without recommendation.

Meanwhile, the Chancellors at Urbana and at Chicago Circle have been studying the organization of student affairs and recommendations on this subject may be forthcoming during the coming months.

It is clear that any statutory references to the administration of student affairs should be generally applicable to all campuses, while leaving room for individual arrangements at each campus. Similarly, any contemplated statutory change should await the studies now being undertaken.

Accordingly, with the concurrence of the Chancellors, I recommend that the amendment of Section 48 of the *Statutes* be tabled until such time as it is possible to take into account the results of present studies and new recommendations that may be developed on the basis of them.

On motion of Mr. Grimes, this recommendation was approved.

**CHANGES IN NONACADEMIC POLICY AND RULES RELATING
TO COMPENSATION OF EMPLOYEES**

(14) Consistent with procedures followed in other recent revisions, comments have been solicited by the University Director of Nonacademic Personnel from deans, directors, and department heads and from employee organizations. Draft revisions were submitted to the Nonacademic Personnel Advisory Committees on each campus and to the University Nonacademic Employees Advisory Committee. Revised drafts were reviewed by the University Nonacademic Personnel Advisory Committee.

In the light of such reviews and upon the recommendation of the Vice President and Comptroller and of the University Director of Nonacademic Personnel, the following policy in respect to compensation is presented to the Board for approval. This policy is to become effective July 1, 1969, and upon its adoption all portions of the old edition of the *Policy and Rules* will have been superseded.

University Policy: Compensation

Within the framework of applicable law, the University will provide optimum compensation, i.e., wages and employee benefits, consistent with the judicious ex-

penditure of funds entrusted to the University. The level of compensation paid to University employees will be comparable to that generally paid for work of a similar character by other employers located in the recruiting area and may be adjusted to maintain internal equity based on position classification factors.

To encourage meritorious performance, an employee who consistently exceeds the standards of performance for his position may receive added monetary recognition.

The President shall issue rules and procedures and take other action as needed to carry out this policy.

Pay comparability with the local area is provided for in Section 36k of the Civil Service Statute. The proposed policy integrates this statutory mandate with the judicious use of public funds and with internal job relationships. The proposed policy also provides for added monetary recognition to employees who consistently exceed the standards of performance for their positions. A copy of the rules which the President proposes to issue upon approval of the above policy by the Board of Trustees is being filed with the Secretary of the Board for record.

I concur in the recommendation that the above policy be approved as herein presented. Upon its approval, appropriate rules and procedures will be issued as indicated and modified from time to time as circumstances warrant in accord with policies established.

On motion of Mr. Jones, this recommendation was approved.

APPROPRIATIONS FOR NONRECURRING EXPENDITURES

Urbana-Champaign

These contracts are for work which does not justify the cost of preparing separate drawings and specifications and of separate bidding procedures on each project estimated to cost less than \$25,000. The several contractors bid on percentages to be added to actual material, labor, subcontractors and estimated tool and equipment rental volume costs, and the awards recommended are to the lowest bidders.

The work will be done as ordered by the Department of Plant and Services, and will be paid for on the basis of the actual cost of each job plus contractor's fees. A report including a schedule of bids received showing the fee percentages to be added for work to be executed under these cost-plus contracts is submitted herewith, and a copy is being filed with the Secretary of the Board for record as the basis for the contract awards recommended. No assignment of funds is requested, as each job will be covered by a contract change order charged against funds allocated for the project.

(17) The President of the University, with the concurrence of appropriate administrative officers, recommends that the Illinois Building Authority be requested to award a contract in the amount of \$258,500 to Herlihy Mid-Continent Company, Chicago, the low bidder, for construction of an underground oil tank and pump house for the Utilities Building, Phase III Addition, at the Chicago Circle campus and proceed to procure this facility for the use of the University.

This work is part of the project for Chicago Circle, Phase III, construction which the Board on July 26, 1967, requested the Illinois Building Authority to

provide. The Authority will finance the construction and lease the facilities to the University for rental payments for which state appropriations are available. Jurisdiction of the land has been transferred to the Authority.

It is also recommended that the Comptroller and the Secretary of the Board be authorized to make, execute, acknowledge, and deliver such instruments of transfer, conveyance, lease, contract, and other documents as are necessary to provide for the carrying out of the foregoing project and facility by the Illinois Building Authority, and that the resolution submitted herewith be adopted to implement the official action requested.

Be It, and It Hereby Is, Resolved by The Board of Trustees of the University of Illinois, a public corporation of the State of Illinois, that the Illinois Building Authority be, and it hereby is, requested to award to Herlihy Mid-Continent Company, 407 South Dearborn Street, Chicago, Illinois 60605, a contract for construction of the underground oil tank and pump house for the Utilities Building, Phase III Addition at the Chicago Circle Campus for the sum of \$258,500.00 and proceed to procure this facility for the use of the University.

LEASE OF 606½ EAST GREEN STREET, CHAMPAIGN

(18) The President of the University, with the concurrence of appropriate administrative officers, recommends that the Board of Trustees request the University of Illinois Foundation to enter into a lease of the entire second floor (2,645 square feet) of the property at 606½ East Green Street, Champaign, for the Police Training Institute of the Division of University Extension at an annual rental of \$5,800 for a period beginning on or about July 1, 1969, and extending until June 30, 1972, with an option for renewal for an additional three-year period at the same rental rate and that the Foundation sublease the space to the University at the same rental on an annual basis.

Funds for minor remodeling and for rental and operation until June 30, 1970, are available in the revolving account of the Police Training Institute. Funds required for annual renewals of the sublease and operation costs after that date will be paid from this account as long as the Police Training Institute retains possession and thereafter will be requested in the budget of the Department of Plant and Services on an annual basis.

(19) The President of the University, with the concurrence of appropriate administrative officers, recommends, subject to funds being made available from appropriations by the Seventy-sixth General Assembly, the execution of a lease with the American Red Cross, Mid-America Chapter, for the rental of 4,800 square feet of space located at 43 East Ohio Street, Chicago, for the Chicago District Office of the Division of Services for Crippled Children.

The current lease held by the University expires June 30, 1969; and it is

recommended that the new lease be for the period July 1, 1969, through June 30, 1970, with the option of renewing at the same rate for the period July 1, 1970, through June 30, 1971.

The monthly rental for this space is \$1,940, or an annual charge of \$23,280.

Dotten, Promotional Manager, Park Forest, for preparation of promotional material and for professional counsel for programs in the Assembly Hall during the period from August 18, 1969, through June 17, 1970, for a total fee of \$13,750.

Funds are available in the operating budget of the Assembly Hall.

TELEVISION SERVICE FOR RESEARCH AND EDUCATIONAL HOSPITALS, MEDICAL CENTER

(21) The President of the University, with the concurrence of appropriate administrative officers, has recommended that the Board authorize an agreement with Wells Television, Inc., New York City, which will make it possible for patients in the Research and Educational Hospitals to rent television sets at a cost of \$1.75 per day.

According to the terms of the proposed agreement, Wells Television, Inc. would install a master antenna system and provide television sets and service. The period of the contract would be six years and the University would receive a percentage of rentals collected per day as follows: 15 per cent of the first thirty-six rentals, 33 per cent of the next nineteen rentals, and 50 per cent of all rentals over fifty-five. The estimated annual income from rentals would be \$16,000. At the end of the six-year agreement, the antenna system would become the property of the University.

Should the University elect to terminate this agreement prior to the end of the six-year period, a charge of \$30,000 would be made, reduced by \$5,000 for each full year that the agreement was in effect, to cover the unamortized cost of the antenna.

INCREASE IN HOSPITAL-MEDICAL-SURGICAL FEE, URBANA

(22) The President of the University, with the concurrence of appropriate administrative officers and the University Committee on Fees, recommends the following increases in the Hospital-Medical-Surgical fee to be effective September 1, 1969, at the Urbana-Champaign campus only:

1. An increase in the total Hospital-Medical-Surgical fee from the present \$16.00 per semester or summer session to an amount of \$18.00 per semester or summer session. This fee as increased shall include a student fee of \$8.00 for McKinley Hospital. The McKinley Hospital fee shall be assessed to all students not now totally exempt from the Hospital-Medical-Surgical fee and shall not be subject to waiver because of other insurance coverage. The balance of the Hospital-Medical-Surgical fee of \$10.00 per semester or summer session shall be used for the purchase and administration of a medical insurance program for students and may be waived upon the presentation of evidence of insurance coverage equivalent to the University program.

2. An increase in the nonrefundable charge from \$36.00 to \$38.00 in a semester or twelve-week term, and from \$26.00 to \$28.00 in an eight-week summer session in cases of withdrawal from the University.

STUDENT INSURANCE PROGRAM

(23) The current student health insurance contract was approved by the Board on June 19, 1968, and is underwritten by the Continental Assurance Company, Chicago. It is recommended that the contract be continued for the 1969-70 academic year for all campuses. The benefits and premiums will be the same as the current contract with the exception of the following increase in benefits and premiums which have been recommended for the Urbana-Champaign campus only. The insurance company will pay:

Prescribed Drugs and Medicine—80 per cent of the expense for drugs and medicines requiring the written prescription of a physician and which must be dispensed by a licensed pharmacist. Maximum benefit of \$50 per semester.

Dental Insurance—50 per cent of the expense for fillings and extractions only. The benefit payment is limited to \$10 per visit and a maximum of five visits per semester.

WHEREAS, the Administrator of the Federal Aviation Administration, for and in behalf of the United States, has extended to The Board of Trustees of the

University of Illinois, State of Illinois, a formal Grant Offer dated May 20, 1969, pursuant to the Project Application of The Board of Trustees of the University of Illinois, submitted to the Federal Aviation Administration dated January 24, 1969, all as hereinbelow set forth, and all relating to the development of the University of Illinois-Willard Airport, the same bearing FAA Project No. 9-11-026-C907; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to and for the purposes of carrying out the provisions of the Federal Airport Act (60 Stat. 170; Public Law 377, 79th Congress), it is necessary that said Grant Offer be duly and formally accepted by The Board of Trustees of the University of Illinois; and WHEREAS, such Grant Offer and such Acceptance thereof, duly executed, together shall constitute the Grant Agreement between The Board of Trustees of the University of Illinois, and the United States relating to said airport-development project; and

WHEREAS, the Sponsor has submitted to the FAA a Project Application dated 24 January 1969, for a grant of Federal funds for a project for development of the University of Illinois-Willard Airport (herein called the "Airport"), together with plans and specifications for such project, which Project Application, as approved by the FAA is hereby incorporated herein and made a part hereof; and

WHEREAS, the FAA has approved a project for development of the Airport (herein called the "Project") consisting of the following-described airport development:

Install taxiway lights and taxiway guidance signs on parallel taxiway system serving Runway 13/31, including vault equipment.

all as more particularly described in the property map and plans and specifications incorporated in the said Project Application;

Now Therefore, pursuant to and for the purpose of carrying out the provisions of the Federal Airport Act, as amended (49 U.S.C. 1101), and in consideration of (a) the Sponsor's adoption and ratification of the representations and assurances contained in said Project Application, and its acceptance of this Offer as hereinafter provided, and (b) the benefits to accrue to the United States and the public from the accomplishment of the Project and the operation and maintenance of the Airport as herein provided, The Federal Aviation Agency, for and on behalf of The United States, hereby offers and agrees to pay, as the United States share of the allowable costs incurred in accomplishing the Project, 50 percentum thereof.

This Offer is made on and subject to the following terms and conditions:

1. The maximum obligation of the United States payable under this Offer shall be \$37,000.00.
2. The Sponsor shall:
 - (a) begin accomplishment of the Project within Ninety days after acceptance of this Offer or such longer time as may be prescribed by the FAA, with failure to do so constituting just cause for termination of the obligations of the United States hereunder by the FAA;
 - (b) carry out and complete the Project without undue delay and in accordance with the terms hereof, the Federal Airport Act, and Sections 151.45-151.55 of the Regulations of the Federal Aviation Agency (14 CFR 151) in effect

- as of the date of acceptance of this Offer; which Regulations are herein-after referred to as the "Regulations";
- (c) carry out and complete the Project in accordance with the plans and specifications and property map, incorporated herein, as they may be revised or modified with the approval of the FAA.
3. The allowable costs of the project shall not include any costs determined by the FAA to be ineligible for consideration as to allowability under Section 151.41(b) of the Regulations.
 4. Payment of the United States share of the allowable project costs will be made pursuant to and in accordance with the provisions of Sections 151.57-151.63 of the Regulations. Final determination as to the allowability of the costs of the project will be made at the time of the final grant payment pursuant to Section 151.63 of the Regulations: *Provided*, that, in the event a semi-final grant payment is made pursuant to Section 151.63 of the Regulations, final determination as to the allowability of those costs to which such semi-final payment relates will be made at the time of such semi-final payment.
 5. The Sponsor shall operate and maintain the airport as provided in the Project Application incorporated herein and specifically covenants and agrees, in accordance with its Assurance 4 in Part III of said Project Application, that in its operation and the operation of all facilities thereof, neither it nor any person or organization occupying space or facilities thereon will discriminate against any person or class of persons by reason of race, color, creed or national origin in the use of any of the facilities provided for the public on the airport.
 6. The FAA reserves the right to amend or withdraw this Offer at any time prior to its acceptance by the Sponsor.
 7. This Offer shall expire and the United States shall not be obligated to pay any part of the costs of the Project unless this Offer has been accepted by the Sponsor on or before 30 June 1969 or such subsequent date as may be prescribed in writing by the FAA.
 8. In addition the Sponsor shall:
 - (a) Incorporate or cause to be incorporated in each contract for construction work under the project, or any modification thereof, the equal opportunity clause as set forth in Section 202 of Executive Order No. 11246 of September 24, 1965, or such modification thereof as may be approved by the Secretary of Labor.
 - (b) Incorporate or cause to be incorporated in each bid or proposal form submitted by prospective contractors for construction work under the project the provisions prescribed by Section 151.54(d)(1), Part 151, Federal Aviation Regulations.
 - (c) Be bound by said equal opportunity clause in any Federally assisted construction work in which it participates.
 - (d) Cooperate actively with the FAA and the Secretary of Labor in obtaining the compliance of contractors and subcontractors with the equal opportunity clause and the rules, regulations and relevant orders of the Secretary of Labor.
 - (e) Furnish the FAA and the Secretary of Labor such information as they may require for the supervision of such compliance and will otherwise assist the FAA in the discharge of its primary responsibility for securing compliance.
 - (f) Refrain from entering into any contract or contract modification subject to Executive Order No. 11246 with a contractor debarred from, or who has not demonstrated eligibility for, government contracts and Federally assisted construction contracts pursuant to Part II, Subpart D of Executive Order No. 11246.
 - (g) Carry out such sanctions and penalties for violation of the equal opportunity clause as may be imposed upon contractors and subcontractors by the FAA and the Secretary of Labor pursuant to Part II, Subpart D of Executive Order No. 11246; and in the event that the sponsor fails or refuses to comply with its undertakings, the FAA may cancel, terminate or suspend in whole or in part any contractual arrangement it may have with the Sponsor, may refrain from extending any further assistance under

any of its programs subject to Executive Order 11246 until satisfactory assurance of future compliance has been received from such applicant, or may refer the case to the Department of Justice for appropriate legal proceedings.

9. It is understood and agreed that each contract awarded for construction work under this project is subject to the provisions of the Work-Hours Act of 1962, Public Law 87-581. It is further understood and agreed that each contract will contain stipulations requiring the contractor or subcontractor to pay wages to all laborers and mechanics employed on work in conformance with the provisions of the Act and that the Sponsor may withhold or cause to be withheld from the contractor or subcontractor so much of the accrued payments as may be considered necessary to pay laborers and mechanics employed by any such contractor or subcontractor on the work the full amount of wages required by the contract and such sums as may administratively be determined to be necessary to satisfy any liabilities of such contractor or subcontractor for liquidated damages as provided by the Act. It is also understood and agreed that, in the event of failure of any contractor or subcontractor to pay any laborer or mechanic employed or working on the site of the work all or part of the wages required by the contract, the FAA may, after written notice to the Sponsor, withhold from the Sponsor so much of the accrued payments or advances representing unpaid wages and liquidated damages.
10. The Sponsor hereby covenants and agrees that its financial records of the project, established, maintained and made available to personnel of the FAA in conformity to Section 151.55 of the Regulations of the Federal Aviation Agency (14 CFR 151) will also be available to representatives of the Comptroller General of the United States.
11. By its acceptance of this Grant Offer the Sponsor agrees that insofar as is within its powers and to the extent reasonable, the Sponsor will take action to restrict the use of land adjacent to or in the immediate vicinity of the airport to activities and purposes compatible with normal airport operations, including landing and take-off of aircraft, in furtherance of its undertaking as set forth in Paragraph 13 of Part III — Sponsor's Assurances of the aforesaid Project Application.
12. By its acceptance hereof, the Sponsor hereby covenants that to the extent it has or may have either present or future control over each area identified on the Exhibit "A" as "clear zone," and unless exceptions to or deviations from the following obligations have been granted to the Sponsor in writing by the FAA, it will clear said area or areas of any existing structure or any natural growth which constitutes an obstruction to air navigation with the standards established by Section 77.23 as applied to Section 77.27, Part 77 of the Federal Aviation Regulations; and the Sponsor further covenants that it will control the subsequent erection of structures and control natural growth to the extent necessary to prevent the creation of obstructions within said standards.
13. The Sponsor hereby further covenants that it will not permit any permanent-type structures, other than structures required for aids to air navigation and such other structures as may be specifically excepted in writing by the FAA, to be erected on, and that it will cause any existing structures to be removed from, each area identified on the Exhibit "A" as "clear zone" or any portions thereof, concerning which the Sponsor has acquired a fee interest with Federal financial assistance, irrespective of whether such structures constitute an obstruction to air navigation.
14. It is hereby understood and agreed by and between the parties hereto that Paragraph 7 of Part III — Sponsor's Assurances of the aforesaid Project Application shall be considered to be amended by deletion of the words "Section A of FAA Technical Standard Order No. N18 or Advisory Circular (AC) No. 150/5300.1, whichever is applicable according to the currently approved Airport Layout Plan," and by substitution therefore of the following: "Section 77.23 as applied to Section 77.27, Part 77 of the Federal Aviation Regulations."
15. It is understood and agreed that the terms "Administrator of the Federal Aviation Agency," "Administrator" or "Federal Aviation Agency" wherever they appear in this Agreement, in the Project Application, plans and specifications or other documents constituting a part of this Agreement shall be deemed to mean

the Federal Aviation Administrator or the Federal Aviation Administration as the case may be.

16. The Sponsor —

- (a) Will not grant or permit any exclusive right forbidden by section 308(a) of the Federal Aviation Act of 1958 (49 U.S.C. 1349 (a)) at the airport, or at any other airport now or hereafter owned or controlled by it;
 - (b) Agrees that, in furtherance of the policy of the FAA under this covenant, unless authorized by the Administrator, it will not, either directly or indirectly, grant or permit any person, firm or corporation the exclusive right at the airport, or at any other airport now or hereafter owned or controlled by it, to conduct any aeronautical activities, including, but not limited to, charter flights, pilot training, aircraft rental and sightseeing, aerial photography, crop dusting, aerial advertising and surveying, air carrier operations, aircraft sales and services, sale of aviation petroleum products whether or not conducted in conjunction with other aeronautical activity, repair and maintenance of aircraft, sale of aircraft parts, and any other activities which because of their direct relationship to the operation of aircraft can be regarded as an aeronautical activity;
 - (c) Agrees that it will terminate any existing exclusive right to engage in the sale of gasoline or oil, or both, granted before July 17, 1962, at such an airport, at the earliest renewal, cancellation, or expiration date applicable to the agreement that established the exclusive right; and
 - (d) Agrees that it will terminate any other exclusive aeronautical right now existing at such an airport before the grant of any assistance under the Federal Airport Act.
17. The FAA in tendering this Grant Offer on behalf of the United States recognizes the existence of an agency relationship between The Board of Trustees of the University of Illinois, as principal, and the State of Illinois, Department of Aeronautics, as agent, created by the Agency and Participation Agreement, executed for and on behalf of the said Board of Trustees on 24 January 1969, and for and on behalf of the said Department on 4 February 1969. It is understood and agreed that the said Agency and Participation Agreement will not be amended, modified or terminated without the prior approval, in writing, of the FAA.
18. It is understood and agreed that any reference herein or in the aforesaid Project Application, dated 24 January 1969, to plans and specifications, shall mean the plans and specifications as approved by the State Airport Engineer for Illinois, Chicago Area, Federal Aviation Administration, on 6 May 1969.
19. The Federal Government does not now plan or contemplate the construction of any structures pursuant to Paragraph 9 of Part III — Sponsor's Assurances of the Project Application, dated 24 January 1969, and, therefore, it is understood and agreed that the Sponsor is under no obligation to furnish any such areas or rights without cost to the Federal Government under this Grant Agreement. It is further understood and agreed that nothing contained herein shall in any way effect the rights of the United States or obligations of the Sponsor under prior Grant Agreements to furnish rent free space for the activities specified in such prior Agreements.
20. It is understood and agreed by and between the parties hereto that the United States shall not make, nor shall it be obligated to make, final grant payment hereunder until evidence has been submitted satisfactory to the FAA that the Sponsor has accomplished or initiated affirmative measures to achieve mutually compatible land-use of the land in the immediate vicinity of said airport.
21. It is understood and agreed by and between the parties hereto that the United States shall not make, nor shall it be obligated to make, final grant payment hereunder, until the FAA has determined that the lease agreement between the Sponsor and Dale L. Moore Snack Bar, has been amended to include therein Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 and Part 15 of the Federal Aviation Regulations; and the Sponsor agrees that it will submit such copies of the amended lease as the FAA may request for the purpose of making such determination.

The Sponsor's acceptance of this Offer and ratification and adoption of the Project Application incorporated herein shall be evidenced by execution of this instrument

by the Sponsor, as hereinafter provided, and said Offer and Acceptance shall comprise a Grant Agreement, as provided by the Federal Airport Act, constituting the obligations and rights of the United States and the Sponsor with respect to the accomplishment of the Project and the operation and maintenance of the Airport. Such Grant Agreement shall become effective upon the Sponsor's acceptance of this Offer and shall remain in full force and effect throughout the useful life of the facilities developed under the Project but in any event not to exceed twenty years from the date of said acceptance.

will not cause said aggregate amount to be exceeded; and

WHEREAS the interim leases applicable to these projects which were heretofore executed pursuant to prior authorization were for different amounts than now being designated; and

WHEREAS the Illinois Building Authority has entered into permanent construction leases with the University of Illinois dated March 1, 1969, for these projects and which superseded the interim leases; and

WHEREAS the Illinois Building Authority has forwarded to the University of Illinois forms of amendments to said construction leases dated March 1, 1969, which it requests be executed for these projects and has requested that the Board of Trustees take specific action to approve the same; copies of said amendments to leases forms are presented herewith and are being filed with the Secretary of the Board for record.

Now, Therefore, Be It, and It Hereby Is, Resolved that the Comptroller and Secretary of this Board of Trustees be, and hereby are, authorized to execute, acknowledge, and deliver in the name and on behalf of this corporation amendments to construction leases with the Illinois Building Authority in substantially the forms presented to this meeting for the following buildings and facilities.

- A. Construction of an Office Building at the Medical Center campus at a cost to the Illinois Building Authority of \$3,410,000, requiring an initial rental on or before April 1, 1969, of the sum of \$242,005 and on or before September 1, 1969, the sum of \$242,005; and during each successive renewal term of the Lease, the annual sum of \$285,445 on or before the 1st of September of each year for 22 years with total rental payments of \$7,020,345.
- B. Construction of a Foreign Languages Building at the Urbana-Champaign campus at a cost to the Illinois Building Authority of \$4,070,000 requiring an initial rental on or before April 1, 1969, of the sum of \$284,440 and on or before September 1, 1969, the sum of \$284,440; and during each successive renewal term of the Lease, the annual sum of \$336,290 on or before the 1st of September of each year for 22 years with total rental payments of \$8,379,160.

PROCEDURES GOVERNING APPEARANCES BEFORE THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES

(33) President Hughes stated that in the light of informal comment from several Trustees and discussions with administrative officers, the Secretary had been asked to prepare in consultation with others a statement to provide for the orderly consideration of requests from groups and individuals to appear before the Board. Accordingly, he asked the Secretary to present and read the following statement of procedures for action by the Board.

Procedures Governing Appearances Before the Board of Trustees

The Board of Trustees has long recognized the value of direct communication with faculty, staff, and students of the University, as well as members of the general public.

Although the normal means of Trustee communication with groups interested in the affairs of the University necessarily will be in written form,¹ arrangements may be made when personal presentations by groups or individuals are indicated by special circumstances.

By long custom, official appearances have been arranged for committees and other groups representative of the faculty and the staff. Similarly, faculty, staff, and student groups are invited from time to time to participate in discussions at

the President's and Chancellor's Conferences held in connection with the monthly meetings of the Board of Trustees.

It is increasingly clear to the Board that demands on its calendar require a more formal procedure for the consideration of requests for personal appearances from all individuals and groups interested in the University. Accordingly, the following procedures have been established:

1. Requests should be sent to the Secretary in writing¹ and should set out clearly the nature of the subject-matter to be presented. Such requests will be presented to the Board at its next regular meeting, at which time the Board will act on the request. If approval for a presentation is granted, it will be scheduled for a subsequent meeting of the Board or one of its committees. The Secretary will promptly notify those who have made requests as to the Board's action upon them. Requests should reach the Secretary one week in advance of a regular meeting of the Board.

2. There may be emergency situations when it will be desirable for the Board or one of its committees to hear a presentation at the next regular meeting following receipt of a written request. In such instances, the President of the Board of Trustees is authorized to act on such requests when the emergency appears to him to justify it. Petitions for emergency presentations should be submitted to the Secretary and should be received no later than five days prior to the next regular meeting of the Board of Trustees.

The procedures described are for the information and convenience of all who may wish to appear before the Board. The Trustees reserve the right to decline or restrict appearances at any time and to establish the conditions under which presentations are made.

On motion of Mr. Grimes, the statement was approved unanimously.

SECRETARY'S REPORT

The Secretary presented for record appointments to the faculty made by the President; declinations and resignations; leaves of absence; and retirements. A copy of the report is filed with the Secretary.

ANNOUNCEMENTS FROM THE PRESIDENT OF THE BOARD

President Hughes called attention to the schedule of the next three meetings of the Board: July 23, 1969, in Urbana (having been changed by the Board from July 16); September 17, 1969, at Allerton House in Monticello; and October 15, 1969, at the Dixon Springs Agricultural Center, Simpson.

EXECUTIVE SESSION

The President announced that an executive session had been requested and was being ordered for consideration of reports and recommendations relating to personnel items and pending litigation.

On motion of Mr. Clement, the Board recessed for ten minutes.

When the Board reconvened, the following reports and recommendations from the President of the University were presented and considered.

RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE UNIVERSITY PATENT COMMITTEE

(34) The University Patent Committee, with the concurrence of the Chairman of the University Research Board, submits the following reports and recommendations relating to patentable inventions by members of the staff.

1. Sampling probe with isokinetic balancing—L. Cheng, Research Assistant in Mechanical Engineering, Urbana, inventor; developed under the sponsorship of the Detroit Edison Company. A precise isokinetic device for sampling of airborne particulates under the varying conditions of the carrier gas velocity which exists in normal field operations was developed. The probe assembly provides two independent functions: to match the isokinetic condition and to measure the carrier gas velocity. The first function is obtained by combination of two quite similar hollow

chambers each of which is furnished with a velocity indicating device; these are the novel ideas. The second function, obtained by a single hollow chamber, comes from the notion of Shapiro and Dursourd.

The Committee recommends that the rights of the University in this invention be assigned to the University of Illinois Foundation for study and possible patent application.

2. Modulated impedance feeding system for log-periodic antennas—P. G. Ingerson, formerly Research Assistant in Electrical Engineering, Urbana, and P. E. Mayes, Professor of Electrical Engineering, Urbana, inventors; developed under the sponsorship of the Air Force Avionics Laboratory. The purpose of the invention is to produce a simple broadband feed system for log-periodic antennas. The feed is to be free of transpositions of transmission line conductors so that it may be used for monopole arrays, slot arrays and other antenna systems where transpositions are difficult or impossible to achieve in practice. The proposed feed system offers a simple, effective method of feeding broadband radiation structures. Its new feature is the introduction of log-periodically spaced impedance modulation of the feed line.

The Committee recommends that the rights of the University in this invention be assigned to the University of Illinois Foundation for study and possible patent application, subject to the rights of the sponsoring agency.

3. Antenna with distributed active elements—P. E. Mayes, Professor of Electrical Engineering, Urbana, and Andrew J. Poggio, Research Assistant in Electrical Engineering, Urbana, inventors; developed under the sponsorship of the Air Force Avionics Laboratory. The invention is an antenna which consists of segments of electrical conductor connected by one-port electrical circuit elements, at least one of which is active. Alternatively, the antenna may take the form of a narrow slot cut in a sheet of conducting material and having one-port electrical circuit elements connected across the slot, at least one of which is active. In the preferred embodiment, one or more active elements have impedance versus frequency characteristics which, over some frequency bandwidth, correspond to the conjugate of the impedance of a passive network. The effect of these elements is to increase the phase velocity of the wave along the conductor or slot and enhance the loss due to radiation from such waves. The resulting antenna has a terminal impedance which remains remarkably stable over a very wide frequency band.

The Committee recommends that the rights of the University in this invention be assigned to the University of Illinois Foundation for study and possible patent application, subject to the rights of the sponsoring agency.

4. Vaccine against disease caused by nematodes pathogenic in vertebrates—Paul H. Silverman, Professor of Zoology and of Veterinary Pathology and Hygiene, Urbana, Henry L. Scott, Research Associate in Zoology, Urbana, Manford E. Mansfield, Professor of Veterinary Extension and Veterinary Research and of Veterinary Pathology and Hygiene, Urbana, Nail H. Ozerol, Research Associate in Zoology, Urbana, and Helen S. Levine, formerly Research Associate in Zoology, Urbana, inventors; developed under the sponsorship of the United States Public Health Service; Merck, Sharp and Dohme; Eli Lilly; and Moorman Manufacturing Company. This invention concerns a vaccination procedure for the prevention of disease caused by pathogenic nematodes parasitic in domestic animals and man. The process has special application to those helminth parasites which suck the blood of their hosts, e.g., the stomach worm of sheep and hookworm of man and dogs. The procedure involves the use of non-living antigens prepared from the somatic and metabolic nematode products which are harvested from *in vitro* cultures of the parasites during their antigen-producing (histotropic) stages. These antigens, either in an unaltered state, or after lyophilization, purification and fractionation, may be used, with and without adjuvants, to enhance the stimulation of immunity in host animals. An essential feature of this procedure is the inclusion in the vaccine preparation of injectable iron in either the ferric or ferrous state or the provision of an oral iron supplement to aid in the support of the meopoietic (red blood cell producing) system. It should be pointed out that parasitic organisms against which this method may be potentially effective are widespread pathogens in both temperate and tropical countries and the diseases associated with these helminths are of considerable economic and health importance in both veterinary and human medicine.

The Committee recommends that the rights of the University in this invention be assigned to the University of Illinois Foundation for study and possible patent application, subject to the rights of the sponsoring agencies.

5. Preparation of new antibiotics employing mutant organisms — Kenneth L. Rinehart, Jr., Professor of Chemistry, Urbana, W. Thomas Shier, formerly Fellow in Chemistry, Urbana, and David Gottlieb, Professor of Plant Pathology, Urbana, inventors; developed under the sponsorship of the United States Public Health Service, National Institute of Allergy and Infectious Diseases. The purpose of this invention has been to produce a mutation in an antibiotic-producing micro-organism which will prevent the organism from producing the antibiotic in the absence of a particular portion of the antibiotic, but which will allow the organism to produce the antibiotic in the presence of that portion of the antibiotic. An effort was then made to substitute other compounds for that portion of the antibiotic now required for antibiotic production, with the goal of producing new, potentially superior, antibiotics. New antibiotics have been produced employing a mutant of *Streptomyces fradiae* which can not synthesize the deoxystreptamine component of neomycin but which can produce neomycin in the presence of added deoxystreptamine and new antibiotics, the hybrimycins, in the presence of added streptamine and epistreptamine.

The Committee recommends that the rights of the University in this invention be assigned to the University of Illinois Foundation for study and possible patent application, subject to the rights of the sponsoring agency.

6. Tumoricidal effect of magnesium pemoline — Hoa LeVan, Assistant Professor of Medical Radiology, Medical Center, inventor; developed under the sponsorship of Abbott Laboratories. Magnesium Pemoline (Cylert), a central nervous system stimulant was discovered to possess a highly significant tumoricidal effect against Ehrlich type tumor with or without the additional effect of irradiation. The radioprotective effect of this agent was previously reported (patent pending). The tumoricidal effect of Magnesium Pemoline was found most optimal when administered alone to the tumor size at an acceptable pharmacotherapeutic dose of 14mg/kg. Viability tests showed that the tumor cells treated with this drug at the above dose for a period from one to three weeks are significantly less viable and reveal no evidence of malignancy when compared to the control untreated tumor cells.

The Committee recommends that the rights of the University in this invention be assigned to the University of Illinois Foundation for study and possible patent application.

7. Electronic resolver using switched-polarity integration with applications to frequency modulation — Duane H. Cooper, Associate Professor of Electrical Engineering and of Physics and Research Associate Professor in the Coordinated Science Laboratory, Urbana, inventor; developed under the sponsorship of the United States Army (Joint Services Electronic Program). The invention is of an electronic resolver in which a phase-rate signal is subjected to polarity switching in such a manner that a pair of waveforms exhibiting a sawtooth-function dependence upon phase are generated by electronic integration. The polarity switching is governed by the polarity of the waveforms so generated, which waveforms are then readily transformed to conform to sinusoidal and cosinusoidal shapes. Applications are the functioning as a frequency-controlled oscillator and the frequency modulation of separate stable-frequency oscillators.

The Committee recommends that the rights of the University be released to the inventor, subject to the rights of the sponsoring agency.

8. Heat flux tube — S. L. Soo, Professor of Mechanical Engineering, Urbana, inventor. For effective removal of heat from a long body such as an underground conduit for electrical power cables which might have a cross-section of 3 x 3 but hundreds or thousands of feet long, a heat flux tube was invented. The heat flux tube is for cooling in this case, although other applications might call for heating. A heat flux tube consists of two concentric tubes, flexible or rigid, with liquid or gas as working fluid.

The Committee recommends that the rights of the University in this invention be released to the inventor.

9. Method to prepare, sterilize, store, and use cream testing more than 50 per cent fat — Harold K. Wilson, Associate Professor of Dairy Technology in Food

Science, Urbana, and Divaker B. Kenkare, formerly Research Associate in Food Science, Urbana, inventors; developed under the sponsorship of the American Dairy Association. The discovery is the combination of procedural steps and conditions to prepare and sterilize high fat content cream so that it can be stored in a way to preserve its fine qualities for a variety of uses.

The Committee recommends that the rights of the University in this invention be released to the inventors.

10. Instrument for the cryosurgery of warts and other minor growths — L. M. Hursh, Professor of Health Science and Director of the Health Service, Urbana, inventor. This is a solid brass rod cooled to equilibrium with liquid nitrogen. Brass was used because it is a good conductor, is easy to turn on the lathe, and was available in the plumbing shop. The rods were made so they had different size and shaped tips. A hole was made in the rod so a chain could be attached to facilitate the placement and removal of the rod into and out of the liquid nitrogen. A rod seven inches long and one-half inch in diameter was used to provide sufficient mass to prevent too rapid warming. The rods were chromeplated with the chrome sanded off the tip, so that the rods had the appearance of surgical instruments. The cooled rod is applied to the wart for about one and one-half minutes. The following day a blister forms and in three weeks the wart sloughs off without scarring.

The Committee recommends that the rights of the University in this invention be released to the inventor.

11. General auditory-vibratory experience translator (GAVET) — Shirley J. Heinze, Assistant Professor of Psychology in Psychiatry, Medical Center, Paul R. Cekan, Instructor in Psychiatry, Medical Center, and Ramon C. Blatt, Electronic Technician I, Medical Center, inventors. The GAVET is an electronic device which has been designed to respond to sound and to convert the sound signals to mechanical vibrations which can stimulate touch and pressure receptors in the body. It is expected to be of value as a "hearing substitute" for the profoundly nerve deaf individual.

The Committee recommends that the rights of the University in this invention be released to the inventors.

On motions of Mr. Jones, these recommendations were approved.

REPORT ON LITIGATION

The legal counsel reported on the recent action of the United States District Court for the Northern District of Illinois, Eastern Division with regard to the state law requiring every person employed by the state to execute an employee's affidavit (commonly known as the "Loyalty Oath").

On motion of Mr. Grimes, the Board adjourned.
