February 18, 1970



A meeting of the Executive Committee of The Board of Trustees of the University of Illinois was held in Room 134 of the Assembly Hall on the Urbana-Champaign campus, on Wednesday, February 18, 1970, beginning at 9:30 a.m.

Chairman Earl M. Hughes called the meeting to order and asked the Clerk of the Committee to call the roll. The following members of the Committee were present: Mr. Howard W. Clement, Mr. Earl M. Hughes, Mr. Timothy W. Swain.

INTRODUCTION OF OBSERVERS AND OF AD HOC COMMITTEE OF STUDENT OBSERVERS

Chairman Hughes introduced Professor Charles Wert and Professor Leonard Kent, observers from the Urbana-Champaign and Chicago Circle Senates.

He also introduced members of the Ad Hoc Committee of Student Observers¹ Mr. Michael Kreloff (Graduate Student), Mr. John Adler and Mr. Lawrence Rabyne (Undergraduate Students) from the Urbana-Champaign campus; Miss Linda Murrie and Mr. Lee Fischer from the Medical Center campus; Mr. Richard Gordon (Graduate Student), Mr. Robert Geltner and Mr. John B. McCauley (Undergraduate Students) from the Chicago Circle campus.

BUSINESS PRESENTED BY THE PRESIDENT OF THE UNIVERSITY

The Committee took up consideration of the following reports and recommendations from the President of the University.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

President Henry presented a report on selected topics of current interest, copies of which were distributed at the meeting, and a copy was filed with the Secretary of the Board.

RATE INCREASES FOR UNIVERSITY-OPERATED HOUSING FACILITIES, URBANA

The following memoranda were presented by the President of the University in which administrative actions to increase rates for University-operated housing facilities at Urbana-Champaign and at the Medical Center were reported and the rationale for the actions explained.

The Board had earlier approved a request from the Undergraduate Student Association of Urbana to be heard on the subject of the increases approved for Urbana. Accordingly, Mr. Steve Gargo and Miss Dorothy O'Brien of the Undergraduate Student Association were granted the floor to make presentations. They gave particular emphasis to the effect of the increase on student finance and student opportunity, on conditions in residence halls generally, and on the possibilities of state financing of residence halls.

Administrative officers, including Chancellor J. W. Peltason and Mr. Arnold W. Strohkorb, Director of Housing, discussed the general inflationary pressures upon the University to meet operating costs of the halls, including improved services requested by students which involve additional costs. The point was made that the inadequacy of private housing in the community and the inability to obtain state funds for residence hall construction had led to the development of University housing in the last ten or fifteen years.

President Henry noted that a related increase, based on the same financial situation, had been approved for housing at the Medical Center campus.

Following extended discussion, Chairman Hughes indicated that the actions had been approved by the administration and that it was the Board's assumption that the administrative actions would go into effect.

Rate Increases for University Operated Housing Facilities at Urbana-Champaign

On recommendation of the Chancellor, the President has approved rental rate increases for University-operated housing facilities of Urbana-Champaign, effective September 1, 1970, as follows:

- 1. In undergraduate residence halls (capacity of 9,400 spaces) a \$60 increase for women and a \$100 increase for men for room and board for the academic year (the increase for women is lower than that for men because the women have chosen to have certain services eliminated).
- 2. In graduate residence halls (capacity of 1,000 spaces) a \$46 increase per academic year.
- 3. In married student apartments (1,000 units) a \$6 per month increase for furnished one- and two-bedroom units and \$5 per month for unfurnished two-bedroom units in the Orchard apartment complex and \$3 per month in the Green Street and Goodwin Avenue apartments.
- 4. In faculty housing an average increase of \$12 per month to be implemented in steps over a two-year period.

The new increases are dictated by rising cost factors similar to those experienced by the economy as a whole and include increases in salaries and wages, cost of food, supplies, utilities, and other services. Students have been consulted widely and wherever service reductions could be mutually agreed upon in order to minimize the rate increase, they have been scheduled for implementation. Furthermore, discussions are continuing with regard to the possibility of establishing several varied service plans at differing rates. The increase approved is the minimum required for the University to continue to meet bond obligations.

During the past ten years, the rates in undergraduate residence halls have increased by 17 per cent while the cost of living index has increased 28 per cent. With the new adjustment, rates will have increased 26 per cent since 1960. The cost of living index will in all probability continue to rise while the new rates remain stable for a period of two years.

The rates currently in effect and those newly approved compare favorably with those charged by other Big 10 universities. The most typical rate in the undergraduate residence halls on the Urbana-Champaign campus is currently next to the lowest within the Big 10 and the new rate would be just below the mid-point. It will undoubtedly compare more favorably in September since some institutions are planning to increase their rates for the 1970-71 academic year.

Increase in Residence Hall Contract Rates, Medical Center

The President, on recommendation of the Chancellor, has approved the following increases in residence hall contract rates to be effective for the 1970-71 academic year at the Medical Center campus:

- 1. Student Residence Hall double room (the most typical contract) a rate increase of \$110 from the present \$1,065 rate to \$1,175.
- Women's Residence Hall double room a rate increase of \$115 from the present \$1,090 rate to \$1,205.

PROGRESS REPORT ON OAKLEY RESERVOIR

Professor Walter M. Keith, Director of Robert Allerton Park, gave the following report on the Oakley Reservoir.

"On February 12, the Division of Waterways, Department of Public Works and Buildings, released publicly the proposal for the Modified Project of Oakley Reservoir and the Sangamon River.

"Just prior to that date and following this release, the University has been gathering information about this proposal in anticipation of a University response to the major differences between the Memorandum of Agreement, dated May 29, and the current proposal. There seems to be a change in joint-use pool elevation of 623' Mean Sea Level from 621' MSL and a 5,000 cfs release rate from an earlier 7,000 cfs.

"The Harza Engineering Company and Dr. Kendeigh, Chairman of the Natural Areas Committee, Graduate College, have been brought up to date with this proposal and the additional information we have secured. We are evaluating this information as we receive it, and we expect to have a copy of the State Report on February 23.

"We will evaluate this Report and will report our findings and recommendations to the University Administration."

ACTIONS OF THE STATE BOARD OF HIGHER EDUCATION ON THE UNIVERSITY'S FY 1971 BUDGET REQUESTS

(1) President Henry presented a detailed report in writing concerning actions of the Board of Higher Education on the University's FY 1971 budget requests including comments presented by the President to that Board on February 3. A copy of the report is filed with the Secretary for record and was printed in the Faculty Letter No. 192, February 16, 1970.

Capital Funds

Only three items were approved from general revenue funds: \$1,000,000 for equipment for the Dentistry Building, Phase I; \$197,374 to complete the amount needed for planning the Medical Sciences Building at the Urbana-Champaign campus; an unassigned residue of \$564,601. The addition to the Dentistry Building at the Medical Center campus and the addition to Burrill Hall at the Urbana-Champaign campus were approved for construction by the Illinois Building Authority.

BUDGET FOR 1970 SUMMER QUARTER AND FACULTY APPOINTMENTS, CHICAGO CIRCLE

(2) Submitted herewith are the budget and appointments to the faculty for the 1970 summer quarter at Chicago Circle from June 16 through September 15, 1970. The total budget is for salaries in the amount of \$1,140,000.

The salaries recommended are computed on the basis of one-third of the salary of the academic year for a full quarter of service, with proportionate amounts for shorter periods or for part-time service.

AMENDMENT OF REGULATIONS GOVERNING THE CERTIFICATE OF CERTIFIED PUBLIC ACCOUNTANT

(4) The University Committee on Accountancy has recommended changes in the University's regulations adopted by the Board of Trustees for administering the Illinois Accountancy Law. The Committee has also recommended that the regulations be codified to incorporate all amendments since the last printed publication of the regulations and to make certain editorial changes. If the changes are approved, the Committee plans to publish a new edition of the regulations and explanation for the guidance of candidates for examination.

I concur in the changes recommended as presented.

On motion of Mr. Clement, the committee recommended that the Board approve these changes at the annual meeting of the Board.

DEANSHIP OF STUDENT AFFAIRS, CHICAGO CIRCLE

(5) The Chancellor at the Chicago Circle campus has recommended the appointment of Oscar Miller, Acting Dean of Student Affairs since September 1, 1969, as Dean of Student Affairs, beginning March 1, 1970, on a twelve-month service basis, at an annual salary of \$23,000.

He will continue to hold the rank of Associate Professor of Economics on indefinite tenure.

The appointment will fill the vacancy which was created by the resignation of Dean Robert E. Corley. The recommendation is made after consultation with the staff of the Office of Student Affairs, the Deans' Council, the Administrative Council, and a special consultative committee.¹

The Executive Vice President and Provost endorses this recommendation. I recommend approval.

On motion of Mr. Swain, this appointment was approved.

RECOMMENDATIONS FOR SPECIAL CHANGES IN TUITION AND FEES

(7) The University Committee on Fees' submits the following recommendations:

- 1. That the fee of \$1.00 presently charged for postregistration changes in course programs be abolished. This proposal is endorsed by the Offices of Admissions and Records at all three campuses and by the Comptroller's Office. With the computerized system of registration, there are few program changes and the costs of collecting this fee are judged to exceed its benefits.
- 2. That a special fee of \$125 be charged for registration in Aviation 100 (Orienta-tion to Aviation). This fee would be assessed to meet the special costs arising from flight instruction (operation of airplanes and flight simulator).
- 3. That the schedule (see March 18, 1970, minutes) of tuition and fees for the Medical Center campus be approved, effective for the fall of 1970. The service fees are increased as follows: (a) \$48.00 per quarter for Medicine; (b) \$30.00 per quarter for Dentistry; (c) \$9.00 per quarter for all other students. The resident tuition rates are not changed; nonresident tuition is shown at the increased rate of \$100 per year already approved by the Board of Trustees.
- 4. That the tuition-and-fee charges for the Dental Assistant Program and the Dental Postgraduate Program be changed from their present special status to the following standard schedule:

CHANGE ORDER - COMPUTER LEASE/ACQUISITION

(17) The University Office of Administrative Data Processing has reviewed the increased requirements for computing equipment at the Chicago Circle campus. It has been concluded by appropriate staff personnel and approved by the administrative officers concerned that the leased 360/50 CPU system soon to be released by the Computer Science Laboratory in Urbana, with certain modifications, can be advantageously used at the Chicago Circle campus since it will be operationally compatible with other administrative data processing equipment on the Urbana-Champaign campus.

The Urbana-Champaign Department of Computer Science is in the final stages of changes in computer equipment (approved by the Board of Trustees May 21, 1969) which will cause the removal of the IBM System 360 Model 50 Central Processing Unit from University lease agreements with IBM dated February 13, 1964.

The International Business Machines Corporation has proposed a change order in our existing agreement for IBM machine service (lease agreement) which would permit the University to transfer the 360/50 CPU system being removed from the Urbana-Champaign campus to the Chicago Circle campus. Based upon an anticipated transfer date of April 1, 1970, the University could acquire title to the 360/50 CPU at a total cost of \$340,798.57 with payments spread over a five-year period, said payments to be subject to the availability of funds in accordance with the following schedule:

In addition, the University will pay \$27,060.00 for maintenance over the fiveyear period.

The net result of this change order will be to effect a total savings over the five-year period of \$258,436.43, provide for prompt conversion and installation at the Chicago Circle campus and at the end of said period title of the equipment will be vested in the University.

Funds are available in the regular operating budget generated from charges to those departments using the computer.

The President of the University, with the concurrence of appropriate administrative officers, recommends that the Board authorize the Comptroller and Secretary of the Board of Trustees to accept the proposal of the IBM Corporation as outlined above and to execute such contracts, change orders, or other appropriate documents as may be necessary to acquire title of the Central Processing Unit in accordance with the plan herein described.

On motion of Mr. Clement, the Committee recommended that the Board approve these changes at the annual meeting of the Board.

EQUIPMENT USAGE GRANT FOR THE COMPUTER-BASED EDUCATION RESEARCH LABORATORY, URBANA

(18) The University proposes to submit to Control Data Corporation a proposal requesting support for a program of research and development at the Computerbased Education Research Laboratory of the Urbana-Champaign campus. Under the terms of this proposal, Control Data will provide partial support (totaling \$1.3 million over a five-year period) for a 6400 computing system. The net leasing charge to the University for this system over this period is \$1,930,000. Applications are in process for funding this amount from other than state appropriations. This large computing system will be a key element in the development and operation of the PLATO IV system, the first phase of which will serve as many as 1,000 student consoles. This will make possible a major demonstration of the economic and educational feasibility of this promising new medium.

The Control Data 6000-series computer systems are uniquely suited to the PLATO system application; using the PLATO software design, these computers will make possible rapid responses to concurrent student inquiries from hundreds (or thousands) of student stations. A careful survey revealed that no other commercially available computer system can perform the rapid transfer rates necessary for this application.

Under the terms of the grant, the University of Illinois would (1) enter into a five-year lease of the Control Data 6400 system at the reduced rate, (2) develop the necessary software systems to operate the hardware configuration of the PLATO IV system, (3) make available to Control Data under appropriate licensing arrangements sufficient documentation to permit the installation and operation of the software systems, and (4) provide to Control Data information concerning associated hardware designs, developments, and innovations with reference to peripheral computer equipment, communications systems, and student consoles. Concurrent with the above grant, Control Data Corporation would enter into licensing agreements with the University or the University of Illinois Foundation covering the hardware and software for PLATO systems and providing for substantial royalty payments by Control Data. Under the proposed terms, royalty payments on the PLATO hardware patents would begin after thirty PLATO systems are sold. If, during the course of the lease, twenty PLATO systems are sold, title to the computer system will transfer to the University of Illinois with-out further lease payments. The proposed terms of these licensing agreements are outlined in the summary (see below); the execution of the lease contract would be contingent on the successful completion of appropriate licensing agreements and upon receipt of funds which may be specially and properly applied to lease rentals.

With the concurrence of the appropriate administrative officers, I recommend that the Vice President and Comptroller and the Secretary be authorized to execute such agreements as are necessary to enter into the grant and lease arrangements, subject to such further action by the State Board of Higher Education as might be required.

On motion of Mr. Swain, this recommendation was approved by the following vote: Aye, Mr. Clement, Mr. Hughes, Mr. Swain; no, none; absent. none.

Summary of Proposed License Agreements

Although some changes may be anticipated in the course of finalizing the agreements, the substantive terms are as follows :

A. The Hardware License Agreement

- 1. CDC shall be granted a nonexclusive license to manufacture and sell hardware invented or developed in the PLATO program;
- 2. Royalty payments on licensed apparatus involving the PLATO system and associated equipment shall be based on the number of student consoles (together with associated peripheral hardware) sold; the royalty rate shall be 2 per cent of the total selling price of the consoles;
 No royalty payments shall be paid on the first 30 PLATO systems; a PLATO system typically would have 250 or more consoles;
- 4. The University shall make available technical information necessary for the practice, manufacture, and use of the inventions;

- 5. The specified royalty rate shall be in effect for five years, and shall be renegotiated after five years and the licenses shall be in effect for the life of the patents.
- B. The Software License Agreement
 - 1. CDC shall be granted a nonexclusive license to use, duplicate, and sublicense the software developed in the PLATO program;
 - 2. CDC shall pay as royalties for the granted license 40 per cent of the payments received (item B-3) by CDC for use of the software at each PLATO installation;
 - 3. The software charges for each PLATO system shall entail monthly payments of \$1,000 to \$4,000, the rate within this range depending on the number of student consoles on a given system;
 - 4. Mechanisms shall be provided for training CDC personnel in the use of the software system.

AGREEMENT FOR DATA SYSTEMS ENGINEERING SERVICES FOR THE DEPARTMENT OF COMPUTER SCIENCE, URBANA

(19) Until recently the International Business Machines Corporation leased equipment which included free systems software (program) services. However, the lease cost and systems engineering services have been separated as a result of federal antitrust actions.

Since the University leases and/or owns IBM computer systems, it is necessary to acquire certain technical assistance from the IBM Corporation under a systems engineering service agreement in order to efficiently develop or complete the development of new software programs and adapt them to operations in the IBM 360 system.

The Department of Computer Science requires technical assistance to adapt existing programs to IBM equipment which can most economically be obtained from the IBM Corporation.

The proposed ARAMIS (Automatic Remote Access Multi-programmed Illinet System) system provides for an automatic scheduling system for students, researchers, and staff. The basic system has been designed by the staff of the Computer Science Department; however, technical engineering services are required from the manufacturer of the computer equipment (IBM) to effectively and efficiently orient the ARAMIS program for use with the 360 computer system.

It is estimated that approximately 270 hours of skilled programmer assistance is required during a period of one year to advise and assist the DCL personnel in developing the special computer programs using the IBM 360 hardware and operating systems already in use. The hourly rate for this service is \$35.00, for a total estimated expenditure of \$9,450, subject to the need and the availability of funds.

The President of the University, with the concurrence of appropriate administrative officers, recommends that the Board authorize the Comptroller and the Secretary of the Board of Trustees to execute such contracts or other appropriate documents, as may be necessary to engage the IBM technical services required.

On motion of Mr. Swain, authority was given as recommended by the following vote: Aye, Mr. Clement, Mr. Hughes, Mr. Swain; no, none; absent, none.

AGREEMENT FOR DATA SYSTEMS ENGINEERING SERVICES FOR THE UNDERGRADUATE LIBRARY CIRCULATION SYSTEM, URBANA

(20) Until recently the International Business Machines Corporation leased equipment which included free systems software (program) services. However, the equipment lease and systems engineering services costs have been separated.

Since the University leases and/or owns IBM computer equipment, it is necessary to acquire certain technical assistance from the IBM Corporation under a systems engineering service agreement in order to efficiently develop and/or implement new software (programs).

The Urbana-Champaign Library is planning new and improved techniques to solve operational problems associated with the Undergraduate Library Circulation System.

Neither the Library nor the University has the available expertise to carry out the feasibility, planning, and implementation of software (programs) to be used in the Office of Administrative Data Processing.

The IBM Corporation has assisted other University and public library agencies in developing and implementing circulation systems. This expertise can be utilized through an IBM technical engineering service contract to develop an improved Undergraduate Library Circulation System.

RENEWAL OF CONTRACT WITH OZARK AIR LINES

(21) The Director of the Institute of Aviation and the Vice President and Comptroller recommend renewal of the lease with Ozark Air Lines, Inc. for the use of the University of Illinois-Willard Airport for five years, effective July 1, 1969, on the following terms:

Airport Use Fee (called Landing Fee in preceding contract) -- 2 per cent of the gross on-line revenues generated in Champaign-Urbana, Illinois, with a stipu-lated minimum payment of \$1,200 per month (minimum of \$14,400 per year).
 Supplies, equipment, tools, or the use thereof -- University's current retail price.

3. Space and equipment rental:

- a. Office space \$4 per square foot per year. A total of 1755 square feet is assigned to Ozark, making the annual rental \$7,020.
- b. Storage space 100 square feet at \$1 per square foot per year or \$100 per vear.
- c. Radio Transmitter Room 32 square feet at \$60 per year.
- d. Use of loudspeaker \$10 per month or \$120 per year.
 e. Out-Station maintenance space in the Terminal Building basement 150 square feet at \$3 per square foot per year or \$450 per year.

SEPARATE FUND TO PROVIDE FINANCIAL AID, URBANA

(28) The severity of recent cutbacks in funding for financial aid threatens the opportunities for higher education of large numbers of needy students. Cognizant of the effects that such a condition will have upon their schoolmates, students at the Urbana-Champaign campus developed a plan to help alleviate the stress of financial shortages.

By a 14,879 to 5,025 vote, the students agreed to assess themselves two dollars (\$2.00) per student each semester for the purpose of providing financial aid funds for needy classmates. The referendum provided for the refunding of the two-dollar assessment to those students who desired it. An implication of the vote is the principle of having the assessment matched by the General Assembly.

From the collected funds, the Financial Aid Office at Urbana will make grants to students who qualify for assistance under University rules and regulations for determining need.

In the light of the vote of the students and consistent with the spirit of that vote, and on recommendation of the Chancellor, I request approval in principle of the creation of a separate fund for the purposes stated, formal action thereon to be deferred until the March, 1970, meeting of the Trustees; and approval of the immediate submission of a request to the State Board of Higher Education for a supplemental budget increase in line with the proposal.

On motion of Mr. Swain, approval was given as requested.

MEMORIAL TO MRS. HELEN M. GRIGSBY

Mr. Swain presented the following:

The Board of Trustees of the University of Illinois records with profound sorrow the death on February 9, 1970, of Mrs. Helen M. Grigsby, a former member of this Board.

Active in many statewide organizations, Mrs. Grigsby served as department president of the Women's Relief Corps in 1932, as state vice regent of the Daughters of the American Revolution, and as a member of the Illinois Society of Mayflower Descendants, the Colonial Dames of America, and the Eastern Star.

Like her ancestors who migrated to the area in 1820 and helped found Pittsfield, she was also active in politics, serving as a delegate to the Republican National Convention in 1928 and 1932.

Although she did not attend the University of Illinois, she was devoted to the task of being a trustee and was very active in the work of Board committees. Her terms as Trustee, from 1921 to 1933 and from 1941 to 1947, covered a period when travel was not easy, but she seldom missed a meeting of the Board. As an ex officio member of the University of Illinois Citizens Committee, Mrs. Grigsby continued her interest in the affairs of the University after her terms as Trustee were ended.

This memorial is presented for the public record as a tribute to a former colleague and a devoted citizen, and an expression of sympathy to her family.
